

The Raincoat

When the doctor suggested surgery and a brace throughout my youngest years, my parents scrambled to take me to massage therapy, deep tissue work, osteopathy, and soon my crooked spine unspooled a bit. I could breathe again and move more in a body unclouded by pain. My mom would tell me to sing songs to her the whole forty-five minute drive to Middle Two Rock Road and forty-five minutes back from physical therapy. She'd say even my voice sounded unfettered by my spine afterward. So I sang and sang because I thought she liked it. I never asked her what she gave up to drive me or how her day was before this chore. Today, now at her age, I was driving myself home from yet another spine appointment, singing along to some maudlin but solid song on the radio. I saw a mom take her raincoat off and give it to her young daughter when a storm took over the afternoon. My God, I realized I'd been under her raincoat my whole life, thinking it was somehow a marvel that I never got wet.

This Sunday is Good Shepherd Sunday, now traditionally celebrated on the Fourth Sunday of Easter.



Similar to Divine Mercy Sunday, it is on a fixed Sunday during the Eastertide. This particular Sunday coincides with the following passage from the Gospel according to St. John: "I am the good shepherd. A good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep." (John 10:11). The exact Gospel rotates each year, but always revolves around Jesus calling himself the "Good Shepherd."

It is a day to focus on Jesus' role as shepherd of souls and our role of following his voice wherever he goes. Jesus is the Good Shepherd for all people. Belonging to Jesus depends not on ethnicity or religious background or any accident of birth but on recognizing and responding to his call, "My sheep hear my voice." (John 10:27). The Joyful Ordination Season Arrives at the Cathedral

uring Lent, I wrote about Archdiocesan liturgies at the Cathedral, such as the Rite of Election, where those who will receive the Sacraments of Initiation — Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation — and enter their final



stage before the Great Vigil of Easter. And the Chrism Mass during Holy Week when the Cardinal blesses the sacred oils used in our Sacraments. Ordination is another liturgy celebrated in the Cathedral that the entire Archdiocese celebrates with joy as these men are ordained to serve the people of God throughout the Archdiocese.

This year, the Archdiocese of Chicago will ordain twenty permanent deacons, five transitional deacons (who will be ordained priests next May) on May 14, and two priests on May 21. In Holy Orders, one of the seven Sacraments of the Church, there are three levels: Diaconate, Priesthood, and Episcopal.

There are many moving parts in an ordination liturgy. First, those to be ordained are called by name and affirmed of their calling by the congregation. After the homily, they make their promises in front of Cardinal Cupich and individually pledge their respect and obedience to the Cardinal. Next, those to be ordained lay prostrate on the ground while the Litany of Saints is sung, invoking the saints to be their help and guide as they minister to God's people. This part is my favorite moment in the Ordination liturgy.

The essential part of any Ordination liturgy is the laying on of hands and the Prayer of Ordination. The laying

on of hands finds its origin in the Acts of the Apostles, "The Apostles laid hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit" (Acts 8:17).

After the Cardinal concludes the Prayer of Ordination, the newly ordained deacons and priests are vested in their proper vestments. Next, deacons are handed the object of their ministry: the Book of the Gospels. For priests, their hands are anointed with Sacred Chrism, and they receive the vessels of their ministry: the chalice and paten with bread and wine. This section, called the Rite of Ordination, concludes with the sign of peace from the Cardinal

and the Liturgy of the Eucharist proceeds as usual.

As we move closer to the Ordination of Deacons and Priests, let us pray for the men who will lay down their lives in service to God's people and that the Lord of the harvest may call more laborers for his harvest.




engages us to rejoice in God's infinite love, proclaim His glory, and give thanks for His abundant generosity.




