# Reflections from Our Rector



Dear People of God,

This may come as a surprise to some of you but there are more Catholic Churches in Las Vegas than you think: 30 in total. Not surprisingly, some worshippers at Sunday Services will give casino chips rather than cash when the basket

is passed. Since they get chips from so many different casinos, the churches have devised a method to collect the offerings. The churches send all their collected chips to a nearby Franciscan monastery for sorting and then the chips are taken to the casinos of origin and cashed in. This is done by a chip monk!

On a more serious note, by our Baptism we are called to love and serve one another. This takes many forms because God has given each of us different gifts to be shared and not kept hidden. Max Lucado puts a unique spin on “working for the Lord.”

It’s a wonderful day indeed when we stop working for God and begin working with God.....For years, I viewed God as a compassionate CEO and my role as a loyal sales representative. He had his office, and I had my territory. I could contact him as much as I wanted. He was always a phone or fax away. He encouraged me, rallied behind me and supported me, but he didn’t go with me. At least I didn’t think he did. Then I read 2 Corinthians 6:1: We are “God’s fellow workers.”

Fellow workers? Co-laborers? God and I worked together? Imagine the paradigm shift this truth creates. Rather than report to God, we work with God. Rather than check in with him and then leave, we check in with him and then follow. We are always in the presence of God....There is never a non-sacred moment!

As “God’s fellow workers,” we never walk alone and the sharing of our Time, Talent and Treasure is seen through a different lens, through the eyes of faith.

Stewardship also involves an “attitude of gratitude” and the ability to believe all is a gift. With this in mind, I share some “Life Pointers” that were given to me and now I pass on to you...

- Give people more than they expect and do it cheerfully.
- When you say, “I love you,” mean it.
- When you say, “I’m sorry,” look the person in the eye.
- Never laugh at anyone’s dream. People who don’t have dreams don’t have much.
- Love deeply and passionately. You might get hurt but it’s the only way to live life completely.
- In disagreements, fight fairly. No name calling.
- Don’t judge people by their relatives.
- Talk slowly but think quickly.
- Remember that great love and great achievements involve great risk.
- When you lose, don’t lose the lesson.
- Remember the three R’s: Respect for self; Respect for others; Responsibility for all your actions.
- Don’t let the little dispute injure a great friendship.
- When you realize you’ve made a mistake, take immediate steps to correct it.
- Smile when answering your phone call. The caller will hear it in your voice.
- Spend some time alone in prayer.

And always give thanks to God for all our gifts. We are stewards and not owners of God’s creation.....so share the gifts.

## On the Cover

### "The Parable of the Shrewd Manager" by Marinus Claeszoon van Reymerswaele (1490-1546), National Museum in Warsaw

Today's Gospel develops the message introduced in the reading from Amos. The covenant explicitly prohibited the mistreatment of the poor, widows, and orphans. Amos's sarcastic mockery of the wealthy portrays them as gleefully anticipating the next opportunity to use their status to increase the suffering of the poor by denying them basic necessities like food and shelter.



The Gospel develops the message regarding wealth and spirituality. One cannot be devoted both to wealth and to God in the same manner. To serve God, one must recognize the significant demands he makes for us regarding how we treat one another. Consider your own relationship with money. Does it drive any parts of your life? How can you practice healthier stewardship of your monetary resources?

### Congrats to Our Golden Wedding Anniversary Couples!

In addition to Ordinations, Chrism Mass and Rite of Election, Holy Name Cathedral hosts other special liturgies throughout the year, gathering her faithful to celebrate and honor various aspects of our faith journey. This weekend, the Cathedral will host the annual Golden Wedding Anniversary Mass for couples married in 1972.



Holy Matrimony is one of the seven Sacraments of the Church. It is often paired with Holy Orders under the term “Sacrament of Service/Vocation.” And of the seven Sacraments, Marriage is the only one where an ordained clergyman is not the ordinary minister of the Sacrament. In the other six Sacraments, Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation, Confession, Anointing of the Sick and Holy Orders, a deacon, priest, or bishop is the ordinary minister. But in Marriage, the bride and groom are the ordinary ministers (*Catechism of the Catholic Church* 1623). The deacon, priest, or bishop celebrating the wedding is merely a witness for legal purposes (both secular and religious).

According to the Catechism, the end of Marriage, meaning the purpose of Marriage, is unity, openness to children, and indissolubility (CCC 1664). You could add

another purpose to Marriage, the end of any vocation: holiness. As husband and wife, they are ministers of the Sacrament who give themselves totally and completely to the other through their married life. They are meant to help the other get to heaven while striving for heaven themselves.

It makes sense then that in Marriage, the husband and wife are the ministers because they are the ones who promise to be faithful to each other, in good times and in bad, in sickness and in health, to love and honor each other all the days of their life. It is not the priest making these promises. They are the ones who promise to give of themselves, totally and completely, to their spouse and potential future children and the world, through their married life together.

Marriage is a visible expression of Christ’s love for the Church, as he hung upon the cross and shed his blood for her salvation. Married love is meant to be life-giving in whatever form possible. And no marriage is without bumps in the road, but by looking to Jesus, by emulating Jesus in married life, all can be conquered with love.

We join in celebrating the couples of the Archdiocese who celebrate 50 years of Marriage this weekend as they gather for Mass, thanking God here at the Cathedral. We pray for those who have lost a spouse before this milestone, aware that their lifelong partnership goes beyond the grave.

Born in Binondo, Manila in 1594, San Lorenzo served as an altar boy in his childhood and was trained as a calligrapher. Later in life, after being falsely accused of killing a Spaniard, he was helped by three Dominican priests and a layman to flee to Japan and to work as a missionary. However, when they arrived in Japan, the Tokugawa Shogunate was persecuting Christians. They were executed in Nagasaki for steadfastly refusing to renounce their faith after enduring a cruel form of torture by hanging upside down over a pit.

# Come Help “Jesus’ Garden” at Catholic Charities Suppers

**W**hat does it mean to serve suppers that the Cathedral sponsors every Thursday and Friday at Catholic Charities? You might wonder whether you are cooking for all 120 people. You might wish you were a chef with the talent to cook for that many people.



It takes many types of volunteers to serve this ministry. There is a general volunteer coordinator who helps me oversee this ministry, along with the help of many other volunteers from Holy Name Cathedral.

We are grateful for the service of Cindy Loftus, who has been the devoted and generous general coordinator for many years. We thank her for her tremendous work in helping to build God’s kingdom on earth. And we now welcome a new general coordinator, Ursula Aguirre. Each supper coordinator has many volunteers who help to serve each meal. It is quite a beautiful system.

Volunteers report and receive instructions from the supper coordinator when they arrive on Thursdays and Fridays at Catholic Charities at 3pm (721 N. La Salle St.). There, they will pray together before setting up dinner, serving the guests and cleaning up at the end. We also have volunteers who occasionally play cheerful guitar or piano music while the guests enjoy dinner. For more information or to volunteer with our Supper program, scan the QR code below.

All these types of service remind me of one of my favorite saints, St. Therese of Lisieux, who had an analogy for the roles that everyone plays within the



Church. St. Therese wanted to do enormous things for Christ, such as being a martyr or preaching God’s word in the mission field. Then she had a vision from the Lord in which

she saw how a field is constituted of many kinds of flowers, all different in size, color, and scent. She “understood that if all flowers wanted to be roses, nature would lose her springtime beauty, and the fields would no longer be decked out with little wildflowers.”

Friends, in the words of St. Therese in her autobiography “Story of a Soul,” we might be God’s roses or his little wildflowers “and just as in nature, all the seasons are arranged in such a way as to make the humblest daisy bloom on a set day, in the same way, everything works out for the good of each soul.” It is a charming analogy.

We are all invited to share God’s love for others differently. Some people come to serve dinner at Catholic Charities; some sponsor a meal or the entire supper for a day in memory of someone or a special occasion. Some just come and chat with the guests like old friends. What is God inviting you to do this week? JMJ

## Blessings in a Backpack Begins Another Year: We Need Your Help

Many children returning to school will benefit from the National School Lunch Program on weekdays. But when the weekend comes around, these same children are faced with food insecurity, not knowing where their next meal will come from until the following Monday. Our Blessings in a Backpack program is one way to mitigate this problem by providing food for the weekend.

We plan to continue to serve St Thomas of Canterbury School for the upcoming school year. In addition, we are exploring expansion to another school. To meet this growing demand, we need help from our volunteer community. Some of the needs include:

### Program Management Coordinators

This group will provide an overall leadership role in general program oversight. Will develop a knowledge of the general operations of the program and assist with coordination and overall planning.

### Delivery Drivers

We need team of volunteers to deliver the packs to the

school. St Thomas of Canterbury will be the delivery location, easily accessed from Lake Shore Dr. We can deliver either Thursday or Friday during school hours.

### Packing Weekly Bags

This involves packing the food sacks with the items that have been selected for the week. Our food items are typically delivered to the Cathedral mid-week, so we typically pack 200 bags on Thursday mornings in the Rectory. It usually takes about 90 minutes.

### Fundraising

We will be developing a new strategy this year to raise funds for our program. We welcome volunteers to brainstorm ideas and build plans for fundraising.

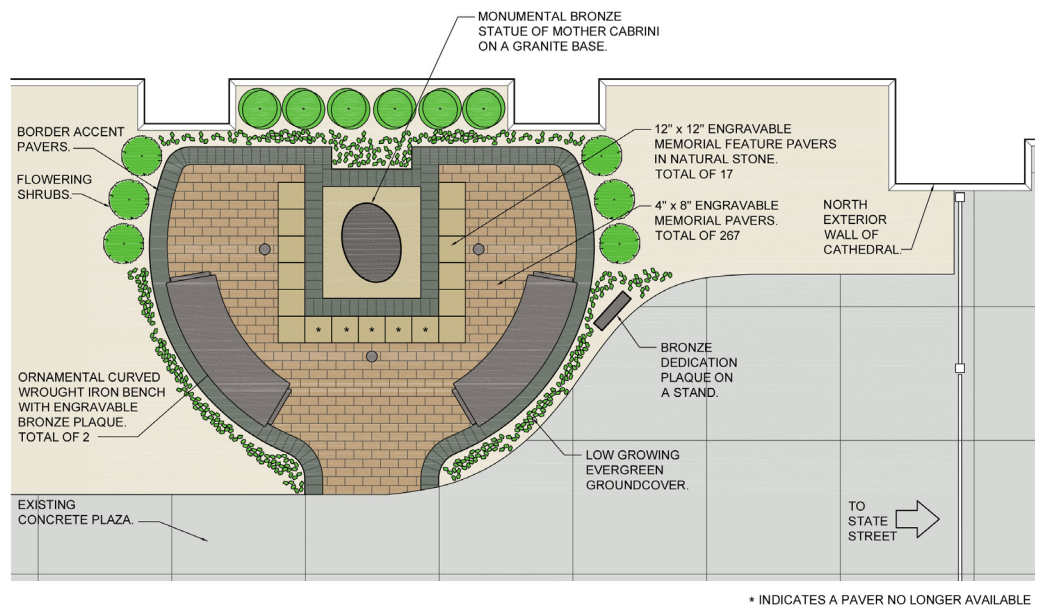
## Seminary Education Second Collection
