

Dear People of God.

We were all taught from our earliest childhood the importance of loving others. The key to loving is not only found in words, but experiencing love from parents, family and friends. Our faith is centered in a God who loves each one of us —

unconditionally. God is love and always loving — and we must be able to love ourselves. Jesus makes visible the invisible God and lived a life rooted in God by loving and forgiving all people.

Children have an understanding of love which connects with their age. As children grow and mature, their experience of love grows and matures. 

Count Our Blessings? For Catholics, It Might Take A While

n our tradition as Catholics, we bless a lot of things. We bless crosses and rosaries, scapulars and medals. We bless homes, cars and pets. We bless ashes for Ash Wednesday, throats for St. Blaise's feast day and the Advent wreath when we begin our journey to Christmas. We bless churches,



tabernacles, oils and altars. We bless pictures and statues. We bless people. We bless many different things.

And you might ask yourself why? We bless people, places and objects not to cast out evil spirits, though that can be assumed in the blessing. We bless people, places and objects because we want the Spirit of God to draw us closer to God through that person, that place or that object. We hope our hearts long to encounter God when we look upon the crucifix, pray our rosary or look at a saint statue. We pray that the object, place or person inspires us to impel us forward on our journey of holiness.

Next Saturday, Oct. 15, we will bless a reliquary containing a bone fragment of Mother Frances Xavier Cabrini, the first American canonized a saint and

patron of immigrants, followed by a dedication of a life-size statue of her in our courtyard. By blessing these objects, we ask the Spirit of God to allow us to "follow in the footsteps of the Lord, keeping before us the example of St. Frances Xavier Cabrini, and grow to a maturity measured not by nature, but by the fullness of Christ" (Prayer of Blessing of Images of the Saints). We see Mother Cabrini as a sign of hope, a witness of welcome and an expression of love.

Everything we bless gives glory to God, from whom all good things come. God is good, and everything God makes is good. By blessing people, places, and objects, which God has created, we dedicate them for God's glory and God's benefit. We are all blessed in our baptism. Are we being led to God, and are we leading other people to God in our lives of discipleship?

All are welcome to join us as we honor and celebrate the life and legacy of St. Frances Xavier Cabrini on Saturday, Oct. 15, with Mass at 12noon, followed by the blessing and dedication of the life-size statue commissioned specifically for the Cathedral courtyard, and reception following. It is an excellent opportunity to be inspired by Cabrini's witness and zeal and praise God for her gifts and contributions to Catholicism in the United States.



prayers, and healings (both physical and spiritual), that the Lord `showers upon us, day and night?


The truth is that our very lives and every breath we take are His gift to us. But we can get so caught up in the stresses and distractions of daily life that we lose touch with this truth.
