

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The sudden and unexpected influx of men, women and children seeking asylum to U.S cities, including Chicago, over recent weeks has presented our community with significant challenges but also significant opportunities to share God's message of compassion and joy. The plight of these asylum seekers, most of whom are fleeing violence, political oppression and crushing poverty in their home countries causes us grave concern, but I am convinced that this is a moment for us to join together in a mission of love and mercy.

Over 3,000 asylum seekers arrived in our city as of mid-October. Almost all the migrants we have welcomed report that they plan to stay in the Chicago area and will need support to reestablish their lives. Unlike other migrants, most do not have relatives in the States with whom they can live and learn as they build new lives.

The Catholic community has shown an outpouring of compassion as churches, religious congregations, and other ministries have opened their doors, and Catholic Charities has deployed a team to connect people with loved ones and conduct initial needs assessments. Across the Church, many parishes have responded, and more help is needed. We have mobilized to create a coordinated Catholic response to assist asylum seekers so we might maximize the impact of our assistance as we bear witness to our faith. A Working Group has gathered to evaluate opportunities to serve. We are considering several options including transitional shelter, parish sponsorships, and pastoral care for asylum seekers.

In support of these efforts, parishes throughout the Archdiocese will hold a second collection for asylum seekers at all Masses celebrated the weekend of November 5-6. The commitment of faithful Catholics like you will help ensure the success of this mission. Please consider giving to this collection or giving directly to Catholic Charities which will serve as a central gathering point for donations. 

## Remember Our Death by Praying for Those Who Have Died

I his Wednesday, Nov. 2, is All Souls Day, also called the Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed, In Mexico, the day is known as Dia de Los Muertos or Day of the Dead. From the beginning of Christianity, we have prayed for the dead. One can see this in the Roman catacombs, as the faithful



went to the tombs of the early Christians martyred for the faith.

The Catholic Church has prayed for the dead in various ways throughout the centuries. Within each celebration of the Mass, there are two prominent examples. The first example is that the last petition in the universal prayer generally is for the faithful departed. The second example is whatever Eucharistic Prayer the presider chooses (there are 10 options; in some seasons, the presider is limited in his selection), there is always a reference to the dead. Two examples are: "Remember also our brothers and sisters who have fallen asleep in the hope of the resurrection, and all who have died in your mercy" (Eucharistic Prayer II). And "To our departed brothers and sisters and to all who were pleasing to you at their passing from this life, give kind admittance to your kingdom" (Eucharistic Prayer III).

And you may ask yourself, why? Why do we pray for

the dead? Why do we continue to remember those who have died, especially since the grief of their passing is so deep and heavy? Our Christian belief is that those baptized have died in Christ and that the body's physical death is when we await the promise of the resurrection. Those who have died in the flesh, "for God's faithful people, life is changed, not ended" (Preface for the Dead, I).

Death is a part of the human condition. In a sense, we are born to die. But as we live and move and are aware of this reality, we are called to live according to God's will, giving Him glory and honor by doing what he created us to do: love. Grief is painful because our love for those who have died has nowhere to go. As people of faith, we remember our death by praying for those who have died, that one day we will all be united in the new and eternal Jerusalem.

Join us this Wednesday at any of our liturgies at 7am, 8am, 12pm and 5:15pm as we come together to pray for our beloved dead. At the 5:15pm Mass, our talented choir will sing the Requiem Mass composed in 1947 by Maurice Duruflé while we remember in a particular way those whose passing we have had in the Cathedral in the past year. Due to the Requiem music and the remembrance of the deceased at the 5:15pm special Mass, the Mass will be longer than a typical Wednesday evening Mass. Let us come to thank God for our loved ones and pray they are enjoying the face of God for eternity.

### Feast of All Souls

### Masses on Wednesday, Nov. 2

On Nov. 2, we will gather to remember those who have passed away over the past year. We invite you to join us for this annual Mass to pray for the repose of all these souls. We will have four Masses on All Souls Day (7am, 8am, 12noon, and 5:15pm). Fr. Greg Sakowicz



will be the celebrant at the 5:15pm Mass.

If you plan to be with us at the 5:15pm Mass, please feel free to bring a framed picture of your loved one to place on the steps of the altar during the Mass (this Mass only). Our ushers will be available to assist you in placing the picture of your

loved one. This is a beautiful tradition that adds to the presence of your loved one in our Mass.

### **Annual White Coat Mass**

### Sunday, Nov. 13, 2022 at 12:30pm Mass

Join us as at Holy Name Cathedral as we celebrate and honor all medical personnel at our annual White Coat Mass. At the conclusion of this mass, all hands of those in the medical profession will be blessed as they continue to bring hope and healing to the sick in our world. All are welcome to attend.

Our presider and homilist will be Fr. Andy Matijevic, Director of Worship at Holy Name Cathedral. Following this Mass, there will be a brief reception in the Parish



Center Cafeteria and the relaunch of the Cathedral's Ministry of Care Program after an extended COVID-19 hiatus.

## Join Our Ministry of Care: Introductory Session on Nov. 13

"I was sick, and you visited Me." Matthew 25:36

After our extended two-year+ hiatus, we now have the green light to resume the Ministry of Care at local healthcare facilities. This includes Northwestern Hospital (Galter, Feinberg and Prentice), Shirley Ryan AbilityLab, and Warren Barr Rehabilitation Center. There are two additional locations that we hope to add later in 2023. All these facilities are a short walking distance from the Cathedral. We also have several opportunities to visit the homebound who are unable to come to church.









### What is the Ministry of Care?

Ministry of Care to the sick is a pastoral ministry of caring for those who are hospitalized, in nursing homes, hospice, or confined to private homes. Volunteer ministers are trained to conduct pastoral visits with time to listen and pray about



the concerns of the sick or shut-in person and to share the Eucharist with them.

### **Becoming a Minister of Care**

Each minister must complete a minimum of ten hours of training. Holy Name Cathedral is blessed to have a cadre of priests and deacons who collaborate with Lori Doyle, Director of Service Ministries, to design and deliver the training. Deacon Dan Welter is joining the team and will be supporting the ministry going forward. Please plan to attend our Introductory Session on Sunday, Nov. 13, following the White

Coat Mass and Reception. We will gather in the Parish Center (FXW) Auditorium. All new and returning ministers are encouraged to attend. We will start at 2pm and finish no later than 3:30pm. Follow up training for new ministers will be Sat., Nov. 19 and Sat., Dec. 10. All ministers will be required to complete new safety and health protocols.



## Reflections from Our Rector



Dear People of God.

The World Series has started: unfortunately, the White Sox and Cubs are both watching from home. I have always enjoyed baseball since childhood (White Sox fan!) though football has always been my favorite sport to play!

Fr. Med Laz (Treats for the Soul) recently shared this powerful story which opened my eyes. Please read ... and pass it on ...

### **Knowing Who You Are!**

On April 26, 1992, a baby was born to parents who did not want him for whatever reason. Fortunately for that child and the world, they chose to give him up for adoption.

One day after he was born, he was adopted by Patty and Wayne Judge, who went on to love him and raise him the same as if he was born to them. Thirty years later, that baby is 6-foot-7 and weighs 282 pounds. On Oct. 4. Aaron Judge hit his 62nd home run of the 2022 MLB season for the New York Yankees, setting the single-season record for the American League.

While Patty and Wayne Judge, two retired physical education teachers from California, did not give him his 6-foot-seven stature, they did teach Aaron how to be a devoted Christian, hardworking, and respectful.

Here are Aaron Judge's priorities in order of importance: "Christian Faith, Family, then Baseball." He goes on to say, "If what you did yesterday still seems big today, then you haven't done anything today."

Aaron Judge had a closed adoption. He does not and never has had any contact with his biological parents. Aaron claims that he has never wanted to either. He says, "I have one set of parents, the ones who raised me. That's how it is. ... When I was 10 or 11, I started asking questions, and they told me I was adopted. They answered all my questions, and that was that. It really didn't bother me because they were the only parents I've ever known."

Aaron Judge has put it perfectly, "Some kids grow up in their Mom's stomach. I grew up in my Mom's heart. She's always shown me love and compassion since I was a little baby. For this reason, I've never needed to think differently or wonder about anything."

Judge goes on to say, "I know I wouldn't be a New York Yankee if it wasn't for my Mom. The guidance she gave me as a kid growing up, knowing the difference between right and wrong, how to treat people, and how to go the extra mile and put in extra work. All that kind of stuff. She's molded me into the person I am today."

How does hearing this aspect of Aaron Judge's life and hearing what he has to say about his Mom impact YOUR thoughts and feelings about YOUR own life?

Great food for thought as a 2022 World Series winner will be crowned this week!




