Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

In so many ways—large and small—the pandemic has upended our lives together. Families and, in a special way, young people, have faced distressing struggles. The pandemic made our connections with one another challenging and difficult. Exactly in that moment when we truly needed supportive relationships with one another, we found ourselves separated. Sadly, this included the relationships and connections that we have in and through the Church.


We did our best to move forward and I am proud of our collective response to the challenges of the pandemic. When I announced a general dispensation from the obligation to participate in Sunday Mass, many parishes offered on-line Sunday Masses, and went even further and established prayer lines and reached out to those in need. The TV Mass that I celebrated helped to keep us connected as a community of faith in Chicagoland. So many of you have told me how healing and comforting those Masses have been.

In the meanwhile, we are in a new moment. With vaccinations and boosters, restrictions on public gatherings have eased up. Many people feel more comfortable returning to Church. Yet, we know there are some elderly and immuno-compromised persons who are still not ready to return. And they should not return. These vulnerable brothers and sisters have an excusing cause for being absent and for this reason I will continue the TV Mass on ABC for the present time. But for the rest of us, I have decided, in consultation with my advisors, to lift the general dispensation from the obligation of attending Sunday Mass as we begin a new Church year on the First Sunday of Advent, November 26-27.

My hope is that the First Sunday of Advent will provide us with a fresh start to take up again our life together as a community of faith that gathers to worship God. I have asked our pastors to begin the Masses on November 26-27 with the traditional lighting of the Advent wreath. After the homily your pastor will lead the community in a renewal of baptismal promises, acknowledging that we owe our obligation to participate in Sunday Mass to God but also to each other. Our common profession of faith and of our desire to turn away from sin, will be concluded by a sprinkling rite with the waters of baptism.

Let this occasion of our renewal of faith and life, which we all so much want, provide us with a fresh start as we recommit ourselves to worship God and to be supportive of each other week after week as we gather around the Table of the Lord to be nourished and renewed.

The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. On this day, we celebrate the universal kingship of Jesus



Christ. The truth about Jesus is the basis on which we can build to transform the world, so it more closely mirrors God's Kingdom of love and justice here and now.

Luke's story depicts the king who dies for those he rules. In this crucifixion account, Jesus remains true to his own character and teaching to the end. This evangelist repeatedly portrays Jesus as the merciful Savior, instructing followers that true leadership consists in compassionate service.

After much talk about the end times, Jesus faces the end time of his human life as he hangs on the cross to die. But in this moment, Jesus looks anything but royal. He is vulnerable, hurting, and distressed. What might Jesus' final moments have to teach us about the call of leaders today?

# Honor Thy Mother Church on its 147th Anniversary

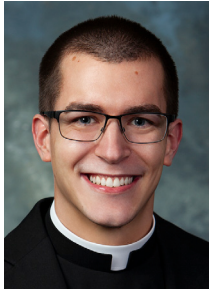
**T**he Church celebrates many feasts throughout the year. Feasts of Jesus, the Blessed Mother, saints and churches.

One day each year, each parish celebrates the dedication day of its physical building as a church. This day is known as the anniversary of the Dedication of the Church. This date offers the opportunity to give glory to God for the use of the church. Every parish should celebrate that day with great joy because it is here, within these anointed walls, that we are taken to heaven.

Holy Name Cathedral was dedicated on Nov. 21, 1875, by Bishop Thomas Foley, the Coadjutor Bishop of Chicago. A unique aspect of Holy Name's dedication anniversary is that our building's dedication was to be the Cathedral of the Diocese of Chicago. The Cathedral of a diocese holds a special place for several reasons.

The term 'Cathedral' comes from the word *cathedra*, which means chair. The Cathedral is the church with the chair of the diocese's bishop. Every Cathedral you go to worldwide has a chair for the bishop, and only the bishop can sit in that chair. The cathedra is a symbol of authority.

The original cathedra at Holy Name Cathedral was replaced in 1968 with the renovations following Vatican II. The chair has been used by Cardinals John Cody, Joseph Bernardin, Francis George, and currently by



Cardinal Blase Cupich. St. Pope John Paul II sat in our cathedra during his visit to Chicago in 1979.

The chair is made of wood, with three panels on the back, depicting the first Christian teachers, Jesus of Nazareth, St. Peter and St. Paul.

The Cathedral is the diocese's mother church because it is the seat of the diocese and because the significant diocesan celebrations occur at the Cathedral, such as ordinations, Chrism Mass during Holy Week, and the Rite of Election in Lent. Here, the faithful gather from their church to give glory to God for the gift of faith, our connection to the universal Church and the successor of the apostles, our Archbishop.

In 1880, Chicago became a metropolitan Archdiocese, giving governance to the surrounding dioceses. All of Illinois is under the jurisdiction of the Archdiocese of Chicago, and every Catholic in Illinois claims Holy Name Cathedral as their mother church.

"Since the church is a visible building, it stands as a unique sign of hope of the pilgrim Church on earth and reflects the Church dwelling in heaven" (Rite of Dedication of a Church); the celebration of the anniversary of the dedication is essential to the life of a believer. One is baptized, forgiven, nourished, united, ordained, and anointed in the church.

As we celebrate the 147th anniversary of the dedication of Holy Name Cathedral, let us thank God for his blessings, goodness and faithfulness, and allow what we encounter within these walls to change the world.

## The Stump of Jesse

### More Wisdom from Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati

In the November 6 bulletin, I shared Part I of the story of Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati. He has a special place in the hearts of many people as the global patron for youth and young adults. Saint Pope John Paul II declared him a patron for World Youth Days and deemed him “the man of the beatitudes.” Pope Francis echoed his predecessor by listing Frassati among twelve exemplary saints for all young people. The Pope encouraged all to see them as the ones “who devoted their lives to Christ ... precious reflections of the young Christ; their radiant witness encourages us and awakens us from our lethargy.” Beautiful, isn’t it? Do we see the light of Christ radiating in our hearts, our words, and our actions? Here is the letter that Frassati wrote to his peers. MJJ.

“Young People of Pollone,

Today, God’s minister has blessed your prayer, and he has invoked upon you the blessings of heaven so that every one of you may be worthy of this flag and may defend it against every attack. Because this flag, young people, represents in a symbolic way a divine doctrine given by Jesus Christ for our redemption. Young people, I see on your flag the motto “Prayer, Action and Sacrifice.” These are three words that summarize a very vast program whose implementation requires our energies and those of generations to come.

Prayer is the noble supplication which we lift up to the throne of God. It is the most efficient means to obtain from God the graces which we need, and especially the strength of persevering in these times, in which the hatred of the sons of the devil is breaking out violently

against the sheep who are faithful to the fold.

In recommending heartfelt prayer to you, I include all the practices of piety, first of all, the most Holy Eucharist. And remembering that apostle of the Holy Eucharist, the Holy Father Pius XII of venerable memory, I urge you with all the strength of my soul to approach the Eucharistic Table as often as possible. Feed on this Bread of the Angels from which you will draw the strength to fight inner struggles, the struggles against passions and against all adversities because Jesus Christ has promised to those who feed themselves with the most Holy Eucharist, eternal life and the necessary graces to obtain it.

And when you become totally consumed by this Eucharistic Fire, then you will be able to thank with greater awareness the Lord God who has called you to be part of his flock and you will enjoy that peace which those who are happy according to the world have never tasted. Because true happiness, young people, does not consist in the pleasures of the world and in earthly things, but in peace of conscience which we can have only if we are pure in heart and in mind.”

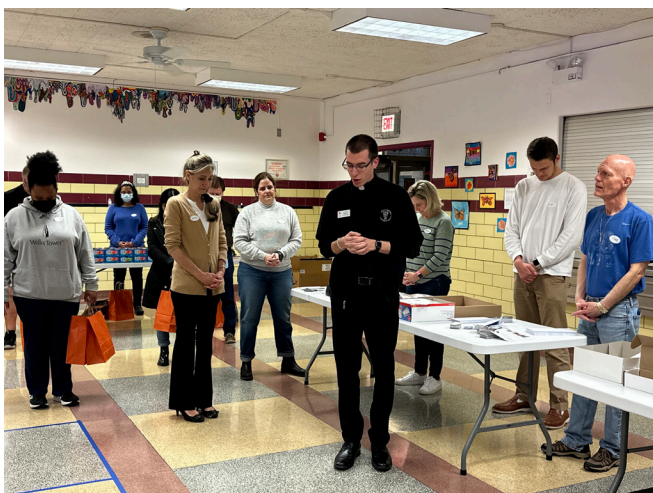

## Stewards in the Work of Advancing His Kingdom

On this Feast of Christ the King, our readings show us that we serve the greatest of Kings, who is at the same time the humblest of Kings. Christ is the perfect model of servant leadership. And what an indescribable privilege that He has called us to be servant leaders — stewards in the work of advancing His Kingdom.



In our second reading, from St. Paul's letter to the Colossians, Paul describes the great power and dignity that characterize Christ the King. "All things were created through him and for him. He is before all things and in him all things hold together." It makes you want to stand up and cheer.

Yet what a contrasting description of the same King we find in our Gospel passage, from Luke. Now we see our King nailed to the Cross. Everyone from rulers to soldiers, to the criminals on either side of Christ is mocking, sneering, and reviling him. They tauntingly urge him to prove His kingship by coming down from the Cross to end his suffering with a great show of power. "If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself."

But He does not. Amazingly, it is in this moment of seeming weakness and humiliation, when all appears hopeless and lost, that the full breadth of his greatness as king is displayed. Though all things were created through and for Him — Christ chooses to live entirely for others, for us!

What does this mean for us as his followers and stewards of His kingdom? Precisely that our lives are not about us. They are about Christ and others. And we will advance his kingdom to the extent that we embrace this mindset: my life is not about me; it is about serving the King of kings.

# Reflections from Our Rector



Dear People of God,

The word “Eucharist” means “to give thanks.” As we celebrate Thanksgiving Day this Thursday, we truly have much to be thankful for in life. I am truly aware of life’s pain, sorrow, stress and hardships. Yet, author Nancy Wood has a wonderful

perspective regarding thankfulness. Wood states, “I must be thankful for what IS and stop thinking about what IS NOT.”

Joyce Rupp, well-known author and speaker, wrote in her book, “Out of the Ordinary” (Ave Maria Press):

“In one of his journal notations, Thomas Merton writes that we are always thinking that our life will truly be happy “when.” We are not satisfied with what is currently our situation because we have it in our mind that our life won’t be happy until something else occurs like:

- when I have one more thing I want,
- when I get rid of that personality flaw of mine,
- when I can finally have life as I have always dreamed it to be,
- when I am truly successful,
- when I learn to pray better,
- when I find the right person in my life
- when, when, when ...

Waiting for the “when” keeps me from appreciating what I now have. Longing for promises and dreaming dreams is not a harmful deed as long as the present moment is not overlooked, as long as gratitude rises for what is already here, as long as I do not base my happiness on what is still wanting. Thankfulness for what has already been given is the foundation for hoping for what is not yet.

Today, I am going to put aside:

- “when this happens”
- “if only this could be”
- “when things get better”
- “as soon as I have this”

I am going to harvest what I now have, gather all the

many gifts that are already mine. I am going to observe what has been placed in the granary of my heart and marvel at the abundance. I will stand before this heap of blessings and take a long, grateful look. I will say farewell to my “when” and be thankful for what is.”

At the same time, enjoy the following and pass it on ...

## How to Stay Young

1. Keep only cheerful friends. The grouches pull you down. (Keep this in mind if you are one of those grouches!)
2. Keep learning: Learn more about the computer, crafts, gardening, whatever...Never let the brain get idle.
3. Enjoy the simple things.
4. Laugh often, long and loud. Laugh until you gasp for breath. And if you have a friend who makes you laugh, spend lots and lots of time with that person.
