I will start piano lessons ... tomorrow.

We will start going to Mass as a family ... this weekend.

It is easy to procrastinate as our lives sometimes feel too busy or overwhelming. Do you easily get distracted or lose focus? Maybe you suffer from A.A.A.D.D. ... Keep reading ...

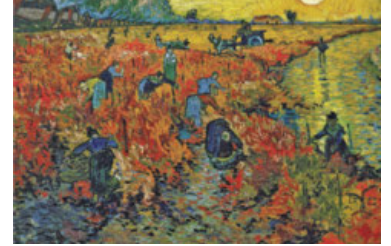

Today's parable from Matthew is notoriously tricky. Some have questioned the landowner's statement that he can do whatever he likes



with his money, implying that he may be exploitative. However, the parable focuses on the landowner's generosity by juxtaposing two economies to make a statement about drastic change or complete reversal.

The economies on display are an exchange economy and a gift economy. An exchange economy is based knowing you will get in exchange for what you give. This economy is generally to the owner's advantage, centering on cost, price and profit. In contrast, a gift economy declines this tit-for-tat calculation to operate by another principle. It goes by unmerited favor or extravagant generosity. Instead of something negotiated or agreed on, it turns calculated exchange into ungrounded magnanimity or, in Christian terminology, grace.

The parish is a critical part of any neighborhood, and Holy Name Cathedral Parish is no different. The parish is where people of all backgrounds come together for a common mission. The mission of Holy Name Cathedral is “as a Catholic parish and the seat of the Archdiocese of Chicago, forms a community of disciples who inspire, nurture, and join people on their faith journey to encounter and grow in Jesus Christ.” The Cathedral fulfills our mission through the many ministries we offer.



The Worship group is responsible for many ministries to allow people to encounter and grow in Jesus Christ. From the Lenten Fish Fry to Coffee in the Courtyard to the Pre- and Post-Chicago Marathon Mass, in everything we do, we worship God. But the most obvious way the Worship group is through liturgical ministries in the Eucharist celebration. There are three key ministries where the clergy rely on the laity for active participation during the celebration of Mass.

Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion (EMHC):

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion assist the priest and deacon in distributing the Body and Blood of Christ to those gathered for worship. As an EMHC, you play an essential role in helping Holy Name Cathedral ‘open wide the doors’ to Christ for those who come forth to receive the Lord in the Eucharist. We need more EMHCs to offer the precious blood during more Masses.

Lectors: The lector proclaims the Word of God to those gathered for Mass and does so in a way that engages communal listening. A candidate for lector should have skill in speaking, knowledge of the various parts and movements of the Mass, and an understanding and love for Sacred Scripture. A lector also serves as the commentator at Mass and offers the Prayers of the Faithful in the absence of a deacon.

Ushers: An Usher at Holy Name Cathedral is one of the first points of welcoming our parishioners and many visitors to this special place of worship. Whether seating or assisting our brothers and sisters in faith during the Mass, the Usher always does it with a tremendous sense of hospitality. Of course, a part of being an Usher is the taking up of the regular Sunday collection and the occasional special second collection, but more than that, Ushers make our visitors and parishioners feel at home, welcome and safe during our Eucharistic celebrations.

To learn more about these liturgical minister roles at the Cathedral, please stop by our table at the Ministry Fair today in the Courtyard and talk to one of our captains of these ministries. We are finalizing training dates in the October/November timeframe, so please sign up if you are interested in being trained to serve in a liturgical ministry at the Cathedral.

Each of us has gifts and talents; by using those gifts, we glorify God. Through worship, we praise God for the blessings he showers upon us. As we gather around this altar week in and week out, consider joining one of these ministries or participating in a Worship Pillar event to help glorify God in word and deed. Everything we do here at the Cathedral Faith Community, whether through Worship, Evangelization, Stewardship, or Service, is done for the glory of God and the Holy Name of Jesus.

Join CFN to Honor St. Lorenzo Ruiz, First Filipino Saint

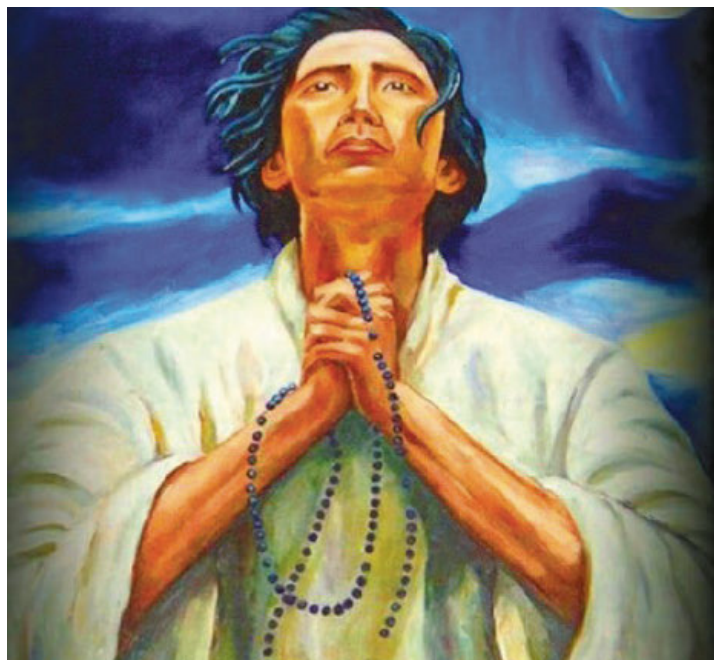
Special Mass: Thursday, Sept. 28 at 12:00pm

The Cathedral Filipino Network (CFN) cordially invites you to the Holy Eucharist in honor of Saint Lorenzo Ruiz, the first Filipino saint, on Sept. 28 at 12:00pm.

Saint Lorenzo Ruiz is the first Filipino venerated in the Roman Catholic Church. He became the country's protomartyr of Chinese-Filipino parentage after his execution by the Tokugawa Shogunate during its persecution of Japanese Christians in the 17th century. Ruiz was born in Binondo, Manila, to a Chinese father and a Filipino mother.

At a young age, Lorenzo served as an altar boy and studied under the Dominican friars. Later, he married Rosario, and they had two sons and a daughter. While working as a clerk for the Binondo Church, Lorenzo was falsely accused of killing a Spaniard. He sought asylum on board a ship with the help of three Dominican priests.

Lorenzo and some of his friends left for Okinawa on June 10, 1636. Upon arrival in Japan, the missionaries were arrested and thrown into prison. After two years, Lorenzo and his companions met different types of torture. On Sept. 27, 1637, their captors took him and his companions to Nishizaka Hill, where they were tortured and hung upside down. Ruiz refused to renounce Christianity and died from blood loss and suffocation. His body was



cremated, with the ashes thrown into the sea.

Lorenzo Ruiz was beatified during Pope John Paul II's papal visit to the Philippines in 1981 and was canonized on Oct. 18, 1987, making him the first Filipino saint. His canonization was based on a miracle in 1983, when Cecilia Alegria Policarpio, a two-year-old girl suffering from in-born brain atrophy, was cured after her family and supporters prayed to Lorenzo for his intercession.

This discussion allows us, as Catholics, to face the social stigma of denial and listen to those who have learned to celebrate these children of God. Were All These Events a Coincidence? I Don't Think So!!

Overwhelmingly speaking, I have witnessed a few 'miracles' at the Cathedral. Here is one.

On Friday, Sept. 15, a group of young adults initiated the Frassati Small Groups with Adoration and Mass on the memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows. This day commemorates the profound bond of heart between the Mother of the Redeemer and the Savior, through which she experienced many inner sorrows because of Her Son's Mission, especially during His Passion and Death.

And what took place on Thursday, Sept. 14? It was the Feast of the Exultation of the Cross, a universal truth of Christian faith, signifying Christ's triumph over death. This feast celebrates the redemptive transformation of a cruel instrument of torture into a divine "tree of life," offering hope to humanity.

Subsequently, the small group began meeting weekly on Saturday, Sept. 16, on the memorial of St. Cornelius and Cyprian. This day commemorates two friends in the service of Christ and His Church, who were fervent in their faith and dedicated hours to work for the unity of the Church.
