

# Join Us for the Annual **Pueri Cantores Mass**

### Saturday, Feb. 22 at 5:15pm Mass

Youth choirs have long been integral to the Church's mission. One of the most celebrated of these groups, Les Petits Chanteurs la Croix de Bois (The Little Singers of the Wooden Cross), was brought to prominence in 1917 by Fernand Maillet, and performed in the cities, towns and villages of France. Their example has since been followed by other choirs internationally. Msgr. Maillet organized the first International Congress for the choirs in 1947. It took place in Paris, and at that time, he gave the federation its name, PUERI CANTORES.

The American Federation Pueri Cantores was formed in 1953 to accomplish the same mission in the United States. Choirs proliferated in Catholic churches and schools across the country and took a significant and inspirational leadership role in worship and educationrelated events. Reflecting general lack of support of the arts, however and reacting to worship guidelines set forth in Vatican II, nearly all of those groups disappeared during the late 1900s.

Now, many communities are once again committed to establishing and developing new choirs of young singers throughout America. Sharing an exciting and expanded vision, these choirs create unprecedented opportunities for children, families, schools, churches and organizations locally, nationally and throughout the world.


Students who travel with their choirs have a chance to meet singers from other cities and states. They establish friendships, learn about different cultures, and bring Christ's message of peace and joy. Choir directors exchange musical ideas, traditions and performance practice information with other musicians throughout the nation and world. Pueri Cantores singers learn music of faith, hope and love; they grow in musicianship, spirituality, liturgical understanding and community.

This year's Mass will feature Fr. Dan Korenchan as the main celebrant with Anna Doering as the guest conductor. The choir will include Mixed Voice and Treble Choirs (grades 4-12) from throughout the Midwest.

# **Anointing of the Sick: A Most Misunderstood Sacrament**

■he Anointing of the Sick is one of the Church's seven sacraments. Along with the Sacrament of Reconciliation, they are the sacraments of healing. There have been a lot of misunderstandings surrounding the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Many incorrectly believe it is only celebrated in the



hour of death. In reality, the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, like the other six Sacraments, is for the living. We celebrate the Sacrament of the Sick when we need healing in body, mind, or spirit, including when that healing is also at the moment of death.

Like all Sacraments, the Anointing of the Sick brings one into an encounter with Jesus Christ. The Sacrament enables sick persons to find solace and comfort in their illness and allows them to live out their call of discipleship in their illness. The beginning pages of the Praenotanda of the Ritual for the Anointing of the Sick says, "By their witness, the sick show that our mortal life must be redeemed through the mystery of Christ's death and resurrection" (Pastoral Care for the Sick. 3). We see that the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus have touched everything that happens in this life.

Celebrating the Anointing of the Sick is personal and communal, meaning it belongs to the individual and the Church community. It is personal because the individual receives the Holy Spirit's grace. It is communal because the church community unites in prayer for the ill person suffering. This duality contrasts sharply with how society sometimes treats sick people. Before the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965), the Anointing of the Sick was celebrated in extremis as a person approached death. So, it was known as "Last Rites" and "Extreme Unction." The Council affirmed that this was indeed a sacrament for all that are sick and not only for those near death (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, n. 73). The personal and communal aspects of the Sacrament show that the

anointing can be done in a home or a hospital room, or within the context of a Mass.

The anointing of the Sick is not a one-time event. It is a sacrament that can be celebrated more than once, offering reassurance and hope to those in need. A priest can anoint those who are seriously ill, people about to undergo surgery, older individuals who struggle with declining health, people with chronic illnesses, and those who suffer from mental illness at any point in their lives. This repeated celebration of the Sacrament is a reminder that healing is a journey, and the Church is there to provide spiritual support and comfort along the way.

This upcoming Saturday, Feb. 8, at 9:00am, there will be a Healing Mass with the Anointing of the Sick for those who have come to reflect on the Sacrament and their current health issues and avail themselves of this Sacrament. Tuesday, Feb. 11 is the World Day of Prayer for the Sick and traditionally the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, whose water at the Grotto in Lourdes is known for miraculous healings. How appropriate then to approach Mary, the mother of the divine physician, through the celebration of the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, to seek healing in mind, body, and spirit so the sick can draw close to Christ and see suffering as a participation in the salvation of the world.

# **Celebrate Black History** Month with Our Friends of Fr. Augustus Tolton

February is Black History Month. To celebrate, come learn about The Venerable Father Augustus Tolton, the first African American priest in the United States.

This month, we have a video presentation relating to the life of Fr. Tolton. All are welcome on Sunday, Feb. 16 at



12noon in the Rectory, Room 201. No advance registration is required.

### What is Black History Month?

Harvard-trained historian, Carter G. Woodson believed that truth could not be denied and that reason would prevail over prejudice. His hopes to raise awareness of African Americans' contributions to civilization was realized when he and the organization he founded, the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History (ASNLH), conceived of Negro History Week in 1925. The event was first celebrated during a week in February 1926 that encompassed the birthdays of both Abraham Lincoln and Frederick Douglass. The response was overwhelming. By the time of Woodson's death in 1950, Negro History Week had become a central part of African American life. The Black Awakening of the 1960s dramatically expanded the importance of black history.

The celebration was expanded to a month in 1976. That year, 50 years after the first celebration, the association held the first Black History Month. By this time, the entire nation had come to recognize the importance of Black history in the drama of the American story.


