Join Us for the Annual Pueri Cantores Mass

Saturday, Feb. 22 at 5:15pm Mass

Youth choirs have long been integral to the Church's mission. One of the most celebrated of these groups, *Les Petits Chanteurs la Croix de Bois* (The Little Singers of the Wooden Cross), was brought to prominence in 1917 by Fernand Maillet, and performed in the cities, towns and villages of France. Their example has since been followed by other choirs internationally. Msgr. Maillet organized the first International Congress for the choirs in 1947. It took place in Paris, and at that time, he gave the federation its name, PUERI CANTORES.



The American Federation *Pueri Cantores* was formed in 1953 to accomplish the same mission in the United States. Choirs proliferated in Catholic churches and schools across the country and took a significant and inspirational leadership role in worship and education-related events. Reflecting general lack of support of the arts, however, and reacting to worship guidelines set forth in Vatican II, nearly all of those groups disappeared during the late 1900s.

Now, many communities are once again committed to establishing and developing new choirs of young singers throughout America. Sharing an exciting and expanded vision, these choirs create unprecedented opportunities for children, families, schools, churches and organizations locally, nationally and throughout the world.

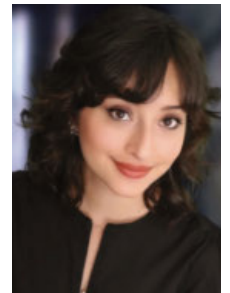
Students who travel with their choirs have a chance to meet singers from other cities and states. They establish friendships, learn about different cultures, and bring Christ's message of peace and joy. *Pueri Cantores* singers learn music of faith, hope and love; they grow in musicianship, spirituality, liturgical understanding and community.

This year's Mass will be presided by Fr. Dan Korenchan as the main celebrant and feature Anna Doering as the guest conductor. The choir will include Mixed Voice and Treble Choirs (grades 4-12) from throughout the Midwest.

Here's Hoping My Homilies Will Help You Encounter Christ

In September, I wrote about my return to the classroom, specifically a two-year program based at the University of Dallas through the Homiletics Institute, focused on preaching for the encounter. Tragically, the program does not require me to go to Dallas monthly or even annually. I never need to be on campus at all.



The program is designed in a few facets: I attend a monthly Zoom session with one of the trained homiletics coaches and work through various goals I set for myself. We evaluate a recently recorded homily I gave and look at multiple criteria, from theology to body language. Another facet is the archdiocesan cohort of nine priests, myself included, who are a part of this program. We meet at one of our parishes monthly when two of the nine priests show a recording of their homilies. The other priests give feedback and constructive criticism. These meetings are constructive because my brother priests understand what it is like to preach and provide input and ideas. It is also a chance to meet and support each other in our shared ministry.

The third facet is the St. Joseph Lay Preachers group, comprised of 10 lay people in the parish who meet monthly to learn about the art of listening, preaching, and homiletics overall. I will meet with this group monthly beginning in the fall. I am grateful for their willingness to work with me, to pray for me, and to help me grow in my preaching.

While I said I don't need to go to Dallas for this program, I did attend our winter seminar in Jacksonville, Florida, last week. And before you think it, it was anything but a vacation! Our schedule was from 8am to 8pm Monday through Thursday. We met with the entire cohort for the program, around 60 priests and deacons from around the United States. Despite the heavy schedule, it was an

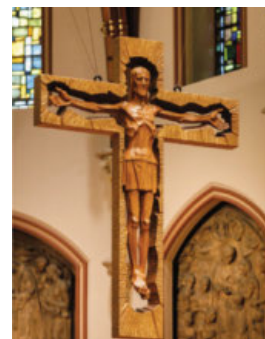
invaluable and informative conference, giving us tools to deepen our preaching ability and grow our preaching skills.

This program has been very valuable to me in these short few months already. I am grateful for the opportunity presented to me by the Archdiocese to be a part of this cohort; I hope my words touch your hearts and souls in one way or another. I am always open to feedback with my homilies, hopefully constructive, and appreciate your patience as I continue to learn and grow in this area of my priestly ministry. Over these next few months of the program, I may try a few new techniques and forms of homilies, so thank you for your openness and continued support.

As I prepare my homilies each week, I preach to myself first — if I don't believe what I say, no one else will. I also pray that through my homily, I bring at least one person into an encounter with God, knowing they are loved and seen for who they are. Thank you for walking with me as we all seek to encounter Christ in Word and Sacrament.

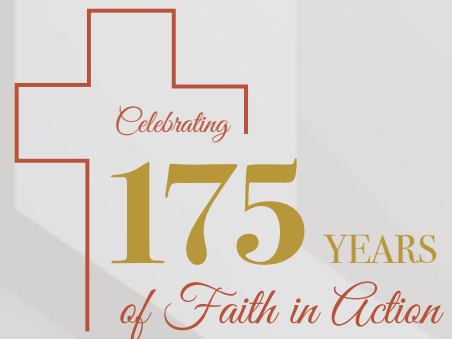
