# Reflections from Our Rector



**Dear People of God,**

Our Lenten Season begins this Wednesday. We are a marked people on Ash Wednesday! Lent is an opportunity and time for repentance, conversion, listening, and new beginnings. We move from death to life so abundantly that we call it Eternal —

Resurrection — Easter Faith.

I share part of a Commencement Address by Anna Quindlen to the graduating class of Trinity Western University. May her poignant words speak hope and provide a more straightforward road to this Lenten journey.

“People don’t talk about the soul very much anymore. It’s so much easier to write a résumé than to craft a spirit. But a résumé is cold comfort on winter nights when you’re sad, broke, or lonely. Just keep your eyes and ears open. Here, you could learn in the classroom. There, the classroom is everywhere. The exam comes at the very end.

I found one of my best teachers on the boardwalk at Coney Island maybe 15 years ago. It was December, and I was doing a story about how the homeless survive in the winter months. He and I sat on the edge of the wooden supports, dangling our feet over the side, and he told me about his schedule: panhandling the boulevard when the summer crowds were gone, sleeping in a church when the

temperature went below freezing, hiding from the police amidst the Tilt-a-Whirl and the Cyclone and some of the other seasonal rides.

But he told me that most of the time, he stayed on the boardwalk, facing the water, just the way we were sitting now, even when it got cold and he had to wear his newspapers after he read them.

And I asked him why. Why didn’t he go to one of the shelters? Why didn’t he check himself into the hospital for detox?

And he just stared out at the ocean and said, ‘Look at the view, young lady. Look at the view.’

And every day, in some little way, I try to do what he said.

I try to look at the view. And that’s the last thing I have to tell you today: words of wisdom from a man with no dime in his pocket, no place to go, and nowhere to be.

Look at the view. You’ll never be disappointed.”

Our Lenten journey begins this Wednesday. Plan to start your Season of Lent by joining us for our Ash Wednesday liturgies and prayer services.

May we open our hearts and invite the Lord Jesus to touch our lives this Holy Season --and look at the view through a Jesus lens! Remember ---you can never go back and start a new beginning, but starting today, you can make a new ending with the help and grace of God.

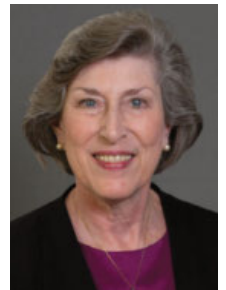

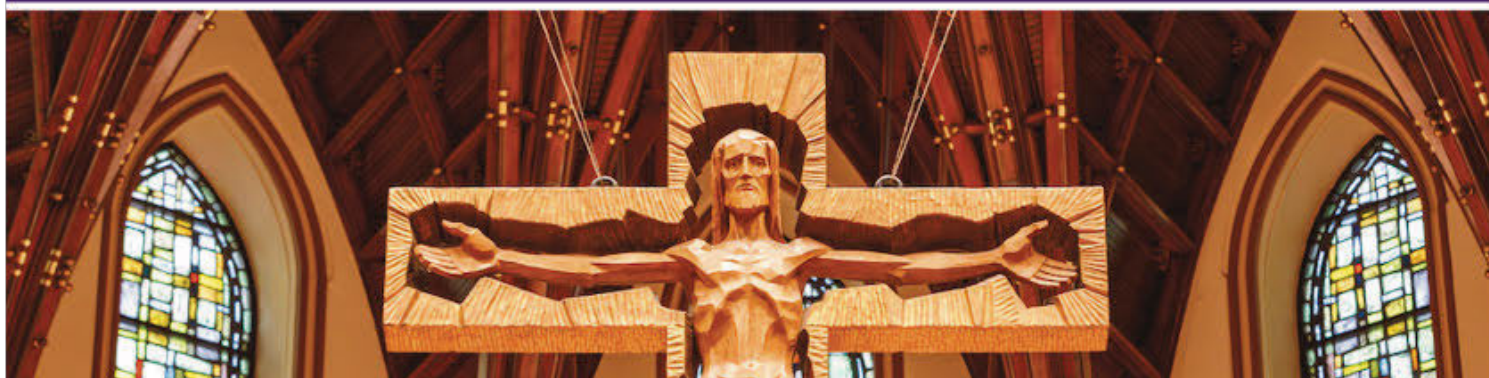

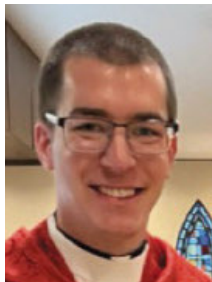
# It's Time for Ash Wednesday to Begin Our Lenten Journey

**T**his Wednesday, the Church will begin our journey through the desert in preparation for the joyful day of Easter Sunday, with Ash Wednesday. The ritual of marking ourselves with ashes as a sign of repentance from sin goes back to the Old Testament. Ashes are a sign of humility and repentance, of recognizing our sinfulness and desiring to be made new in God's sight. Throughout the Old Testament, many people marked themselves with ashes as they acknowledged their sinfulness, recognizing their need to change their ways (cf. 2 Samuel 13:19, cf. Esther 4:1,3; cf. Job 42:6, cf. Jeremiah 6:26). The usage of ashes in our Catholic tradition links us to our Old Testament roots.

Attending Mass or a prayer service on Ash Wednesday to get ashes on our forehead to "show off" to our co-workers, family members, or people on the street that we are Christian is not the spirituality of this day. Ash Wednesday begins our Lenten journey of ongoing conversion and repentance. It is a way for us as individuals to realize we are sinners, we are mortal, and we are dust, but with God, through our baptism and profession of faith in Jesus Christ, we are redeemed and set free from sin and death. The use of ashes is a reminder to us in a very tangible way that we cannot do life alone, that there is always a need for renewal and repentance, and by journeying in the desert with Jesus for 40 days, we will be able to focus on renewing our spiritual lives.

The three pillars of Lent are prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Through prayer, we renew our relationship with God. We recognize more deeply how we need to depend more on God, his love, and his mercy. By fasting, we try to detach ourselves from worldly allurements and desires. We give things up during Lent to turn our attention back to God, who fulfills our desires. By almsgiving, we seek to help those among us who cannot help themselves, restore our common humanity, and



strive to be agents of solidarity and accompaniment. Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving should redirect our hearts and our minds towards God, assisting us in this sacred time to change our ways, and above all, help us to remember that we are dust and we shall return to dust. It also reminds us to repent, and believe in the Gospel.

The Cathedral will provide Rice Bowls, a practical way of giving alms during the Lenten season. The proceeds of our almsgiving will benefit Catholic Relief Services, the official relief and development agency of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops. The money raised through Rice Bowls helps communities in over 100 countries alleviate the strain of poverty. We will collect the rice bowls during Holy Week.

As we enter this sacred season, may we be renewed in our hearts and minds; through the cross traced on our foreheads in ashes, we are saved, made free through the sacrifice of Christ, and promised eternal life through our baptism.

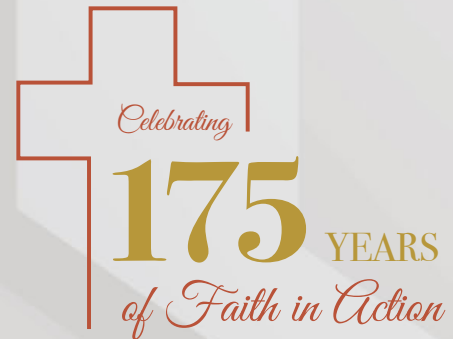

One Sunday, at the 8:30am Mass, something beautiful happened before my eyes. While waiting for the Offertory gifts to be brought to the altar, I saw three little children with their grandparents. At first, the youngest sibling hesitated. She looked nervous, then suddenly turned and ran back to her parents. But then – something incredible happened.

Her older sister, not much bigger than her, made a bold decision. Without hesitation, she picked up her little sister and carried her forward. You could see it wasn't easy – she struggled but was determined. And then, halfway to the sanctuary, another moment of grace unfolded. The little one, who first clung to her older sister, suddenly found the courage to walk with her. She let go and made the rest of the journey by herself. Isn't that amazing?

It's such a powerful image of our spiritual journey. Sometimes, God calls us to carry others struggling to come to Him. Other times, we are the ones being carried. But the key? We have to keep going. We have to persevere.

Fr. Boniface Hicks, OSB, in his book "Personal Prayer,"



writes about perseverance: "The most important thing to grow in prayer and in our relationship with God is to begin to pray. The second most important thing is to continue, to persevere in prayer...The fear of missing out makes us restless. The same temptations face us when we settle into a dedicated time of prayer, but the only way to grow is through stability and perseverance."

Isn't that precisely what happened on the Road to Emmaus? The two disciples left Jerusalem because they couldn't sit with the reality of Jesus' crucifixion. Maybe they thought life would be better elsewhere. They were restless, searching. And yet, it was on that road – when they were walking away – that Jesus met them, walked with them, and set their hearts on fire again. And that's why I'm so excited to invite you to The Road to Emmaus – a day of renewal on June 8.

It will be a powerful day filled with good talks, music, fellowship, and most importantly, a chance to re-light the fire of love for the Lord on the Feast of Pentecost. So, start saving your spot now! Bring your friends – whether they feel strong in faith or struggle to believe. Because just like on the road to Emmaus, Jesus meets us where we are and walks with us.

## Honor a Loved One with a Mother Cabrini and Courtyard Paver Programs

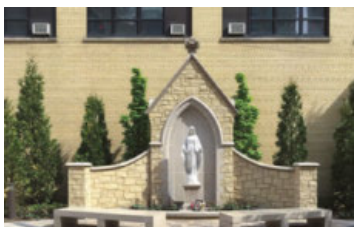
### Mother Cabrini Commemorative Paver
