# Reflections from Our Rector



Dear People of God,

We have begun our Lenten Season, and the official start of Spring is less than two weeks away!

Many may say, "Here we go again! Another Lent!" Yet, our Lenten journey is best captured by the TV commercial message from years ago: "Don't judge

too quickly." Lent is a time of repentance, conversion, and stepping back from one's life to look at the view.

Lent can also be an opportunity to give thanks for the many gifts we take for granted. Being thankful is a matter of perspective, so I share what was recently given to me.

## I am thankful for...

- The mess to clean up after a party because it means friends have surrounded me.
- A lawn that needs mowing, snow that needs shoveling, dishes to wash, mopping, vacuuming, and dusting that needs to be done because it means I have a place to live.
- Having to find my reading glasses or sunglasses because it means I have the gift of sight.
- I chose the spot at the far end of the parking lot because it means I can walk.
- The long line I stand in at the grocery store because it means I will have food on the table tonight.
- My large heating bill because it means I have a warm place to sleep.
- When my food is too bland or salty, it means I can taste it.
- The button falls off my shirt because it means I have clothes to wear.

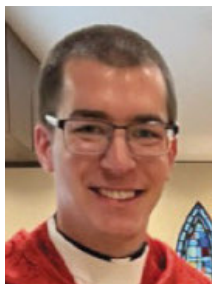

# This Election Day Marks A Step Closer to Encounter Christ

**T**he Cathedral in the diocese is known for many liturgical celebrations that are important to the life of the diocese. Examples include priesthood and diaconate ordinations, where men are ordained to serve God's people; the Chrism Mass, where the oils we use for our Sacraments, Chrism, Oil of the Sick, and Oil of the Catechumens, are blessed by the Bishop and distributed to the parishes, and or even just last week, the ordination of new auxiliary bishops. However, one event that is often overlooked or neglected is the Rite of Election. This event takes place at the beginning of Lent each year and is important to the life of the local Church.



Holy Name Cathedral is hosting the Archdiocesan Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion this weekend and next weekend. At this liturgical celebration, those desiring to be baptized into the Church at this upcoming Easter Vigil, as well as those seeking to be fully initiated or complete their Sacraments of Initiation, come before the Bishop to reaffirm their intention to be admitted to the Church through the Sacraments of Initiation. Up to this point, the catechumens, specifically those desiring Christian Initiation, have undergone a long period of formation of the heart and mind. Now, the Church discerns their state of preparedness. "In this step, the Church makes her "Election," or the choice and admission of catechumens who by their dispositions are fit to take part in the next celebration of the Sacraments of Initiation" (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults, #118-119). The whole Archdiocese is represented in this liturgical event as people from Cook and Lake counties come together to be accepted by the Church for the Easter Sacraments. As each catechumen's and candidate's name is called in the rite, their name echoes throughout the Cathedral, joining with the names of so many who are worthy to participate in the Paschal

Mystery of Christ, the passion, death, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus, through the Sacraments.

After the Rite of Election and until Holy Saturday, the catechumens are called "the elect" because they have been 'elected' to participate in the Sacraments of Initiation at the Great Vigil of Easter, Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist, as the Bishop says, "Trusting in their judgment, the Church calls you in the name of Christ to the Pascal Sacraments" (OCIA, #132). Those who will be fully received or initiated will continue to deepen their desire to encounter Christ more fully through the Sacraments of the Catholic Church.

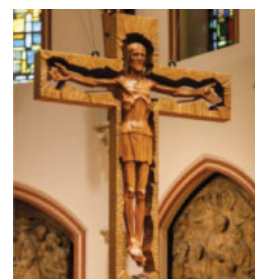
As a Cathedral Parish, we have a duty to pray for our brothers and sisters who will be baptized into the Church on Holy Saturday at the Easter Vigil. They will soon call the Cathedral their mother church as well, no matter the parish they belong to in the Archdiocese.

Specifically for our Holy Name Cathedral Parish, we have 16 catechumens seeking all three Sacraments of Initiation and 14 candidates seeking full reception or initiation into the Church. Let us be mindful during this Lenten season to pray for those preparing to enter in Christ's passion, death, resurrection, and ascension, and celebrate with them the joy of Easter when they conquer sin and death with our Lord, the same victory we share in by our own baptism.

## 175th Anniversary Cathedral Mini Concert

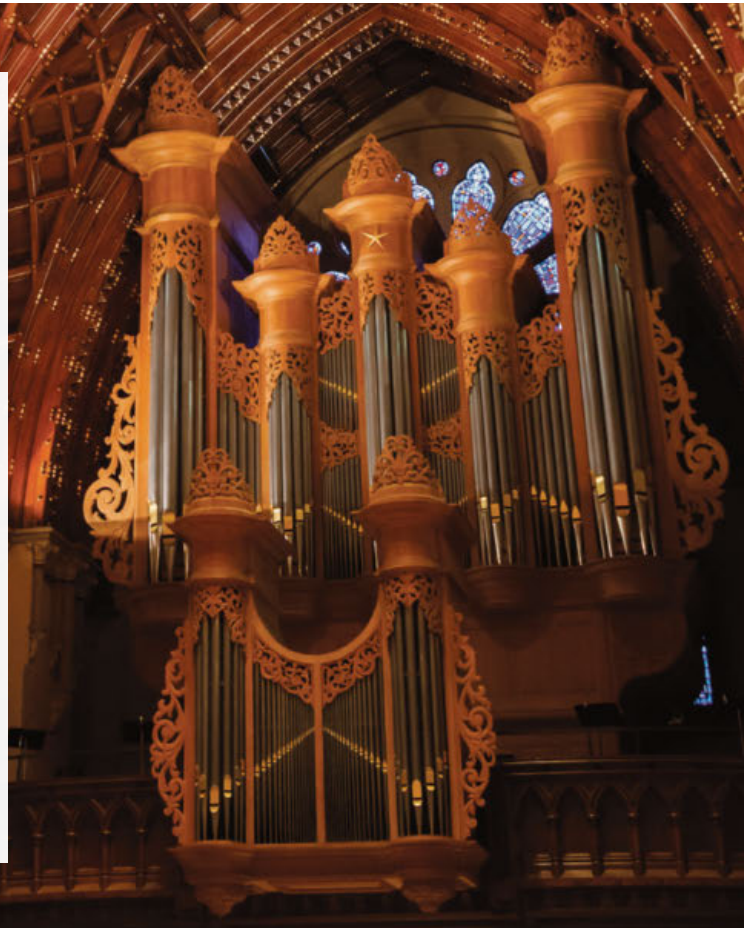

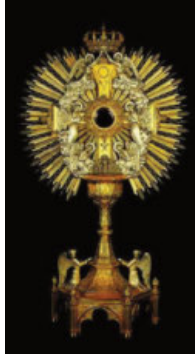
### Lenten Service Project

Chicago Shares will be available for purchase in the Cathedral lobby on Sunday, March 16 before and after the 8:30am and 10:30am Masses.

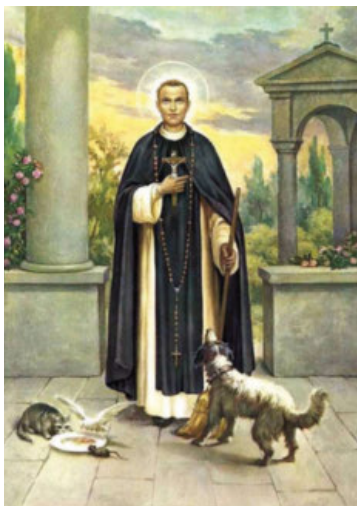

## Reflection on 'Women Visionaries: Religious Women'

Approximately 25 adults endured the cold to learn about the religious women and men who ministered the children of Holy Name Parish/Cathedral. The most astonishing story concerned the Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet.

Few knew that the former University of St. Mary of the Lake housed 300 orphans, infants to teens, some with physical disabilities. On Oct. 9, 1871, 15 Sisters watched as the fire continued to move forward. Once it engulfed the water house, they scurried to round up the orphans and lead them miles north, away from the danger. Today, the Sisters sponsor Nazareth Academy and Bethlehem Woods Village.
