Reflections from Our Rector



Dear People of God,

With our Season of Lent beginning its second week, I have spent each morning in reflective prayer. The early morning is quiet, and I am making extra time to pray every day this Lenten season. I share several short pieces of reading that have touched

my heart. May the Lord Jesus touch your heart as we continue our Lenten journey. Go to the Lord Jesus just as you are — and let the Spirit of God transform, change, and surprise you in ways you never expected!

“He Still Moves Stones”

Your goal is not to live long; it's to live.

Jesus says the options are clear. On one side, there is the voice of safety. You can build a fire in the hearth, stay inside, and stay warm, dry, and safe.... Or, you can hear the voice of adventure — God's adventure. Instead of building a fire in your hearth, build a fire in your heart. Follow God's impulses. Adopt the child. Move overseas. Teach the class. Change careers. Make a difference. Sure, it isn't safe, but what is?

The following is from the Little Black Lenten Book that we handed out during Ash Wednesday, just as we have in previous years:

Sometimes, we think of the “sacrifices” of Lent. The word “sacrifice” means to “make holy.” It's a gift that we give to God as we take away anything that stands between us.

When we bring things to the altar -- we call them “sacrifices.” It is a gift to God, and it's the best gift we could ever give ourselves because it make us holy, closer

to God. It eliminates something between us and God.

Our Lenten Season can also be a time of added stress – too much to do and not enough time to accomplish all these “important” tasks. The following story may put stress and our Lenten season into a better perspective.

When explaining stress management to an audience, a lecturer raised a glass of water and asked, “How heavy is this glass of water?” Answers called out ranged from 20g to 500g.

The lecturer replied, “The absolute weight doesn't matter. It depends on how long you try to hold the glass of water. If I hold it for a minute, that's not a problem. If I hold it for an hour, I'll have an ache in my right arm. If I hold it for a day, you'll have to call an ambulance. It's the same weight in each case, but the longer I hold it, the heavier it becomes.”

He continued, “And that's the way it is with stress management. If we carry our burdens all the time, sooner or later, as the burden becomes increasingly heavy, we won't be able to carry on.

As with the glass of water, you have to put it down and rest before holding it again. When we're refreshed, we can carry on with the burden. So, before you return home tonight, put the burden of work down. Don't carry it home. You can pick it up tomorrow. Whatever burdens you're carrying now, let them down for a moment if you can. Relax; pick them up later after you've rested. Life is short. Enjoy it!”

Lent is a time of repentance and change. It is also a time to let go of life's burdens and stress and invite the Lord Jesus to carry the load. It is never too late to change, but we must know what to look for with the help and grace of God.

In honor of our anniversary, each week we will spotlight photos from our past 175 years on the bulletin cover. They’ll offer a peek into the past of our Faith Community.

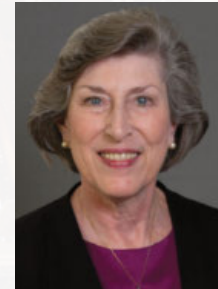

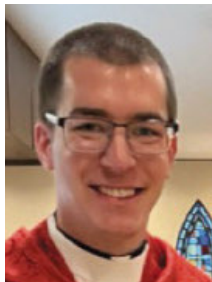
Deepen Your Prayer Life this Lent at Our Parish Mission

Lent's three pillars are known as prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Through prayer, we renew our relationship with God. We recognize more deeply how we need to depend more on God, his love, and his mercy. By fasting, we try to detach ourselves from worldly allurements and desires. We give things up during Lent to turn our attention back to God, who fulfills our desires. By almsgiving, we seek to help those who cannot help themselves, restore our common humanity, and strive to be agents of solidarity and accompaniment. Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving should redirect our hearts and our minds towards God, assisting us in this sacred time to change our ways, and above all, help us to remember that we are dust and we shall return to dust, also reminding us to repent, and believe in the Gospel.

To help with these pillars, the Cathedral provided Rice Bowls to foster almsgiving. Our upcoming parish mission helps with the pillar of prayer. A Parish Mission, usually offered during Advent or Lent but anytime throughout the year, is an opportunity for the faithful to gather away from Sunday Mass to renew their spiritual life. The Eucharist is indeed the source and summit of our faith, and gathering every Sunday as a family of faith is our primary call as Church. However, a Parish Mission allows time to be set aside, as Jesus did, to pray and focus on our spiritual lives. Attending Mass every Sunday is a commandment, a precept of the Church, but attending a Parish Mission is entirely voluntary.

Why would you consider attending our Parish Mission next Sunday, March 23, and Tuesday, March 25, at 6:30pm in the Cathedral? Our Parish Mission leader will be Sr. Barbara E. Reid, O.P., a Dominican Sister of Grand Rapids, Michigan, who holds a Ph.D. in Biblical Studies from The Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C. She is President of Catholic Theological Union and Carroll Stuhlmüller, CP Distinguished Professor of New



Testament Studies. She has taught at CTU since 1988, served as Vice President and Academic Dean from 2009-2018, and became president in 2021.

As a part of the Pope's Jubilee Year celebration, this year's theme is Pilgrims of Hope: A Biblical Reflection on Jubilee as a time of Restoration, Freedom, and Renewal.

The two-night Mission on Sunday and Tuesday will reflect on the biblical notion of Jubilee as a time of restoration, freedom, and grace-filled renewal. The Stump of Jesse

This Lent, Get in the Car! Become Who You are Meant to Be!

Fifty years from now, when you're looking back at your life, don't you want to be able to say you had the guts to get in the car?" That line from Transformers might not seem like a typical Lenten reflection, but think about it — life is full of moments where we have to decide whether to stay where it's safe or take the leap of faith. Lent is one of those moments. It's an invitation to get in the car and embark on a journey deeper into the mystery of God's love.



Diadochus of Photice, a 5th-century bishop, once wrote: "Anyone who loves God in the depths of his heart has already been loved by God. The measure of a man's love for God depends upon how deeply aware he is of God's love for him." In other words, the more we realize how much God loves us, the more that love transforms us — so much so that it feels like it seeps into our very bones, crying out to be shared with the world.

As you read this, I am witnessing this transformation firsthand. Twelve young adults are on a mission in Peru with Sr. Katie and me. For most of them, it's their first time stepping out of their comfort zones in such a big way. My hope and prayer for them is that this journey will open their eyes to the beauty of the universal Church, reminding them that we are all on the same path — one

that leads to sainthood.

In his Lenten message, Pope Francis speaks about journeying together in hope. He highlights three aspects:

1. **Journeying** – We are all pilgrims in this life. But are we truly moving forward, or are we stuck — immobilized by fear, doubt, or comfort? Lent challenges us to take a step, to leave behind sin and anything that holds us back from God.
2. **Journeying Together** – We are not meant to walk alone. The Church is a family, a community that supports, encourages, and lifts each other so that no one is left behind.
3. **Journeying Together in Hope** – Hope is not just unquestioning optimism, pretending everything will be fine. It's the confidence that no matter what we face, Christ is with us. Hope we can sing with St Paul, "Neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Rom 8:38-39). Christ is our hope.

Here's a little invitation for us this Lent: It's not just about giving something up (wait, what? I know, right!). It's about becoming who we are meant to be. It's about making space for God, allowing His love to transform us so fully that when others see us, they can say, "That person has read the life of Christ" — not just in words, but in how they live. I love being a priest! JMJ.
