Reflections from Our Rector



Dear People of God,

Our Lenten journey to the Cross continues with the Lord. What does Lent mean to you?

What could Lent mean in light of life's struggles, pains, and hurts? What gets you out of bed each morning and keeps you going?

Life is a gift from God packaged with many surprises. It is not what we do but what we allow the Lord Jesus to do through us.

The following story beautifully captures our Lenten responses this Holy Season as we seek to connect the mystery of God with our lives.

When the house lights dimmed and the concert was about to begin, the mother returned to her seat and discovered that the child was missing. Suddenly, the curtains parted, and spotlights focused on the impressive Steinway on the stage. In horror, the mother saw her little boy sitting at the keyboard, innocently picking out "Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star."

At that moment, the great piano master entered, quickly moved to the piano, and whispered in the boy's ear, "Don't quit. Keep playing." Then, leaning over, Paderewski reached down with his left hand and began filling in a bass part. Soon, his right arm reached around the other side of the child, and he added a running obbligato. Together, the old master and the young novice transformed what could have been a frightening situation into a wonderfully creative experience. The audience was so mesmerized

that they couldn't recall what else the great master played except the classic, "Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star."

Perhaps that's the way it is with God. What we can accomplish on our own is hardly noteworthy. We try our best, but the results aren't always graceful, flowing music. However, with the hand of the Master, our life's work can be truly beautiful.

The next time you set out to accomplish great feats, listen carefully. You may hear the voice of the Master whispering in your ear, "Don't quit. Keep playing."

Great advice for this Lenten Season!

And I close with this food for thought...

May we not forget the infinite possibilities that are borne of faith.

May we use those gifts we have received and pass on the love given to us.

May we be content knowing we are children of God.

Let this presence settle into our bones and allow our souls the freedom to sing, dance, praise, and love.

It is there for every one of us.

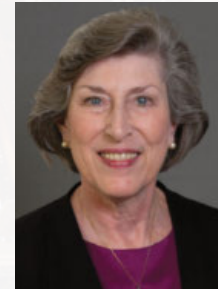

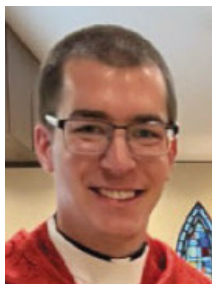

What's a Communal Penance Service & Why You Should Go

The Sacrament of Confession/Reconciliation is one of the Church's seven sacraments, and one of the two Sacraments termed as a Sacrament of Healing (the other being Anointing of the Sick). Though baptized and original sin removed from us, we tend to sin, which is called concupiscence, and our human condition is prone to fall. Confession allows us to recognize our failings and seek forgiveness from God.



The Church encourages us to go to confession at least once a year, and due to this invitation, parishes make it easy for the faithful to offer communal reconciliation services on a weeknight during Lent and Advent. A communal reconciliation service is not a group confession where everyone says their sins for everyone to hear. It is a time to come together to pray and ask for forgiveness as a community. It is an opportunity to recognize the common desire for forgiveness and the reality that we all sin and need healing.

Since every time we sin, we sin against God, our neighbor, and ourselves, a communal reconciliation service allows these three transgressions to be healed. We gather as sinners, and in this season of Lent, aware that with Christ's passion, death, and resurrection, we are forgiven of our sins and set free from the chains that bind us.

A communal reconciliation service includes a few songs, some reading from scripture based on the season we find ourselves in, an examination of conscience, and individual confession. Like any Sacrament, one is not forced to receive it, so some people may wish to attend the service but not the individual confessions. In an individual confession, you can confess your sins to a priest and receive absolution. If you do not go to individual confession at a communal reconciliation service, you do not receive absolution from your sins because you did not confess your sins to a priest.

The benefit of attending a communal penance service

is that we gather as sinners together, aware of God's mercy. We will reflect with each other through song and scripture about God's immense love and mercy that we will experience during confession. More practically, with additional priests assisting us during communal services, the wait time to see a priest is typically shorter than a Saturday morning in the lower level of the Cathedral with one priest in the confessional.

As part of our Lenten Mission, which begins tonight, Sunday, March 23, at 6:30pm, Holy Name Cathedral will have a Lenten Communal Reconciliation Service on Monday, March 24, at 6:30pm. All are welcome to join us as we sit in the quiet of this penitential season, preparing for the holiest days of our liturgical year. We will have numerous priests available for confession. Let us prepare our hearts as we journey closer to the sacred days where we recall the saving actions of Jesus by confessing our sins and basking in the glory of God's unending love and mercy. Now is the time of salvation!

Pay Tribute or Remember a Loved One with our Easter Flowers Fund

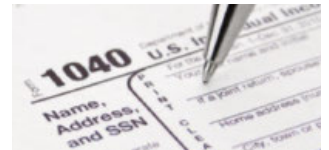

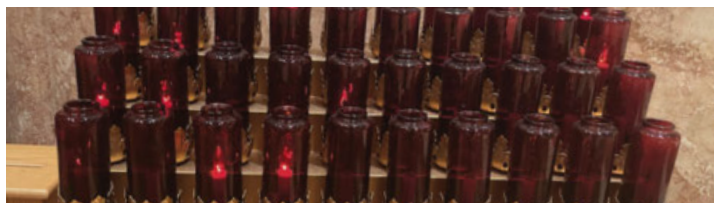


Honoring Our Loved Ones
