# Reflections from Our Rector



## Dear People of God,

Our Lenten pilgrimage continues, so let us ask ourselves:

- How am I doing?
- Is this Lent any different from previous years?

It is easy to get into a rut or slump in life. At the same time, we can tell ourselves Lent is here again – so what? All of us are sinners in need of repentance, renewal and conversion. Conversion is not a moment’s miracle but the task of a lifetime. In many ways, we are not human beings, but should be called “human becomings.” We are works of art in progress!

I am sharing a story written by Mike Buetti that was given to me some years ago. It may not be a bad idea to compose our Lenten list. It is more than half over --but like a diet, start today!

When I was a young boy, my grandma always asked me, “What do you want?” I’d give the age-appropriate answer, whether it was “candy” at age five, a “bicycle” at 12, or “not answering dumb questions” when I was 15. She always listened carefully, then asked, “What do you really want?” I hated it when she did that because it made me think, and thinking was painful. Invariably, what I wanted was different than what I’d originally asked for. Her final question was always the same: “What price are you willing to pay in order to get it?”

When I was 16, she increased the complexity of the task. She asked, “What are 20 things you should do in this lifetime?”

Each year on Thanksgiving, she made me rewrite the list, adjusting it as my maturity and wisdom grew. For 28 years, I gave her my list before I ate her turkey dinner. I was never able to give her the 29th list. She died two days before Thanksgiving. However, she would have been proud of how she helped me grow from a five-year-old who just wanted candy to this end result of 29 years of refinement.

1. To leave the world a better place by my having been there;

2. To love unconditionally;
3. To dream big dreams and be willing to pay the price to make them come true;
4. To visit the Lincoln Memorial at dawn;
5. To earn the affection of children;
6. To hike and raft the Grand Canyon;
7. To find out what I’m good at and give it back to the world;
8. To watch a sunset on a tropical isle;
9. To earn the respect of intelligent people;
10. To learn my family history and visit my homeland;
11. To drive and bike across the country;
12. To help a stranger in need;
13. To make something that is still standing when I die;
14. To play a game for more than I can afford to lose;
15. To meditate and pray daily;
16. To do something others said was impossible;
17. To walk beaches under a full moon at midnight;
18. To take a stand on something and not back down under pressure;
19. To never lose childlike enthusiasm;
20. To swim under waterfalls.

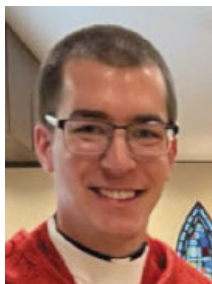

# Scrutinizing the Scrutinies: What is a Scrutiny Liturgy?

**A**s we continue in this season of Lent, our liturgy offers us a unique look into the preparation of the elect – those who the Cardinal will baptize, confirm, and give their First Communion at the Great Vigil of Easter on Holy Saturday. The period of purification and enlightenment begins after the Rite of Election, which was celebrated here at the Cathedral on the first two Sundays in Lent, where the catechumens become ‘the elect.’



Within the season of Lent, the Scrutinies are celebrated. “The Scrutinies are ordered toward liberation from sin and the Devil, and they give strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth, and the life of the elect” (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults, #141). The Scrutinies then are ways for deeper reflection on what will take place in the life of those who will enter the Pascal Mystery on Holy Saturday, and a reminder for us who are baptized, how we are dead to sin, but alive in Christ, because of our Baptism. Within this period are two types of rituals: Scrutinies and the rites of handing on.

Very briefly, there are two rites of handing on. Handing on of the Creed, and the Handing on of the Lord’s prayer. These simple rituals can be done in a small setting or within the Sunday Liturgy. The Scrutinies, however, must occur during Mass for three consecutive Sundays, beginning on the Third Sunday of Lent and concluding on the Fifth Sunday of Lent. The Scrutinies have their own proper readings and prayers for Mass (collect prayer, intercessions, prayer over the offerings, preface, Eucharistic prayer additions, and prayer after Communion), along with a minor exorcism and laying on of hands for each of the elect and then their dismissal before the offertory rite begins.

The Gospels for the Scrutinies: The Samaritan Woman at the Well, the Man Born Blind, and the Rising of Lazarus

have a deeper spiritual meaning than just long Gospel passages. They are used to show that Christ is the living water, the world’s light, and the resurrection and the life, allowing the elect to “grow in the awareness of sin and the desire for salvation” (cf. OCIA #143). Every ritual we have in the Church has power in our lives of faith and draws us deeper into an encounter with Jesus of Nazareth, whom we profess and believe has indeed risen from the dead and desires a relationship with us.

Depending on what Mass you attended last week, this week, and next week, the Gospel reading may have been or will be different. This weekend, the Scrutiny will occur at 12:30pm Mass on Sunday, and next weekend, it will happen at the Sunday 5:15pm Mass. I encourage you to attend if you have never seen a Scrutiny liturgy before, as the Scrutinies, though celebrated for the elect of our parish, can also affect us as well.

The journey of conversion and renewal for the elect during this period of purification and enlightenment is also a reminder for us who have already been baptized and participated in the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ of this great mystery. It is an opportunity to call us who have been baptized, out of our routine of Lent and remember who Jesus is to us as well. In these final weeks before their initiation, let us pray for the elect as they make their way closer and closer to the font of new life and for us as we prepare to renew our baptismal promises on Easter morning in the light of the Risen Lord.

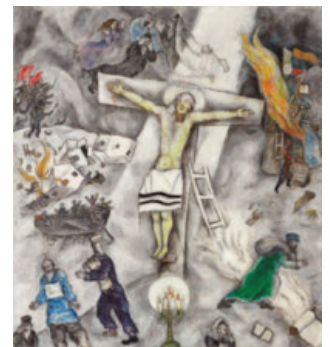

It’s truly a privilege to see the Holy Spirit working in their lives.
