Reflections from Our Rector



Dear People of God,

In Holy Week, we celebrate the most sacred mysteries of our Christian faith when we gather to remember Christ's dying, through which he destroyed our death, and His rising, through which he restored our life. The mysteries we

celebrate during these days are not only

something long ago, something far away, but are as close as our own and our world's struggle with living and dying.

To deepen our experience of life together and celebrate Christ's dying and rising to new life, we need to gather to tell the stories of God and to break bread together. We must celebrate together, be at peace with one another, and give thanks as people who continually grow in faith.

The liturgies of Holy Week invite us to ponder the meaning of Christ's life, death, and resurrection. I

encourage you – yes, I urge you – to be present at the celebrative moments in the life of the Christian Faith Community, for it is when we gather that we are most truly Church – the People of God.

Our complete Holy Week schedule appears in this week's bulletin on Page 4. Holy Week provides an opportunity and a window to put life in perspective. Take time this Holy Week to connect the pieces of our lives with the Paschal mystery – the Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. Allow the Lord Jesus to heal those parts of our lives that ache for fullness, healing, new life, and a deep trust in God. The following story is powerful ... and pass it on ...

Project Humility

A group of high school students were assigned to do a service project at a community outreach center. The center was located in a neighborhood several miles away from their school.

When they arrived for their orientation, they encountered a homeless man asleep on the sidewalk in front of the center in an old rundown building. The students snickered and made cruel jokes about the man, the building, and the neighborhood.

When they entered the center, there was a note at the front desk: "Back in 10 minutes. Have a seat."

The students took seats in the waiting area. A few minutes later, the homeless man wandered into the center. The students smirked as he fixed himself a cup of coffee. But their whispers turned to stunned silence when the homeless man removed his shabby overcoat. Despite the worn sneakers he wore, the students recognized immediately that this was not a vagrant.

"Welcome. I'm Tom Gallagher, the director of the center."

The students realized that Mr. Gallagher had heard every one of their vicious jokes. They just sank into their chairs, never more embarrassed in their lives.

"Let this be your first lesson in community service," Mr. Gallagher said quietly. "You can't truly reach out to people if you judge them or make fun of them. A person's appearance has little to do with character. We are all human beings who will need the help of one another at some point in our lives."

It will decide what will get you out of bed in the morning, what you do with your evenings, how you spend your weekend, what you read, who you know, what breaks your heart, and what amazes you with joy and gratitude. Fall in love, stay in love, and it will decide everything."

Please take the time to put life in perspective this Holy Week. Fall in love with God. Make the time to journey to the Cross with Christ and together may we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus – from death to eternal life. Jesus promises each one of us love, forgiveness, and eternal life. If you get a better offer – take it!

Catholic Illuminations

Welcome to Holy Week! Prepare for Easter at Holy Name

We enter into a sacred time this week. Holy Week is very symbolic in our life of faith. We enter Jerusalem with crowds waving palms as Jesus enters the Holy City. On Tuesday, the priests and parish representatives of the Archdiocese gather for the Chrism Mass when the priests renew their priestly promises, and Cardinal Cupich blesses the three oils — Sacred Chrism, Oil of the Sick, and Oil of the Catechumens. These oils will be distributed throughout the Archdiocese for sacramental use until next year's Holy Week. Thursday begins the Sacred Triduum, the three holiest days of the year, commemorating the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus of Nazareth.



The Triduum lasts three days, with each day having a distinct character to itself on this continuous journey. We begin in the Upper Room on Holy Thursday evening with the celebration of the Lord's Supper. Each church celebrates only one Mass on this day.

The Mass does not end with the final blessing but moves to the altar of repose, a representation of Christ in the garden and imprisoned awaiting trial. We watch and pray with our Lord as he awaits his condemnation by Pilate.

Our Cathedral will be open until Midnight on Holy Thursday to allow many people to come and spend time in prayer. Good Friday is the only day in the entire year that we do not celebrate Holy Mass. The Service of the Lord's Passion is simply that, a service. The Eucharist offered during the service was consecrated at Mass on Holy Thursday. The Good Friday service does not begin with the sign of the cross because it is a continuation of the liturgy on Holy Thursday, nor does it end with a final blessing, but in silence because God has died in the flesh.

On Holy Saturday, just like Holy Thursday, there is only one Mass celebrated in each church: the Great Vigil of

Easter. This Mass also does not begin with the sign of the cross. Instead, we start outside the church with the blessing of the fire to light the newly blessed Easter candle. Only at the end of the Easter Vigil does the priest celebrant give a final blessing, concluding the three holy days, with the joy of "Go, and announce the Gospel of the Lord."

One service often overlooked is Tenebrae. Our Tenebrae service will be held at the Cathedral on Wednesday, April 16, at 7:00pm. Tenebrae is a religious service that uses psalms and light as a tangible preparation for the Triduum. We extinguish a candle with each psalm or reading, and the light dims until the final candle in the darkened church is taken away, only to return after the great strepitus or earthquake. The Christ candle shows us that even death cannot extinguish the light.

Additionally, today on Palm Sunday, we will pray the Stations of the Cross at 3:00pm and offer a Holy Hour of Eucharistic Adoration from 3:30 to 4:30pm, to spiritually prepare ourselves for these sacred days.

As we enter Holy Week, the Worship Council invites you to join us during these sacred days to deepen your encounter with the Lord and with others, as we walk with him through his passion, death, and to his resurrection.

This Holy Week, May We Thirst for Holiness and Grace

Padre, más, más, padre.”
But I already sprinkled you
with holy water!



Still, the voice persisted – “Padre, más, más!” until I finally gave up and generously showered the faithful a few more times. As I reflected on this longing for holy water, I realized something profound: the people desired not just cool relief from the scorching heat of Piura, Peru, but the grace of God itself. Their thirst was not only physical; it was spiritual. And they made it known. It made me wonder – do we long for holiness with the same intensity?

In a world obsessed with power, wealth, and honor, have we considered the crisis of holiness? St. Augustine once said, “You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in you.” This Palm Sunday, we are invited to enter the holiest week of the year, not with explanations but with hearts open to God’s grace.

Before blessing the palms, the Church prays, asking God to help us enter this sacred time with joy, reflecting on His mighty works that have granted us life and

immortality. Holy Week isn’t about seeking easy answers or perfectly packaged explanations. It’s about embracing the mystery – God’s boundless love poured out for us, a life given so we might be redeemed. We can study, analyze, and reflect all we want, but at its heart, Holy Week calls for something deeper – an encounter. The Church, in her wisdom, doesn’t just ask us to remember these events; she invites us to walk through them. I pray that we do not just wave palms from the sidelines but take part fully; we don’t just stand at the foot of the Cross as distant spectators but as those whose very lives depend on Christ’s sacrifice. Again, dear friends, the Passion is not just another story – it is the story, the one that gives meaning to all others. And now, we must ask ourselves: how will we respond? Will we walk with Christ through suffering and death and into the glory of the resurrection? There is no alternative, no shortcut. As Jesus reminds us, “If anyone wishes to come after me, let him deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me” (Matthew 16:24).

This week let’s not just observe Holy Week. Let’s live it. Let’s thirst for grace like those faithful in Peru, and let’s open our hearts to receive it abundantly as we journey with Christ toward Easter morning. I love being a priest. JMJ.

It is truly remarkable that for 150 years, Catholics in River North, Gold Coast, and Streeterville have called Holy Name their parish church. This Cathedral, a beacon of faith, has been a spiritual home for Catholics throughout the Archdiocese, state, nation, and world. But, as we all know, time takes its toll. In 2008, a piece of our ceiling fell, prompting the closure of the Cathedral for structural checks. Then, in February 2009, an electrical fire in the ceiling was averted by the heroic efforts of our Chicago firefighters. These incidents serve as a stark reminder that we must act now to secure the future of our Cathedral for the next 150 years.

Our current lighting system, while once adequate, is now struggling to meet the demands of our daily Masses. The hardware

shows wear and tear, and parts are no longer available, so it's time to upgrade. A new lighting system is not just a necessity, it's a game-changer. It will transform our worship space, enhancing the spiritual experience for generations to come. Your support is crucial in making this transformation a reality.

As we seek to raise the required \$1.7 million for the lighting project, we are reminded of our shared responsibility towards our Cathedral. The generosity of many does not go unnoticed. The lights are needed as we move further into this new millennium and gather to worship daily and give glory to His Holy Name.
