An Appeal: Please Help the Diocese in Kabgayi, Rwanda

Second Collection During All Masses on July 5 & 6

Dear Sisters and Brothers.

I'm Bishop Balthazar Ntivuguruzwa from the Catholic diocese of Kabgayi, in Rwanda, Africa. My Diocese is one of nine Catholic Dioceses in Rwanda. It is situated in the central region of Rwanda. I thank the office of the Propagation of Faith in the Archdiocese and Very Reverend Gregory Sakowicz for inviting me to



share with you the missionary work of my diocese.

When I became Bishop two years ago, I noticed that most of our laity are not trained and equipped to do their ministry. Yet, the Catholic Church in Rwanda remains a vital source of healing, unity, and hope for a people who have endured consequences of the 1994 genocide. Our diocese is facing the challenge of emerging sects, the need for a new evangelization, and the urgent need for spiritual and faith formation — especially among lay leaders who lead our communities, and the youth — who seek meaning, guidance, and a deeper relationship with God.

We started a school of faith last year to provide ongoing formation to lay leaders so they can more effectively teach the Gospel, support parish life, promote peace and reconciliation, and bring Christ's message of love and hope to the most remote villages. It's a one-year program consisting of 16 weekends (from Friday evening to Sunday noon), spread out between October and June.

We are appealing to you to help us train our lay leaders. Each parish will appoint two laypeople who will then train others in their respective parishes. Your financial support will go toward providing meals and accommodation for trainees.

We will begin to train 62 leaders from 31 parishes. The cost will only be \$30 for meals and accommodation for one person per weekend. We would need \$30,000 to feed and accommodate 62 lay people for 16 weekends. The diocese will oversee transportation and training expenses. Thank you so much for allowing me to share our joys and hopes with you. Your kindness, your prayers, and your generosity truly make a difference.

Sts. Peter and Paul: The Inseparable Pair of the Church

■ ach year on June 29, we celebrate one of the few solemnities of our faith that does not deal with an event in the life of our Lord. We honor and venerate the memory of St. Peter and St. Paul. Peter, the first Pope, and brother to Andrew the Apostle, was Martyred in Rome on Vatican Hill, upside down a



cross, feeling unworthy of dying in the same way Jesus Christ died. Paul, who began persecuting the Church but had a religious experience on the way to Damascus, then traveled the known world preaching the Gospel to Jews and Gentiles alike. Much of our New Testament bears his authorship for letters to those various communities. Paul was martyred by the sword in Rome. Both of these saints are buried in Rome: their skulls are above the main altar in St. John Lateran - the Cathedral of the Diocese of Rome, and their bodies are under the main altar in their respective Papal Basilica, which bears their names.

We celebrate Peter and Paul together because, without these two heroic witnesses, the Church may not have been formed as we know it. Peter was given the keys to the kingdom and is the rock upon which the Church is built (Matthew 16:18). Paul went to the world and proclaimed Christ crucified (1 Cor 1:23). Both saints, each in their way, tried to run from the call of Christ — Peter by denying Jesus on the night of his passion, Paul by persecuting the early Christians. But both saints have been redeemed in their relationship with the Risen Christ and show us we can be forgiven, renewed, and sent like them.

This solemnity is celebrated instead of the 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time since June 29 falls on a Sunday. The season of Ordinary Time is very linear; each week is numbered as we build up to the final solemnity of the year — the Solemnity of Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Our Gospel reading for each Sunday is generally a succession of the previous week's chapter and/or verse.

Because Ordinary Time is, in a sense, ordinary, certain solemnities supersede Sunday, given their significance in the life of the Church. The Solemnity of Peter and Paul is one of these solemnities. In September, The Exaltation of the Holy Cross will also fall on a Sunday, and we will celebrate that solemnity instead of the 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time.

This solemnity is so essential to our faith life that Pope Benedict XVI once said, "Christian tradition has always considered Saints Peter and Saint Paul to be inseparable; indeed, together, they represent the whole Gospel of Christ." As we prepare to mark the Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul, two central figures in the early Church and pillars of our faith tradition, let us look to them as guides on our path as disciples, that we are never too far from reconciliation with the Lord for denying him or running from him, or too far from encountering his risen presence in our day-to-day life. As they did, let us continue dedicating our lives to sharing the Good News of the Gospel with all people and proclaiming with faith and iov that Jesus Christ has risen from the dead.


