



'Preaching for the Encounter' My Update on Homiletics

ne of the last things on the minds of our younger church members and one of the first things on the minds of parents is the start of the school year in August or early September. Summer vacation is a time for rest and travel, trying new things, and spending time with friends and family at outdoor events.



In the life of a priest, though our ministry is year-round, we too enjoy the slower days of summer. However, at the same time, we are always in the classroom of life, and sometimes we attend class, even in the summer.

As I mentioned last year, I am participating in a homiletics program through the University of Dallas, focusing on Preaching for Encounter. Homiletics, the art of preaching, studies both the composition and the delivery of religious discourses. The program is designed to help preachers develop tools and methods so that those in the pews take away something from the homily that they can connect to and see God in their lives. Overall, the program focuses on helping everyone encounter the love of God through the proclaimed scriptures and share that reality with others.

This past week, I returned to the seminary for a three-day summer workshop in the preaching program, alongside approximately 60 other priests and deacons from six other dioceses. Nine of the priests are from Chicago, who get together once a month as a cohort to listen to each other's homilies and provide feedback. I enjoy these meetings because we share what we are doing in our parishes, provide input based on our own ministry experiences, and can see the growth in each other. The three-day workshop enabled us to reconnect with other priests and deacons from various parts of the country and collaborate on enhancing our preaching skills, so that those we minister to know they are loved and that God is at work in their lives. It also shows us that we are not alone in our desire to improve ourselves, so the people of

God can benefit from our work.

Having been part of this program for the past year, with another eight months to go, I can personally see the impact it has had on me, both as a disciple and as a preacher. We believe as Christians that the Word of God is living and effective and meant to penetrate our hearts (Hebrews 4:12). So far, the program has focused on preaching the Paschal Mystery, preaching as a spiritual and pastoral practice, and connecting the Word of God to everyday experiences to allow the faithful to know that God encounters them. Due to this encounter, we are encouraged to go forth on mission as joyful disciples and share the Good News with others.


As I continue to "go back to the classroom" for homiletics, I am always open to constructive feedback and ways to improve how I convey the message of God to you in the pews. I appreciate your patience with me as I learn new tactics and approaches, and a lens through which to preach and view scripture. Whenever I preach, I always remind myself, "The first person you preach to is yourself." Because if I do not believe what I am saying, how do I expect others to? Preaching the Good News is the call of a disciple, and I am humbled that I can do it here, under His Holv Name.

About the Academy of St. Benedict the African

- Enrollment of 216 students in June; aiming for 234 students this Fall
- ₱ 100% of 8th grade ASBA students who applied to a Catholic high school were accepted.
- 5 students were accepted into a Selective Enrollment High School, with a 6th student accepted into the very competitive Kenwood Magnet Honor Program
- In academic school year 24/25, the students achieved 171% of Reading growth on average, and in Math, exceeded iReady recommendations with 126% of typical growth
- Every single grade 1st through 8th exceeded national benchmarks
- The Middle School students achieved an outstanding 289% of typical growth in Reading and 137% in Math
- The school's growth rates in Reading and Math have consistently exceeded iReady expectations AND Archdiocese averages every year since 2021.
