Reflections from Our Rector ____



Dear People of God,

July will give way to August later this week. Summer is flying! Where does the Lord Jesus fit in our constant struggle to balance work and rest, not only during the summer, but all year round?

Wayne Muller wrote a book entitled

"Sabbath: Finding Rest, Renewal and Delight in Our Busy Lives." It is one of the finest books I have read in the last five years. He opens the book with this insight: "In the relentless busyness of modern life, we have lost the rhythm between work and rest ... Our culture invariably supposes that action and accomplishment are preferable to rest, that doing something — anything — is better than doing nothing. Because of our desire to succeed, to meet these ever-growing expectations, we do not rest. Because we do not rest, we lose our way... Even when our intentions are noble and our efforts sincere — even when we dedicate our lives to the service of others."

We all make choices. We all want the very best for our families. However, we need to keep a balance and perspective between work and rest. Muller continues: "Like a path through the forest, Sabbath creates a marker for ourselves so, if we are lost, we can find our way back to our center. "Remember the Sabbath" means "Remember that everything you have received is a blessing. Remember to delight in your life, in the fruits of your labor. Remember to stop and offer thanks for the wonder of it."

Rest puts life into perspective. ...keep reading!

Don't We All?

"I was parked waiting for my wife to get out of work. Coming my way from across the parking lot was a man. From the looks of him, he had no car, no home, no clean clothes and no money. There are times when you feel generous, but other times when you don't want to be bothered. This was one of those 'don't want to be bothered times.' 'I hope he doesn't ask me for any money.' I thought. He didn't.

He came and sat on the curb in front of the bus stop, but he didn't appear to have enough money even to ride the bus. After a few minutes, he spoke. "That's a very pretty car," he said. He was ragged, but he had an air of dignity around him. His scraggly blond beard kept more than his face warm. I said, 'Thanks,' and continued wiping my car. He sat there quietly as I worked. The expected plea for money never came. As the silence between us widened, something inside said, 'Ask him if he needs any help.' I was sure that he would say 'yes', but I held true to the inner voice. 'Do you need any help?' I asked. He answered in three simple but profound words that I shall never forget.

We often look to great men and women for wisdom. We expect it from those who have achieved higher learning and accomplishments. I expected nothing but an outstretched, grimy hand. He spoke the three words that shook me. 'Don't we all?' he said. I was feeling high and mighty, successful and important, until those three words hit me....'Don't we all?' I needed help. Maybe not for bus fare or a place to sleep, but I needed help. I reached into my wallet and gave him not only enough for bus fare, but enough to get a warm meal and shelter for the day.

Those three little words still ring true. No matter how much you have, no matter how much you have accomplished, you need help too. No matter how little you have, no matter how many problems you're burdened with, even without money or a place to sleep, you can still offer help. Even if it's just a compliment, you can give that. You never know when you may see someone who appears to have it all. They are waiting on you to provide them with what they don't have. A different perspective on life, a glimpse at something beautiful, a respite from daily chaos, that only you through a torn world can see.

Maybe he was more than that. Maybe he was sent by a power that is great and wise, to minister to a soul too comfortable in itself. Maybe God looked down, called an Angel, dressed him like a homeless person, then said, 'Go minister to that man cleaning the car, that man needs help.' Don't we all?"




Sculpture of Sacred Heart of Jesus Coming Friday!



From this encounter, send us out on mission, a mission of compassion for the world in which you are the source from which all consolation flows.

Amen.

May these reflections and prayer be a part of your summer days as quiet companions as we prepare to welcome this new sculpture.

God's Love for Us is Manifested in Sacred Heart of Jesus

s Catholics, we are a sensory people and use our senses in worship. One of the most used senses is our sight. We are a visual people. Our churches continuously point us to see the invisible. Through stations of the cross and stainedglass windows, through paintings and statues, we see more profound



truths about our faith. And no, we do not worship statues. Statues and paintings bring to life the reality of our past, reminding us that saints exist and that Jesus became man, walking among us.

On Friday, Aug. 1, the Cathedral will unveil and dedicate a new statue of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, created by retired Chicago priest and artist, Fr. Anthony Brankin. Although devotion to the Sacred Heart dates back to the Middle Ages, the formal devotion known as First Fridays and the Promises of the Sacred Heart originated with St. Margaret Mary Alacoque.

Sister Margaret Mary was a Visitation Nun in France, born in 1647 and died in 1690. She began experiencing visions of Jesus revealing his Sacred Heart in December 1673, which concluded in June 1675. Among these revelations, she shared with her spiritual director. St. Claude La Colombière, who was a French Jesuit and the confessor for her community.

I have a deep personal devotion to the Sacred Heart because it is a tangible representation of God's love for us. That He became man, who needed air to breathe and a heart to pump blood in his body, to show us how to love and serve. Images of the Sacred Heart, which I have previously written about, depict the heart enflamed, symbolizing a desire for a personal relationship with each of us. Pope Francis wrote about the Sacred Heart of Jesus in his final encyclical, Dilexit Nos, meaning 'He loved us.' He says, "The heart of Christ, as the symbol of the deepest and most personal source of his love for us,

is the very core of the initial preaching of the Gospel" (par. 32). The Sacred Heart is the manifestation of the love God has for us, in that his heart beats in desire to know us, to love us and to be in relationship with us, which is what moves us forward to share the Gospel with others.

The new statue, which will be placed in the northwest corner of the Cathedral, where a Blessed Mother statue once stood, will foster an encounter with all who pass through our doors. Jesus, sitting on a bench, offers us his heart and his love. The statue conveys a tangible sense of the desire Christ has for us, as we look into his eyes, see his heart, and are drawn into union with him. His heart is a reminder of what the Gospel teaches us, that God is love, and seeks to know us individually and personally.

We encourage everyone to join us for the unveiling and dedication of this new statue of the Sacred Heart on Friday, Aug. 1, at the 12:00pm Mass. Fr. Brankin will be the main celebrant and homilist. Let us come together as saints and sinners, aware of the love God has for us, and look into His eternal gaze, receiving that love, and sharing it with others.


Tours After 8:30, 10:30 Masses

About the Academy of St. Benedict the African

- Enrollment of 216 students in June; aiming for 234 students this Fall
- ₱ 100% of 8th grade ASBA students who applied to a Catholic high school were accepted.
- 5 students were accepted into a Selective Enrollment High School, with a 6th student accepted into the very competitive Kenwood Magnet Honor Program
- In academic school year 24/25, the students achieved 171% of Reading growth on average, and in Math, exceeded iReady recommendations with 126% of typical growth
- Every single grade 1st through 8th exceeded national benchmarks
- The Middle School students achieved an outstanding 289% of typical growth in Reading and 137% in Math
- The school's growth rates in Reading and Math have consistently exceeded iReady expectations AND Archdiocese averages every year since 2021.




