

Reflections from Our Rector_



Dear People of God,

How many times in life have we said to someone: "Don't you see my point? Are you blind or something?" Maybe we have sarcastically remarked: "Were you born with tunnel vision or was this a later development?" Many times, we see or hear only what we want.

However, life is very much like a parachute – it is only good when opened!

The following story beautifully connects the need to "see" and opens life on a deeper level. Allow the Lord Jesus -Trust in the Lord - to walk more closely with you and "see" and be "opened" to the possibilities.

My Son

A wealthy man and his son loved to collect rare works of art. They had everything in their collection, from Picasso to Raphael. They would often sit together and admire the great works of art.

When the Vietnam conflict broke out, the son went to war. He was very courageous and died in battle while rescuing another soldier. The father was notified and grieved deeply for his only son. About a month later, just before Christmas, there was a knock at the door.

A young man stood at the door with a large package in his hands. He said, "Sir, you don't know me, but I am the soldier for whom your son gave his life. He saved many lives that day, and he was carrying me to safety when a bullet struck him in the heart, and he died instantly. He often talked about you and your love for art." The young man held out the package. "I know this isn't much. I'm not a great artist, but I think your son would have wanted you to have this."

The father opened the package. It was a portrait of his son, painted by the young man. He stared in awe at the way the soldier had captured the personality of his son in the painting. The father was so drawn to the eyes that his own eyes welled up with tears. He thanked the young man and offered to pay him for the picture. "Oh, no, sir. I could never repay what your son did for me. It's a gift."

The father hung the portrait over his mantle. Every time visitors came to his home, he took them to see the portrait of his son before he showed them any of the other great works he had collected. The man died a few months later. There was to be a great auction of his paintings. Many influential people gathered, excited to see the great paintings and to have an opportunity to purchase one for their collection.

On the platform sat the painting of the son. The auctioneer pounded his gavel. "We will start the bidding with this picture of his son. Who will bid for this picture?" There was silence.

Then a voice in the back of the room shouted. "We want to see the famous paintings. Skip this one."

But the auctioneer persisted. "Will somebody bid for this painting? Who will start the bidding? \$100? \$200?"

Another voice angrily said, "We didn't come to see this painting. We came to see the Van Goghs, the Rembrandts. Get on with the real bids!" But still, the auctioneer continued. "The son! The son! Who will take the son?"

Finally, a voice came from the very back of the room. It was the longtime gardener of the wealthy man and his son. "I'll give you \$10...who will bid \$20?" The crowd was becoming angry. They didn't want the picture of the son. They wanted the more worthy investments for their collections.

The auctioneer pounded the gavel. "Going once, going twice. SOLD for \$10!" A man in the second row shouted, "Now let's get on with the collection!" The auctioneer laid down his gavel. "I'm sorry, the auction is over."

"What about the paintings?" someone called out.

"I am sorry. When I asked to conduct this auction, there was a secret stipulation in the will. I was not allowed to reveal that stipulation until this time, that only the painting of the son would be auctioned. Whoever bought that painting would inherit the entire estate, including the paintings. The man who bought the portrait of the son gets everything!"

You see, whoever takes the Son - the Lord Jesus - gets everything. And the best gifts of life are not always packaged in the way we had hoped, planned or expected. And, by the way, take the time this summer and be open to the colors and "see" the season!



Catholic Illuminations

Remember St. John Vianney, the Patron Saint of Priests

ach of us has a patron saint. And the beauty of the communion of saints is that there is a saint for almost every need under heaven. A patron for people and occupations such as parents and grandparents, nurses, teachers, and first responders. There is a patron for various needs, including those looking for a job, those



with multiple diseases, and those seeking companionship or some specific item in their life. The communion of saints that we profess in our creed reminds us that we do not walk alone on this journey. For priests, as we minister to the people of God, we also have a patron, whose feast we celebrate tomorrow — St. John Vianney, the Cure of Ars.

St. John Vianney had a simple upbringing, born in France in 1786. His education was interrupted numerous times due to the Napoleonic Wars and the draft the dictator put in place to enlist more soldiers. Vianney never fought because he got separated from his group and lived in the forest for 14 months, but he never lost his vocation to the priesthood, which was formed as he witnessed priests saying Mass "on the run" during the anticlerical French Revolution in the 1790s.

With Vianney's low-grade education, his seminary formators said he was not suitable to be a priest. However, persuaded by his priest mentor, the seminary allowed Vianney to move forward to Ordination due to his piety and devotional life. He was ordained to the priesthood in 1815, at the age of 29, and in 1818, sent to Ars, France, where he stayed until his death in 1859. Parish priests respect Vianney for the 12 to 16 hours he spent in the confessional daily, for his celebration of the Sacraments, and the thousands who sought his counsel annually.

So, why is Vianney well-known among priests, other than being the patron saint of parish priests? Because his story shows the humanity of the man whom Jesus called to serve his people. He was not the most intelligent person, was not well educated, and yet he still ministered.

As priests, each of us has shortcomings and talents, strengths, and areas of improvement. People did not criticize Vianney for his lack of education, because he pointed them to Jesus through his ministry.


Priests are human too. We make mistakes, we have emotions and feelings. The life we live may appear simple and easy. But a well-lived priesthood is not; it is difficult, it is at times painful, because it is a life of sacrifice as we put aside our wants and desires to serve God's people. We get criticized for saying this or doing that, and sometimes that hurts. Sometimes we have a long day of trying to bring God's love to those we meet, and we are told by some, "Be better." St. John Vianney teaches priests and the faithful that Jesus qualifies the called; he does not call the qualified.

Every saint has a different path to canonization. Some are well known to the world, centuries after their death, while others remain hidden for years until God's time is right for their story to be known. What is common to them all is their humanity. Nobody is perfect, but with God's grace, we all move forward knowing that by our baptism, we are called to life with God in heaven for eternity, joining our voices of praise with those countless people who have gone before us, striving for sanctity. As we remember John Vianney, please pray for us who minister here at the Cathedral, and if you are visiting, pray for your parish priest, that they may lead you to Jesus and allow you to find strength in your journey to heaven.

Church historian Edward Gordon will explore both the past context of these issues and what the Church leadership faces today.



About the Academy of St. Benedict the African

- Enrollment of 216 students in June; aiming for 234 students this Fall
- ₱ 100% of 8th grade ASBA students who applied to a Catholic high school were accepted.
- 5 students were accepted into a Selective Enrollment High School, with a 6th student accepted into the very competitive Kenwood Magnet Honor Program
- In academic school year 24/25, the students achieved 171% of Reading growth on average, and in Math, exceeded iReady recommendations with 126% of typical growth
- Every single grade 1st through 8th exceeded national benchmarks
- The Middle School students achieved an outstanding 289% of typical growth in Reading and 137% in Math
- The school's growth rates in Reading and Math have consistently exceeded iReady expectations AND Archdiocese averages every year since 2021.






