Reflections from Our Rector



Dear People of God,

We take so much for granted — our health, family, friends, and even our relationship with the Lord Jesus. Often, we say “nothing changes,” but life and everything around us is always changing. Did you realize the only person who truly welcomes change is

a wet baby? Ironically, we are creatures of habit and get caught in daily routines — especially taking loved ones for granted.

Life and relationships are special gifts from God that take nurturing and care. Do we take loved ones for granted? Do we tell those we love that we do love them? Remember, live each day as though it were your last because one day you'll be right.

Reflect upon the following story ... and pass it on.

One day, a teacher asked her students to list the names of the other students in the room on two sheets of paper, leaving space between each name. Then she told them to think of the nicest thing they could say about each of their classmates and write it down.

It took the remainder of the class period to finish their assignment, and as the students left the room, each one handed in the papers.

That Saturday, the teacher wrote down the names of each student on a separate sheet of paper and listed what everyone else had said about that individual.

On Monday, she gave each student their list. Before long, the entire class was smiling. “Really?” she heard whispered. “I never knew that I meant anything to anyone!” and “I didn’t know others liked me so much” were most of the comments.

No one ever mentioned those papers in class again. The teacher never knew if they discussed them after class or with their parents, but it didn’t matter. The exercise had accomplished its purpose. The students were happy with themselves and one another. Eventually, this group of students moved on.

Several years later, one of the students was killed in Vietnam, and his teacher attended the funeral of that special student.

His friends packed the church. One by one, those who loved him took a last walk by the coffin. The teacher was the last one to bless the coffin.

As she stood there, one of the soldiers who acted as a pallbearer came up to her. “Were you Mark’s math teacher?” he asked. She nodded. “Yes.” Then he said, “Mark talked about you a lot.”

After the funeral, most of Mark’s former classmates went together to a luncheon. Mark’s parents were there, clearly wanting to speak with his teacher.

“We want to show you something,” his father said, taking a wallet out of his pocket. “They found this on Mark when he was killed. We thought you might recognize it.”

Opening the billfold, he carefully removed two worn pieces of notebook paper taped together, folded and refolded many times. The teacher knew without looking that the papers were the ones on which she had listed all the good things each of Mark’s classmates had said about him.

“Thank you so much for doing that,” Mark’s mother said. “As you can see, Mark treasured it.”

All of Mark’s former classmates started to gather around. Charlie smiled rather sheepishly and said, “I still have my list. It’s in the top drawer of my desk at home.”

Chuck’s wife said, “Chuck asked me to put his in our wedding album.”

“I have mine too,” Marilyn said. “It’s in my diary.”

Then Vicki, another classmate, reached into her pocketbook, took out her wallet, and showed her worn and frazzled list to the group. “I carry this with me at all times,” Vicki said, and without batting an eyelash, she continued: “I think we all saved our lists.”

That’s when the teacher finally sat down and cried. She cried for Mark and for all his friends who would never see him again.

So please, tell the people you love and care for that they are special and important. Tell them, before it is too late. And remember, a kind word or act to another person can last a lifetime!

Sacred Heart of Jesus: 'How We Come to Know God's Love for Us'

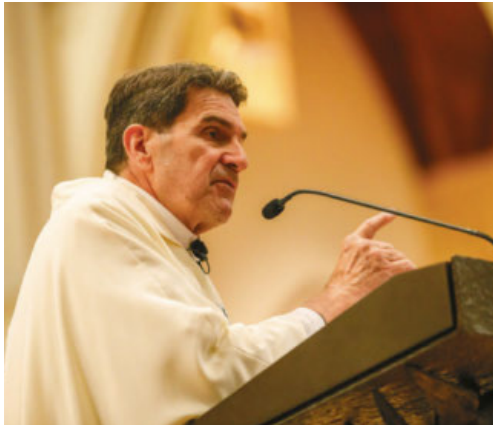

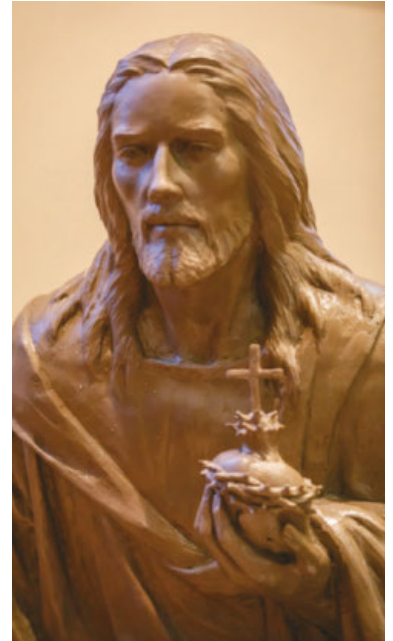

What Ever Happened to the Statue of the Blessed Mother?

On Friday, Aug. 1, we dedicated our new statue of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, crafted by retired Chicago priest Fr. Tony Brankin, and a gift of Dr. Christine Lawless in honor of her parents. The statue is in the northwestern corner of the Cathedral, and in the place where the Blessed Mother once stood.



Our Blessed Mother statue has been given to the Archdiocese for them to provide to a parish or school that needs a statue. You may be wondering, why? In accord with proper liturgical norms, “It is particularly desirable that...an image of Mary, the Mother of God, as a fitting tribute to her unique role in the plan of salvation” (Built of Living Stones) be in the church. The original statue of the Blessed Mother, made in 1874 for the dedication of Holy Name Cathedral in 1875, is prominently displayed in the Sanctuary, on the right side.

When we were gifted the new Sacred Heart of Jesus statue, we needed to find a suitable place for it in the Cathedral. Since we have the beautiful statue in the Sanctuary, it did not make sense to have two Blessed Mother statues, and we did not want to return our second statue to a previous location. Before my assignment to the Cathedral in 2021, the second statue (the one donated to the Archdiocese) was downstairs in a corner by the bathrooms, a place not suitable for prayer or to honor the Blessed Mother.

There is also an unofficial custom of touching the statues during prayer. Though it is allowed in the popular piety of the Church, we ask, for security and safety reasons, that you do not enter the Sanctuary to touch the statue of the Blessed Mother. It is notable that in Europe, most statues are not allowed to be touched out of respect for their historical significance. Should you feel the need to touch the Blessed Mother, we have a statue of her in the Courtyard that is accessible for the faithful. We ask you to be cautious if you do so to avoid damaging her hands or feet.

The removal of the statue of the Blessed Mother reminds us also of a feast we celebrate this week. In 1950, Venerable Pope Pius XII declared the doctrine on the Assumption of Mary, the Blessed Mother. The Holy Father said, “By the authority of our Lord Jesus Christ, of the Blessed Apostles Peter and Paul, and by our authority, we pronounce, declare, and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma: that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory.”

Since this proclamation, the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary has been celebrated on Aug. 15 and is a Holy Day of Obligation. We celebrate Mary completing her earthly journey and being assumed, body and soul, into heaven, the reality promised to each of us in baptism, on the Last Day. **As this is a Holy Day, Masses will be offered on Thursday, Aug. 14, at 5:15pm for the Vigil of the Assumption, and Friday, Aug. 15, at 7:00am, 8:00am, 12:00pm, and 5:15pm.**

As we complete the transition of the Blessed Mother statue to our beautiful new Sacred Heart of Jesus statue, let us remember that, just as she was assumed into heaven, she continues to pray for us from above. Please join us as we glorify God for his goodness and honor the Blessed Mother on this sacred day.

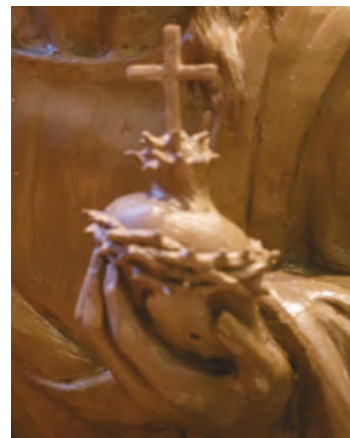

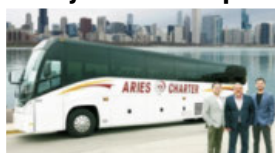

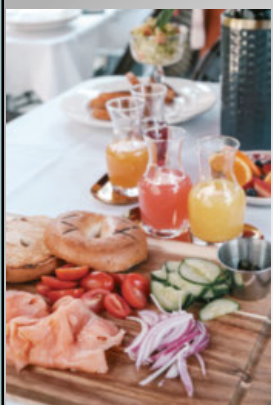
