


inspiration. In his reflection, we will explore some of the history of the devotion, its foundations in our traditions of faith, and how it might be expressed in our world today.

Catholic Illuminations

Did You Receive Holy Communion Today? Thank St. Pius X

ith the election of Pope Leo XIV in May, I noticed a newfound interest of the world, both religious and secular, in the leaders of the Catholic Church. Following the death of Pope Francis and the election of Pope Leo, I wrote in an article that the Church is blessed by each Pope chosen for a particular



purpose that the Church needs. Every Pope is blessed as the Successor of Peter, illustrating that God is constantly at work in the Church and the world. In the past century alone, we have had some outstanding leaders.

On Thursday, Aug. 21, we celebrate the feast of St. Pius X, the Pope from 1903 to 1914. Pius succeeded Leo XIII and was Patriarch of Venice at his election. While I was attending Loyola University for my undergraduate studies (Go Ramblers!), I earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Religious Studies. For my thesis, I wrote a paper entitled "Pius X: Liberal Reformer." Any Catholic historian or any website would notably say Pius was the defender against modernism and fought for Tradition, which is true. My argument for calling him a liberal reformer was simple.

Before Pius was elected Pope, the Church did not have the practice of frequent reception of Holy Communion, and the age of First Communion was around 14 years old. Pius X, seeking to instill a sense of participation among the faithful before that term was used popularly by the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965), sought to change that. Pius changed the age of First Communion from 14 down to 7 years old, the typical age of reason of knowing right from wrong and being able to understand a Sacrament. He also encouraged frequent reception of the Eucharist. The practice at the time was to receive once a year, typically around Easter, and to go to confession as close to that reception as possible (commonly known as the Easter duty).

This practice of once-a-year reception of Holy Communion was born from the Jansenist heresy, the false belief that the Sacraments were only for the perfect and the worthy. Pius X sought to end that false belief by encouraging frequent, or even daily, reception of the Eucharist. As Catholic's, we believe the Eucharist is the source and summit of our faith (Lumen Gentium) and a way to draw closer to God's love and grace for us. It is seen as medicine for the sick and food for the journey, an encounter with Christ, risen from the dead.

With the Holy Father lowering the age of First Communion and calling upon the faithful to receive the Eucharist more frequently, he was reforming the current practice and, in a way, returning to the roots of our faith. The early Church gathered each Sunday, the day of the Resurrection, to share stories and break the bread (Acts 2:42-47). Pius X reminded the Church that the Eucharist is a gift, and we should seek to encounter the Lord in that gift frequently.

One should note, however, that reception of the Eucharist still follows the Church's belief that those with mortal sin on their soul should confess first and then receive the Eucharist. As a Church, we remember and are invited to remember, because of Pope Pius X, that every time we approach the Lord's table, our "Amen" to this Sacrament is our belief that Jesus is present, and we are to become what we receive.
