Reflections from Our Rector_



Dear People of God,

August is quickly coming to a close. Most of our young people have started school. How quickly summer has flown!

I have stated many times that if you want to see the face of God, look in the mirror or next to you. I share with

you real-life stories that will touch your heart. Stories for people of all ages. Based on actual incidents, they are both excellent and inspirational. Enjoy and pass on...

- 1. Today, I interviewed my grandmother for part of a research paper I'm working on for my psychology class. When I asked her to define success in her own words, she said, "Success is when you look back at your life and the memories make you smile."
- 2. Today, I asked my mentor -- a very successful businessman in his 70s — what his top three tips are for success. He smiled and said, "Read something no one else is reading, think something no one else is thinking, and do something no one else is doing."
- 3. Today, after a 72-hour shift at the fire station, a woman ran up to me at the grocery store and hugged me. When I tensed up, she realized I didn't recognize her. She let go with tears of joy in her eyes and the sincerest smile and said, "On 9/11/2001, you carried me out of the World Trade Center."
- 4. Today at 7am, I woke up feeling ill but decided I needed the money, so I went to work. At 3 pm, I got laid off. On my drive home, I got a flat tire. When I went into the trunk for the spare, it was flat, too. A man in a BMW pulled over, gave me a ride, we chatted, and then he offered me a job. I start tomorrow.
- 5. Today, as my father, three brothers, and two sisters stood around my mother's hospital bed, my mother uttered her last coherent words before she died. She said, "I feel so loved right now. We should have gotten together like this more often."
- 6. Today, I kissed my father on the forehead as he passed away in a small hospital bed. About five seconds after

- he passed. I realized it was the first time I had kissed him since I was a little boy.
- 7. Today, when I witnessed a 27-year-old breast cancer patient laughing hysterically at her two-year-old daughter's antics, I suddenly realized that I need to stop complaining about my life and start celebrating it again.
- 8. Today, a boy in a wheelchair saw me desperately struggling on crutches with my broken leg and offered to carry my backpack and books for me. He helped me across campus to my class, and as he was leaving, he said, "I hope you feel better soon."
- 9. Today, I was traveling in Kenya, and I met a refugee from Zimbabwe. He said he hadn't eaten anything in more than three days and looked extremely skinny and unhealthy. My friend offered him the rest of the sandwich he was eating. The first thing the man said was, "We can share it."

The best homilies are lived, not preached. Amen!



Celebrate Sts. Augustine & Monica, Two Pillars of the Church

ftentimes, we think saints were saints their whole lives. The saints we are friends with, the saints we pray through, the saints we invoke when we are in need, have always been holy. But that is not the case. A saint walks the same journey of faith and friendship with God as we do. No one is born a saint, because we



are all born with the stain of original sin on our souls. It is by our baptism that we are called to be saints, and every baptized Catholic has a shared call to holiness.

This shared call for holiness is for each of us as well as our families. More recently, the Church has recognized couples and families that are models for holiness. For example, the Ulma family, beatified in 2023 by Pope Francis, were killed for hiding Jewish families in their home in Poland while Nazism was rampant in the land. This week, we celebrate two saints who are pillars in our faith as models of conversion and perseverance.

St. Augustine, whom we celebrate on Aug. 28, is a Father of the Church in the Patristic period and one of the greatest theologians of Western Christianity. He once said, "Every saint had a past, and every sinner has a future." And if you know his story, he was speaking from experience. His mother, St. Monica, who we celebrate on Aug. 27, prayed for Augustine's conversion every day for several years. As a child and as he grew into adulthood, Augustine would search for answers surrounding life and meaning, as well as in his relationships with different women. He was restless until he found Jesus Christ through the preaching of St. Ambrose, Archbishop of Milan, and the reading of Sacred Scripture. Augustine famously said, "Our hearts are restless until they rest in thee, O God."

St. Ambrose baptized Augustine in Milan in 387, and Monica was present at the baptism. Augustine would eventually go on to write his autobiography entitled "The Confessions," one of the greatest works of Western literature. It is one of those timeless books that you can read repeatedly and get a new insight from each time. If you are looking for a new book to read, I encourage you to buy a copy of Augustine's "The Confessions."

What Augustine teaches us is that God continually seeks after us, but does not force his love upon us. Monica teaches us to never tire of praying for others and ourselves, because God will answer in his time. May we look to this family of saints as we continue on our journeys of holiness and discipleship, not weighed down by our faults, but encouraged to rise to the heights of heaven, through God's grace and love.
