




Catholic Illuminations

How St. Gregory the Great Shaped My Life and Vocation

A part of our Catholic tradition is choosing a Confirmation name before we are confirmed. The practice of choosing a Confirmation name is a sign of the new identity the candidate wishes to be known by and to have another saint in heaven to intercede for them. The chosen saint should be a role model for the candidate, and their life should resonate with the particular candidate. You should not choose the name because it sounds cool, or it is an easy saint to research. Confirmation is one of the three Sacraments of Initiation and allows the candidate to “confirm” their belief in the Church that their godparents spoke on their behalf at baptism.



Confirmed in February 2009, I chose St. Gregory the Great as my Confirmation saint. The Church remembers St. Gregory on Sept. 3, and it is a special day personally, because it reminds me of the saint I chose for Confirmation and marks the anniversary of my Confirmation. It is also a reminder, once again, of the universal call to holiness.

Gregory, born in 540 and elected Pope in 590, died in 604. He was the 64th Successor of St. Peter and is well known in papal history. Coming from a wealthy family, by the age of 30, he was Prefect of Rome. After his father’s death, Gregory converted their family home into a monastery. Before being elected Pope, Gregory enjoyed the monastic lifestyle of prayer and work.

By the time Gregory was elected Pope, Rome was in ruins and the Empire had fallen. He took it upon himself to bring order to the city and the surrounding region as the Pope. He also brought reform to the liturgical life of the Church at the time, both through worship, and in song. Commonly known as Gregorian Chant, Gregory the Great is attributed to formalizing plainchant in the liturgy. He also wrote numerous letters, treatises, and books, one of the most popular being the Book of Pastoral Rule, a text

that focuses on the role of clergy in the Church.

In addition to his work in forming Church administration, liturgy, and missionary efforts, he is one of the most influential popes in our history, giving him the title “the Great” after his death. So why did I choose Gregory as my confirmation saint? Because he is the patron saint of teachers, students, and liturgists.

As an 8th-grade student discerning a vocation to the priesthood, I was blessed with great and supportive teachers. I wanted to be like them as I grew up. As a priest, I see myself always as a student of my more experienced brother priests, of the people I serve, and of the Lord I worship. And I always had a deep devotion and love for the liturgical life of our faith. Little did I know that after ordination, I would be tasked with being the Director of Worship for the Cathedral.

Gregory taught me always to follow the voice of the Lord. He teaches the Church to be open to the movement of the Spirit and to worship in truth and in love. As we celebrate Gregory the Great this week, may we renew our call to holiness, that we may use the gifts God has given us for His glory and the benefit of all.

OCIA Classes to Begin Sept. 7

Ever-considered becoming Catholic? Baptized Catholic, and seeking Confirmation and Eucharist?

The Order of Christian Initiation (OCIA) is the process of becoming Catholic or completing their Sacraments of Initiation. Our OCIA program culminates with participants being welcomed into the Church at Easter Vigil on Sat., April 4, 2026.



Prior to beginning the process of becoming a Christian, an individual comes to some knowledge of Jesus Christ and considers his or her relationship with Jesus Christ. Our team will meet with you as an OCIA Inquirer before you commit to the program.






