

Opportunities Abound to Share Your God-Given Talents!

his Sunday, the Cathedral is hosting our annual Ministry Fair, highlighting the many ways one can use their God-given talents to build up God's kingdom in a tangible way here in this local community. Under the guidance of the Cathedral Worship Council, we invite you to consider joining one of



our liturgical ministries: Lector, Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion (EMHC), and Usher. A Lector proclaims the Word of God at Sunday liturgies. An EMHC assists the priest and deacon in distributing the Eucharist to the faithful at each Mass. An Usher helps people feel welcome during the liturgy and takes up the collection, supporting the Cathedral's mission in the world.

Other ministries within Worship that will be present at the fair are Music, which we are very blessed with a talented music department. Friends of Augustus Tolton, which promotes the cause of canonization of Venerable Augustus Tolton, whom I wrote about a few weeks ago. The Daughters of Isabella, a female group focused on service, spiritual renewal and connection, along with their counterpart, the Knights of Columbus, will also be present.

One new ministry that has been placed on my heart over these years at the Cathedral is our Wedding Ministry. The Cathedral celebrates more than 125 weddings a year, under the direction of our dedicated wedding team, Martha Welter and JoAnn O'Brien. Martha does a fantastic job fielding the wedding inquiries and scheduling wedding dates and rehearsals throughout the year. JoAnn amazingly coordinates the wedding logistics and runs rehearsals the night before the wedding, and is present on the 'day of' to coordinate with the couple from lining up the bridal party to sometimes pinning the boutonniere on the groomsmen.

In conversations with JoAnn and Martha, we are looking to expand our wedding ministry. A volunteer in this ministry would work with JoAnn and me to receive training in running wedding rehearsals on Thursday or Friday evenings and assist with the day-of needs for the couple. Responsibilities include working with wedding planners and photographers/ videographers during rehearsals and wedding liturgies.

Weddings are always a happy occasion. Whether you have seen your own child get married or you are interested in helping couples ensure they have a smooth wedding day here at the Cathedral, please pray over the decision to join our new Wedding Ministry. You will not need to be in direct communication with the couple or their planner; instead, you will need to be available on-site at the Cathedral on a Thursday/Friday evening for rehearsal and on a Friday afternoon or Saturday for the wedding.

Hopefully, with enough interest, one volunteer can be responsible for one wedding each time. Weddings are celebrated on Fridays at 2:30pm and 4:00pm and on Saturdays at 11:00am, 1:30pm, and 3:30pm. This new Liturgical ministry will enable more people to utilize their gifts of encouragement, organization, and friendliness to support the couples and families who begin a new chapter here in this Cathedral.

St. Paul tells us that there are different gifts but the same Spirit (cf. 1 Corinthians 12). This Sunday, join us in the Courtyard from 9:30am to 2:00pm to discover how you can share your gifts to expand God's kingdom here in the Cathedral and within the larger community.

Annual Pre-Marathon Mass


