Reflections from Our Rector ___



Dear People of God,

Next weekend is Halloween, All Saints Day, and All Souls Day. As a small child, I always looked forward to this wonderful day. Choosing a costume and mask filled my October calendar along with watching the Chicago Bears on a Sunday afternoon! My earliest

Halloween costume recollection was in kindergarten. I walked around the neighborhood as Mr. Magoo — the wonderful TV cartoon character!

Halloween connects with costumes, treats, and masks. However, many of us spend the entire year wearing a mask to cover up our pain, anger, disappointment, and fears. We spend a lot of energy focusing on what we lack, forgetting the many gifts God has blessed us with in our lives, or we cover life's hurts with a mask. As we approach Halloween, I'd like to share a reflection that was given to me. Read and pass it on...

Please Hear What I'm Not Saying

Don't be fooled. Don't be fooled by me. Don't be fooled by the mask I wear. For I wear a mask; I wear a thousand masks. Masks that I'm afraid to take off, and none of them are me. Pretending is an art that is second nature with me, but don't be fooled. I give the impression that I'm secure, that all is sunny, unruffled with me, within as well as without; that confidence is my name and coolness is my game; that the waters are calm and that I'm in command and I need no one. But don't believe, please don't.

My surface may seem smooth, but my surface is my mask, my ever-varying and every-concealing mask. Beneath lies no smugness, no complacency. Beneath dwells the real me, in confusion, in fear, in loneliness.

But I hide this, I don't want anybody to know it. I panic at the thought of my weakness and of being exposed. That's why I frantically create a mask to hide behind, a nonchalant, sophisticated façade to help me pretend, to shield from the glance that knows.

But such a glance is precisely my salvation, my only salvation, and I know it. That is, if acceptance follows that glance, if it's followed by love. It's the only thing that can liberate me. I am afraid that you will think less of me, that

you'll laugh, and your laugh will kill me.

I'm afraid that deep down inside I'm nothing, that I'm just no good, and that you see and reject me. So, I play games, my desperate, pretending games, with a façade of assurance on the outside, and a trembling child within.

And so begins the parade of masks, a glittering but empty parade of masks. And my life becomes a front. I idly chatter with you in the suave tones of surface talk. I tell you everything that's really nothing — nothing of which is everything, of what's crying within me.

So, when I'm going through my routine, don't be fooled by what I'm saying. Listen carefully and try to hear what I'm not saying; what I'd like to be able to say; what, for survival, I need to say but I can't say. I dislike the hiding, honestly, I do. You have to help me by holding out your hand, even when that's the last thing I seem to want or need.

Only you can call me into aliveness. Each time you are kind and gentle and encouraging, each time you try to understand because you really care, my heart begins to grow wings. Very small wings.

Very feeble wings, but wings. With your sensitivity and sympathy and your power of understanding. I can make it. You can breathe life into me. I want you to know how important you are to me, how you can be a creator of the person that is me if you choose to.

Only you can wipe away from my eyes the blank stares of the breathing dead. Please choose to. You alone can break down the wall behind which I tremble; you alone can remove the mask; you alone can release me from my shadow world of panic and uncertainty, from my lonely prison.

So please do not pass me by. It will not be easy for you. A long conviction of worthlessness builds strong walls, and there lies my only hope.

Try to beat down those walls with firm hands, but with gentle hands, for a child is very sensitive; and I AM a child.

Who am I, you may wonder? I am someone you know very well. For I am every man, every woman, every child ... every human you meet.



Going on Pilgrimage is a Time for Renewal, Not Vacation

■his Wednesday, members of the Cathedral community and I leave on our Jubilee Pilgrimage to Italy. We will stay in Assisi, Cascia, and Rome and will have the opportunity to pass through the Holy Door at St. Peter's Basilica, St. Paul Outside the Walls, St. Mary Major, and St. John Lateran. Looking at the



dates, it will be very moving to celebrate The Feasts of All Saints and All Souls in Rome, the Eternal City, where so many saints are buried and have lived, and where so many saints shed their blood in the early years of the Church, proclaiming Christ is risen from the dead. A Jubilee Year occurs every 25 years, and the Holy Doors are opened at the Papal Basilicas for the faithful to recognize Jesus as the gate into eternal life.

A common theme among the monotheistic religions of Christianity, Judaism, and Islam is the notion of pilgrimage. There are holy sites associated with these religious traditions, and individuals make an effort to visit these sites based on the requirements of their tradition. There are no formal requirements for Catholics to make a pilgrimage. Yet, Catholicism has many pilgrimage places: the Holy Land, Rome, Marian apparition sites, and the Camino in Spain, to name a few. For Jews, as we read in Scripture, in the time of Jesus, there were three pilgrimages to Jerusalem annually: Passover, Shavuot, and Sukkot. Since the destruction of the Temple by the Romans in 70 AD, the obligation to make a pilgrimage to Jerusalem no longer applies because there is no place to offer sacrifice. In Islam, one of the five pillars of a practicing Muslim is to make a pilgrimage to Mecca at least once in their lifetime.

In these three religious traditions, pilgrimages are journeys meant to foster inner renewal, spiritual growth, and a deeper appreciation for faith, where the pilgrim eventually returns to their homeland and gives witness to the power of God in their life.

But there is a common misconception that lingers. These days in Italy are a pilgrimage, not a vacation. Yes, we will be in a foreign country and visit the holy sites. But there is a sense of inner spiritual renewal and awakening that is a part of this trip. Yes, I personally will be forced to let the email inbox number grow and will not attend parish meetings. But the time away is not a vacation.

Pilgrimages, by their definition, are meant to renew something within. Whether the pilgrimage is to another church here in our great city, to another state, or even another country, there is both an external and internal journey happening. As we embark on this journey to Italy, we will pray at the tomb of St. Francis, who heard the words of Jesus crucified, "Rebuild My Church!" and the tomb of St. Rita of Cascia, who is the patron of the impossible, and other holy sites throughout Rome where saints have found God.

Pray for us as we journey to these holy sites, and pray for us that we may feel renewal from within as well, allowing us to return home safely as authentic and joyful pilgrims of hope.

Ninth-Annual Event Will Be Sunday, Nov. 16

The World Day of the Poor in 2025 will be on Sunday, Nov. 16. This will be the ninth annual observation of the day, established by Pope Francis in 2016 to encourage reflection on and action against poverty.

The theme for 2025 is "You are my hope" (Psalm 7:15), and the official message for the day released by Pope Leo XIV on June 13.

The day encourages Catholics and people of goodwill to recognize the poor as protagonists of hope and to work for structural change. Holy Name Cathedral will once again gather to create winter survival kits for our neighbors living on the streets of Chicago.

The day includes packing the kits with items that are intended to ease the difficulties of winter weather, nonperishable food and spiritual reflections. After packing, volunteers are invited to bring the kits to the many people living on the streets. We provide guidance on how to work in pairs and where to go. Before leaving, all volunteers will receive a special blessing at Mass.

We welcome volunteers to assist in planning the day including defining and ordering the contents of this year's Winter Survival Packs, organizing the packing activities, recruit volunteers, and developing instructions for sharing the packs with those living on the streets of

Chicago.






