Reflections from Our Rector_



Dear People of God,

How do we balance our lives with so many demands pulling us in so many directions? At times, we feel overwhelmed and a sense of "being out of control." With the daily demands tugging at us from every direction, I share the following story that was

passed on to me several years ago. Enjoy reading ... and please share with loved ones!

"So Nicky, I was only 35 when I had the heart attack in Boston. The following day, I had a coronary bypass at Mass General. It put me out of action, out of circulation for almost two months, and it was during my recuperation that I had time to think, really think, maybe for the first time in my life.

I thoroughly, painfully examined my life in Boston just how hectic it had become, with rounds, research, overtime, overwork, and double shifts. I thought about how I'd been feeling just before this awful thing happened. I also dealt with my own denial. My grandmother had died of heart failure. All my family had a history of heart disease. And still I hadn't been as careful as I should have been.

It was while I was recuperating that a doctor friend told me the story of the five balls. You should never forget this one, Nicky. This is terribly important. It goes like this:

Imagine life is a game in which you are juggling five balls. The balls are called work, family, health, friends, and integrity. And you're keeping all of them in the air. But one day, you finally come to understand that work is a rubber ball. If you drop it, it will bounce back. The other four balls - family, health, friends, integrity - are made of glass. If you drop one of these, it will be irrevocably scuffed, nicked, perhaps even shattered. And once you truly understand the lesson of the five balls, you will have the beginnings of balance in your life.

Nicky, I finally understood. I would also emphatically add the (ball) gift of faith in God, rooted in a Faith Community. We need God and one another. This ball also needs to be "passed on" to our children. A life rooted in God-and

lived for others - balances all the glass and rubber balls of our lives."

Join Us To Celebrate 150 Years!

November at Holy Name Cathedral is an important month in our history. Members of our Faith Community know that we have been celebrating our 175th Anniversary as a parish. Established on Nov. 18, 1849, we have honored our past, present and future with events throughout this past year. We hope you have been able to participate in our exciting year.

Now, you may have noticed that we have a 150th Anniversary at the end of the month. How is that possible? What happened to 25 years of Holy Name's history?

This upcoming year, we're celebrating 150 years as the Cathedral of the Archdiocese of Chicago. The first 25 years of our existence we were Holy Name Parish. But due to the church's size, it often was used for major liturgical events. After the Great Chicago Fire in 1871 leveled Holy Name and much of the neighborhood, it was decided to build back as the official Cathedral.

Groundbreaking took place in July 1874 and work was completed in 16 months. The dedication of Holy Name Cathedral, the same building in which we worship today, took place on Nov. 21, 1875. This is the 150th anniversary that we're celebration at our Cornerstone Luncheon on Sunday, Nov. 23 at the Ritz-Carlton. For more information on the luncheon, please see page 4.



Honoring 1,701 Years of Our Mother Church, St. John Lateran

■his Sunday, we celebrate something rather unique - and, honestly, odd to the average person. Once again this year, we break the cycle of Ordinary Time. We did so on Sept. 14 for the Exaltation of the Holy Cross and last weekend, Nov. 2, for All Souls Day. Now, we celebrate a belief central to our faith. Today, we



mark the Feast of the Dedication of St. John Lateran.

The myth of this celebration is that whenever we hear a Saint's name, we say, "Pray for us." But St. John Lateran is not a saint or a real person. The church is dedicated to Christ the Savior, St. John the Baptist, St. John the Evangelist, and Lateranus, whose family owned the land where the church now stands. So we ask: why do we, throughout the Church, celebrate the dedication of the Basilica of St. John Lateran?

Every diocese has a cathedral. Here in Chicago, Holy Name Parish became the Cathedral in 1875. Bishop Feehan dedicated this magnificent structure on Nov. 21 that year. If you are doing the math, next Friday, Nov. 21, marks the 150th anniversary of this great cathedral's dedication. In Rome, the Pope is the Bishop, and the cathedra — or chair of the bishop — sits in St. John Lateran. The cathedra gives the church its name: Cathedral.

The Basilica of St. John Lateran was founded in 324. It has been the cathedral of the Roman diocese ever since. St. Peter's Basilica is often associated with the popes and for good reason. Legally, however, it sits within the territory of the Vatican City State, a sovereign nation. The Basilica of St. John Lateran, by contrast, sits in the city of Rome. It was also the site of the Lateran Palace, where the early popes lived.

Only after St. Peter's Basilica and the Apostolic Palace were built, following the papacy's return from Avignon, France, did the popes leave the Lateran Palace. So, why do we break the cycle of Ordinary Time for this celebration

of a church's dedication almost 5,000 miles away? The cathedral is the head church in its diocese. Each faithful witness within a diocese finds a spiritual home in their cathedral. For the Archdiocese of Chicago, Holy Name Cathedral has that special role. We are the spiritual home for over 2.2 million Catholics. Each year, we celebrate our dedication to remember that the Church, as mother, continues to guide and watch over her children.

Today's celebration reminds Catholics worldwide that we are united with the successor of St. Peter — the first pope and Bishop of Rome. The Church is our mother. We have a spiritual home in Rome. As a pilgrim walks into the grand basilica, they will read, Omnium Ecclesiarum Urbis et Orbis Mater et Caput: "Mother and Head of All the Churches in the City and the World." The Church, built of living stones — those baptized into the mystical body of Christ — is meant to proclaim God's goodness to the world. As we celebrate the dedication of that great cathedral today, let us renew our efforts. Because of those great spiritual homes, we are called by our witness to bring our faith out into the world to others.

Join us on this Wednesday, Nov. 12 In the Cathedral. This month. we are introducing Taizé prayer for the first time during our Holy Hour.


What is Taizé? Taizé (pronounced tay-zay) is a meditative

Volunteers Needed to Help with World Day of the Poor

Sunday, Nov. 16, starting at 10:30am

The World Day of the Poor in 2025 will be on Sunday, Nov. 16. This will be the ninth annual observation of the day, established by Pope Francis in 2016 to encourage reflection on and action against poverty.

The theme for 2025 is "You are my hope" (Psalm 7:15), and the official message for the day released by Pope Leo XIV on June 13. The day encourages Catholics and people of goodwill to recognize the poor as protagonists of hope and to work for structural change.

Volunteers will pick up the bags in the Cathedral vestibule before 10:30am Mass, all are welcome to attend the Mass in the reserved front pews and receive a special blessing at Mass. 
