One man mentioned that he was particularly thankful for Mrs. Wendt, for she more than anyone had introduced him to Tennyson and the beauty of poetry. Acting on a suggestion, the man wrote a letter of appreciation to Mrs. Wendt and addressed it to the high school, which forwarded it and eventually found the old teacher.

Please contact Governor Pritzker to **VETO SB 1950 - Legalizing Assisted Suicide**

At 2:54 a.m. on October 31 the Illinois State Senate narrowly passed SB 1950. The State House narrowly passed the bill in the Spring. The bill is now on the Governor's desk. This is the last chance to stop assisted suicide from becoming law in Illinois.

In Canada where assisted suicide has been legal since 2016, 1 in 20 deaths are now due to assisted suicide/euthanasia. Too many are giving up on life under this law.

PLEASE CALL GOV. PRITZKER **AND INFORM HIM:**

- · People with disabilities, the poor and marginalized fear coercion and abuse under assisted suicide laws.
- · Suicide rates increase in states where assisted suicide is legal, especially among veterans.
- · There is a possible cost savings to insurance companies as they can provide cheaper lethal drugs instead of lifesaving treatments.



Share Your Faith, Consider Becoming an OCIA Sponsor

■here is a common saying: "You can't choose your family, but you can choose your friends." And in our life of faith, we can choose a sponsor. For the sacraments of baptism and confirmation, the candidate receives a sponsor — a guide, a mentor, a companion on the journey. When an infant is baptized,



parents typically choose the godparents. Generally, godparents are the parents' siblings or very close friends. For confirmation, the candidate chooses someone in their life they look up to, whether it be a family member or a trusted adult who serves as a guide.

The Church requires sponsors for either baptism or confirmation to be at least 16 years of age, to be fully initiated Catholics in good standing with the Catholic Church, and to be able to fulfill this function (Code of Canon Law, Canon 874). To be a sponsor is a vital ask and very humbling. Personally, my younger brother asked me to be his sponsor for confirmation. Since then, I have been a sponsor for another person for their confirmation last year, and I am a godparent to my best friend's son, who was baptized earlier this year.

Sponsors are people who live a life of faith that can help the baptized or confirmed in their own lives. As a godparent for baptism, the role is to help raise the child in the faith, whereas, for confirmation, it is to faithfully walk with the confirmed candidate through their various life moments. It should be an honor to sponsor someone because others have seen your strong faith lived out and witnessed in their lives, and want you to share that faith with others.

In the OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults) program, we need sponsors. This program is a unique moment in the life of the parish because adults are freely choosing to enter into the mystery of Christ's life, death, and resurrection. Compared to infant baptism, these adults grew up in a different denomination or a different religious tradition altogether. Sometimes, they may not

have a strong Catholic witness to ask to be their sponsor because they may be the first in their family or social circle to take this leap to take this leap in becoming a fully-initiated Catholic.

As the St. Augustine of Hippo cohort moves closer to the celebration of the Sacraments on Holy Saturday. April 4, 2026, these candidates and catechumens need sponsors. If you have a desire to share your faith, walk with another person on their faith journey, and support someone as they learn what it means to be Catholic, this is an opportunity for you. The Church grows, not in rows, but in circles. The early Christians went and told others the Good News of the Resurrection and shared their faith. Now is the time to answer the call and sponsor a new Catholic as they learn about our rich history, so they can then go out into their circles of friends and family and share their faith with others.

The World Day of the Poor in 2025 will be on Sunday. Nov. 16. This will be the ninth annual observation of the day, established by Pope Francis in 2016 to encourage reflection on and action against poverty.

The theme for 2025 is "You are my hope" (Psalm 7:15), and the official message for the day released by Pope Leo XIV on June 13. The day encourages Catholics and people of goodwill to recognize the poor as protagonists of hope and to work for structural change.

Holy Name Cathedral will have several opportunities to serve, including distributing care packages to the needy on the street. Volunteers will pick up the bags in the Cathedral vestibule before 10:30am Mass, all are welcome to attend the Mass in the reserved front pews and receive a special blessing at Mass.

Afterwards they will go out into the streets and distribute packages, and encouraged to do so in pairs or teams.

From 12-2pm, volunteers are also needed to distribute bags to residents of Lawson House and participate in a holiday arts & craft making activity along with fellowship with the residents.

The Stump of Jesse

'What? It's on Fire!'

ven in an age so marked by secularism, there are moments ■ when the entire world seems to pause, kneel, and pray. Do you remember that day? "The Notre-Dame Cathedral in Paris is on fire!" The whole world was shaken. People of every faith and nation watched in sorrow as flames devoured one of



Christianity's most treasured landmarks. For a brief time, all divisions faded — and hearts united in grief and prayer.

A few weeks ago, after her annual retreat, my sister (who is a Sister — quite the tongue-twister, I know!) waited patiently in a long line to enter the newly restored Cathedral. She said that as she stepped inside, she felt a sense of newness — not just from the gleaming stone, but from the spirit of renewal that filled the air. Thousands gathered there, Catholics and non-Catholics alike, standing in awe at how beautifully the Cathedral had been restored after the great fire.

There was a quiet mix of emotions in that sacred space - gratitude, reverence, and reflection. Once consumed by flames, now renewed in glory. Like the phoenix rising from the ashes, it reminds us of our own faith: sometimes wounded, sometimes scorched by life's trials, yet never destroyed.

In the same way, the Church in France — the "eldest daughter of the Church" — continues to persevere. Though numbers may dwindle, the faith still burns quietly and patiently.

And speaking of rekindling...

On Jan. 31, our Young Adult Retreat will invite us to do just that, with the theme: "Back to the First Love." Pope Leo



XIV (a Chicago native — oh yes, I'm still incredibly proud!) reminds us beautifully:

"Together, then, we will rebuild the credibility of a wounded Church, sent to a wounded humanity, within a wounded

creation. We are not yet perfect, but it is necessary to be credible."

Each of us has a role in this rebuilding. But before we can be sent, we must first return — return to the One who loved us first. It's an invitation to revisit that first encounter with Christ, when His love became real and personal. Just as Peter was called back to the shoreline to hear Jesus ask, "Do you love me?" before being sent on mission, so too are we invited to return to our own Galilee moments.

The holidays are around the corner, and life will soon get busy. So before the season sweeps you away, take a moment to scan the QR code and reserve your spot. Come and rekindle the fire — because God is still making all things new. I love being a priest. JMJ.


