



## Reflections from Our Rector\_



Dear People of God,

I consider myself a very patient person except when it comes to lines. Traffic jams (Kennedy Expressway!) and grocery store lines drive me crazy! It doesn't matter whether the line is on foot or by car — I find myself impatient and anxious to move

through it. Undoubtedly, I am not alone. Many people find themselves in the same boat!

What about Advent waiting? Most of us rush through Advent, forgetting the real purpose and meaning of the Season. As a former basketball player, I liken the Advent Season to a "full-court press" on the basketball floor. Hurry and press the ballhandler to force a turnover by quickening the tempo of the game. Do we put a "full court-press" with our Advent Season?

I received a letter several years ago. It speaks beautifully about the real meaning of Advent and Christmas, which may be realized only with age in this gift called life. Read...slow down...and pass it on...



## This Advent, You're Invited to Our Communal Penance Service

■he Sacrament of Confession/ Reconciliation is one of the seven sacraments of the Church, and one of the two Sacraments termed as a Sacrament of Healing (the other being Anointing of the Sick). Though baptized and original sin removed from us, we have the tendency to sin, which is called



concupiscence, and our human condition is prone to fall. Confession allows us to recognize our failings and seek forgiveness from God.

The Church encourages us to go to confession at least once a year, and, in response to this invitation, parishes make it easy for the faithful to offer communal reconciliation services on weeknights during Lent and Advent. A communal reconciliation service is not a group confession in which everyone confesses their sins for everyone to hear. Instead, it is a time to come together as a community to pray, ask for forgiveness, and recognize the common desire for forgiveness and the reality that we all sin and need healing.

Since every time we sin, we sin against God, neighbor, and ourselves, a communal reconciliation service allows these three transgressions to be healed. We gather as sinners, and in this season of Advent of spiritual preparation, marked by hope, peace, joy, and love, we are forgiven of our sins and set free from the chains that bind us.

A communal reconciliation service includes a few songs, scripture readings based on the season, an examination of conscience, and individual confession. Like any Sacrament, one is not forced to receive it, so some people may wish to attend the service but not participate in individual confession. In your individual confession, you can confess your sins to the priest and receive absolution. If you do not go to individual confession at a communal reconciliation service, you do not receive absolution from your sins because you did not confess your sins to a priest.

The benefit of attending a communal penance service is

that we gather as sinners together, aware of God's mercy. We have the opportunity to reflect with one another, through song and scripture, on God's immense love and compassion that we will experience in confession. Practically speaking, more priests are helping with communal services, and the lines are typically shorter than on a Saturday morning in the lower level of the Cathedral, when there's only one priest in the confessional.

Holy Name Cathedral will have our Advent Communal Reconciliation Service on Wednesday, Dec. 10, at 6:00pm. All are welcome to join us as we come together to sit in the quiet of this preparatory season. We will have numerous priests available for confession, and it may be better to go to this service than wait in line on Saturday morning. Let us prepare the way for the coming of the Lord in the flesh on Christmas morning. Advent is a season marked by darkness, which ends with the coming of the dawn from on high. This light penetrated our lives, illuminating us so we can share it with others.



### Tours After 8:30, 10:30 Masses

## Cathedral Annual Report

Dear Holy Name Cathedral Faith Community,

We are pleased to present the Cathedral Statement of Operating Activities for the year ending June 30, 2025. The past fiscal year ended with a small operating surplus, amid rising expenses for staff, Cathedral ministries, and other operating costs.

Our revenues grew slightly from the previous year, but most notably, our weekend, holy day, and Christmas and Easter collections increased by 8.4% from Fiscal Year 2024. Thank you! We are ever so grateful for the continued stewardship of so many of our parishioners and visitors, who recognize the Cathedral as a vibrant part of their faith journey and service to Chicago. As we celebrated our 175th Anniversary, the continued generosity of our faith community has manifested itself in many ways.

While there are many positive signs in our financial picture, there are also growth opportunities. In the coming year, our Director of Stewardship, Regina Zielinski, will announce numerous exciting ways that we can play a meaningful part in the future of Holy Name Cathedral. We will soon embark on a capital campaign in conjunction with the Archdiocese's Generation to Generation program. You will hear more about this in the new year. There will be numerous ways to participate as we envision a future that will require new capital improvements to our Cathedral campus, expanded ministries, and outreach programs for generations to come.

Already, many of our Cathedral friends and fundraising initiatives have become part of our tradition. For example, so far, our 2025 Annual Rector's Appeal received a \$300,000 matching gift, helping us exceed our goal for the fourth year in a row. Numerous 175th Anniversary projects, including the Sacred Heart Statue, the Cabrini gift to Pope Francis, and the Courtyard Mosaic, were underwritten by generous donors. Our Legacy program offers an opportunity to recognize Holy Name Cathedral through estate gifts that have funded our Baptistry and new Tabernacle. Generous donors made almost 20 estate commitments during the past year. There are many other examples of generosity of time, talent, and treasure in the Cathedral Annual Report that we will mail to all registered parishioners in the coming week.

The response of our Faith Community to contribute their time and talent is impressive. Over 800 of our parishioners are engaged in 40+ parish ministries that serve young adults, support faith formation, provide outreach to those in need, host parish retreats, and other initiatives that enhance the vibrancy of our work with the people of God.

There is one significant opportunity for us, and we ask everyone to prayerfully support it. This past year, the Cathedral grew by nearly 100 registered households. Yet, the overall percentage of our total households who regularly support us through our weekly collections is less than 32%, and almost 4,000 registered households presently do not consider the Cathedral part of their stewardship responsibilities. We have made it easy to access Pushpay, our secure giving platform, through QR codes, online account management, and other online giving methods. If you are able, please consider joining those who regularly give to the Cathedral as we continue to build a culture of philanthropy.

It is clear that the Cathedral is blessed with a vibrant and engaged Faith Community that supports our priests, deacons, and religious sisters, as well as our Cathedral lay staff, in working together each day toward a shared vision of "A world in communion with Jesus Christ." Our heartfelt gratitude for all you do along the journey with us.

## Join us for Vespers Sundays in Advent

Sundays, Dec. 7, 14, 21 at 4:00pm; Weekly Organ Concert at 3:30pm

Vespers is one of the oldest of the Divine Offices, the liturgical division of the day into hours of prayer. Used primarily by religious orders in monasteries in its inception, it has evolved and been revised throughout the centuries into its current place of honor as the prayers said in the early evening.

This office was once called *lucernarium*, Latin for "lamplighting time," indicating its timing in the day and its roots in our Judaic beginnings, where the faithful were called to light lamps and begin the worship leading to the dawning of a new day. Vespers encourages us to spend time in prayer, thanking God for the day we have passed through and anticipating the day to come. This spiritual anticipation is reflected in the season of Advent, when we, as a faith community, prepare for the coming of the Lord.

Advent Vespers is celebrated during the four Sundays of Advent at 4:00pm in the Cathedral, led by members of the Schola Cantorum Cathedralis, preceded at 3:30pm by the Advent Vespers Organ Recital performed by various artists. The service is comprised of chanted Psalms, Magnificat by Stanford, Responsory, reflection, and a choral anthem each week. Join us to enrich your holiday season with prayer and participate in the endless cycle of grace in our days.



## Midnight Mass Tickets Now Available Online!

In addition to Midnight Mass, we are offering three masses during the day on Christmas Eve and four masses on Christmas Day. There is no need to register for these other Christmas Eve or any of the Christmas Day Masses. All are welcome, and it is a first come, first seated for all our Christmas Masses. There is no overflow seating for Midnight Mass, so it is strongly suggested that you reserve your tickets in advance. Just scan the QR code to make your reservation.

All those who have preregistered will be allowed to enter the Cathedral at 11:00pm. At 11:30pm, Christmas carols begin and we open our doors for all others waiting without advance registration.

We will have free parking with extended time for Christmas Carols and the full Mass. Just pull your ticket to enter our garage at the Holy Name Cathedral parking garage, located at 14 W. Superior.

## Join us for Simbang Gabi! Faith, Food, and Fellowship

Simbang Gabi, which means "Night Mass" in Filipino, is a beloved devotional tradition of nine Masses celebrated by Filipino Catholics in joyful anticipation of Christmas. It mirrors the nine dawn Masses known as Misa de Aguinaldo in Puerto Rico. The tradition began as a practical accommodation for farmers who started work before sunrise and has since become a cherished cultural and spiritual celebration rooted in community, faith, and sharing.

Simbang Gabi is traditionally observed from Dec. 16 to 24, with Masses held in the early hours of the morning typically between 3:00am and 5:00am. Anticipated celebrations may begin as early as Dec. 15 and are often held in the evening, usually around 8:00pm, though some take place as late as 11:00pm or at midnight. The final Mass, celebrated on Christmas Eve, is called *Misa de* Gallo. or "Rooster's Mass."

The Cathedral Filipino Network warmly invites you to take part in this beautiful tradition. Join us for Simbang Gabi on Saturday, Dec. 20 at 7:00pm at Holy Name Cathedral, followed by a festive reception featuring delicious traditional Filipino dishes. 


