Seeing the Light of **Christmas Through the** Face of a Newborn Baby

remember the day I learned I was going to become a father...the anticipation and joy I felt. And then, in the months that ensued, planning for all kinds of decisions, like when we should order



and build the crib and how we would outfit and prepare the nursery so that when the day came, we were ready.

She ended up being an October baby, and by the time we brought her home, daylight saving time was ending, and the days were naturally growing shorter and darker.

I remember looking into her face that first time, feeling a sense of illumination. A bright light, much in the same way you see in paintings that depict baby Jesus in the manger. As the believers came to witness His arrival, the paintings depict a natural light shining in their faces. Each of us who sees a baby's face typically experiences that sense of illumination and joy.

A baby's face becomes the first lamp of Christmas. And that radiance asks something of us.

As we light the candles of the Advent wreath each week, we are reminded that preparation is not passive. We prepare by making room in our hearts, likely crowded with thoughts of gifts we must buy and Christmas parties we should attend, and filling them instead with hope we see in unexpected, random acts of kindness and in connections with loved ones.

But meanwhile, we wait in anticipation in natural darkness...and when we see the face of the newborn King, may we be filled with that sense of illumination that God wants us to share with others, helping spread His message of love. Will you be ready?


known as Misa

de Aguinaldo in Puerto Rico. The tradition began as a practical accommodation for farmers who started work before sunrise and has since become a cherished cultural and spiritual celebration rooted in community, faith, and sharing.

Simbang Gabi is traditionally observed from Dec. 16 to 24, with Masses held in the early hours of the morning — typically between 3:00am and 5:00am. Anticipated celebrations may begin as early as Dec. 15 and are often held in the evening, usually around 8:00pm, though some take place as late as 11:00pm or at midnight. The final Mass, celebrated on Christmas Eve, is called *Misa de Gallo*, or "Rooster's Mass."

The Cathedral Filipino Network warmly invites you to take part in this beautiful tradition. Join us for Simbang Gabi on Saturday, Dec. 20 at 7:00pm at Holy Name Cathedral, followed by a festive reception featuring delicious traditional Filipino dishes. Come and experience the beauty and pageantry of this sacred celebration!

Mary, Christmas Is Coming — Don't Let My Legs Be Broken

ith one hand gripping the ladder and the other clutching a Christmas wreath, I made my slow, careful ascent into the icy Chicago air. The courtyard, still blanketed from the first snowstorm of the season, glistened

with beauty — but also promised a slippery downfall

if I wasn't careful. "Mary, Christmas is coming — please don't let my legs be broken," I whispered, half-prayer, half-plea, as I reached the top rung. It was my first time climbing a ladder in a Chicago winter, and the wind seemed determined to test my trust.

But God is good. You can tell the prayer was answered because I'm still walking just fine today. Guess what! Two generous volunteers abandoned their other decorating duties to stand at the base of the ladder and steady it with the seriousness of surgeons. A big

shout-out to the entire Christmas decoration team — the unsung heroes who bring beauty, warmth, and festive hope to our campus each year.

When the wreath finally hung in place, swaying gently against the gray sky, a deep joy settled over us. We had finished just in time for the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception — a small triumph, perhaps, but one wrapped in gratitude and grace.

That moment of relief and joy mirrors the spirit of this Third Sunday of Advent — Gaudete Sunday, when the Church invites us to rejoice because the Lord is near.

> Isaiah speaks of deserts blooming and of weak hands being strengthened. James urges patience, reminding us that God's timing bears fruit. And in the Gospel, Jesus reveals that the long-awaited signs — sight for the blind, strength for the lame, good news for the poor — are already breaking into the world.

Sometimes joy arrives trembling on a ladder; sometimes it bursts forth like a desert in bloom. Either way, Advent reminds us: God is close, salvation is near, and joy is not only promised—it is already on its way. So pay

attention. Joy is quietly waiting around us, if only we look. I love being a priest. JMJ.

What You Need to Know for Christmas Masses at HNC

In preparation to celebrate the Lord's Nativity, Holy Name Cathedral will follow these measures to allow safe and welcoming worship to our parishioners and visitors who join us for Masses on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day.

Christmas Eve Masses

All will be asked to line up outside on State Street. The line will begin at the staircase and flow north on State towards the FXW school building and Chicago Ave. The center doors will open at 2:15pm and 5:15pm prior to the 3pm and 6pm Christmas Eve Masses (handicap and stroller access) available on the corner of State and Superior.) There will be no saving pews and we ask that all members of the family be present when entering the Cathedral.

There will be an overflow Christmas Eve Mass at 3:15pm in the auditorium, which will be a full Mass with music. When the Cathedral reaches capacity, everyone not in the Cathedral at that time will be directed to the auditorium for Mass at 3:15pm. This is the only overflow Mass for the Christmas liturgies.

Midnight Mass

For Midnight Mass, the line will be divided between ticketed and non-ticketed persons. Those with tickets are asked to have them ready by the time doors open at 11pm. Non ticketed persons will be admitted at 11:30pm.

Christmas Day Masses

For the 7:00am Christmas Day Mass, the Cathedral doors will open at 6:30am. For all remaining Masses, everyone will be asked to remain outside until the previous Mass participants have exited the Cathedral. We encourage people, as on Christmas Eve to stand with their families as saving pews will not be allowed due to the expected number of Mass attendees.

Thank you for understanding and for joining us for the celebration of Christmas at Holy Name Cathedral. These measures will ensure accurate seating for our liturgies. less congestion between Masses. The Cathedral staff thanks everyone for joining us for these sacred liturgies and for your cooperation.
