God speaks to us at all the moments of our life if we open our eyes, ears and hearts — and listen.

How Life is Measured

I had a very special teacher in high school many years ago whose husband unexpectedly and suddenly died of a heart attack. About a week after his death, she shared some of her insight with a classroom of students. As the late-afternoon sunlight came in, she moved a few things aside on the edge of her desk and sat down there. With a gentle look of reflection on her face, she paused and said, “Before class is over, I would like to share with all of you a thought that is unrelated to class, but which I feel is very important.”

“Each of us is put here on earth to learn, share, love, appreciate, and give of ourselves. None of us knows when this fantastic experience will end. It can be taken away at any moment. Perhaps this is a way of telling us that we must make the most out of every single day.

Her eyes beginning to water, she went on, “So I would like you all to make me a promise. From now on, on your way to school, or on your way home, find something beautiful to notice. It doesn’t have to be something you see. It could be a scent --perhaps freshly baked bread wafting out of someone’s house, or it could be the sound of the breeze slightly rustling the leaves in the trees, or the way the morning light catches the autumn leaf as it falls gently to the ground. Please look for these things and cherish them. For, although it may sound trite to some, these things are the stuff of life. The little things we are put here on earth to enjoy. The things we often take for granted. We must make it important to notice them because at any time, it can all be taken away.” The class

was completely quiet. We all picked up our books and filed out of the room silently.

That afternoon, I noticed more things on my way home from school than I had all semester. Every once in a while, I think of that teacher and remember what an impression she made on all of us, and I try to appreciate the things we sometimes overlook. Take notice of something special you see on your way for lunch hour today. When you go home, go barefoot. Or walk on the beach at sunset. Stop off on the way home tonight to get a double-dip ice cream cone. “For as we get older, it is not the things we did that we often regret, but the things we didn’t do.”

Don’t cry because it’s over; smile because it happened.”

Catholic Illuminations

Welcome the Light of Christ & New Lights of the Cathedral

Beginning a new year brings many thoughts and desires for change. And as we still find ourselves in the Christmas season, we celebrate this weekend the arrival of the Magi, who, tradition tells us, offered gifts to the newborn King. With a new year, we also think of resolutions to be better people, disciples, and witnesses of God's love in the world. New Year's is also a time to look at areas in our lives, whether literal or figurative, and make changes and renovations.

Beginning this month, the Cathedral will undergo a long-awaited renovation: its lighting. We will replace our outdated dimming card light system, which uses light bulbs that are quickly going out of stock worldwide. Our new LED system will enhance our worship space and the congregation's experience of the Cathedral. This is an investment in the Cathedral as the Mother Church of the Archdiocese and a testament to future generations that will worship here.

This project will take a few months, given the size of our beautiful Cathedral. Most of the work will be done overhead, in the attic. Some areas will have scaffolding, but it will not impact the Cathedral worship schedule or space for an extended period of time. With this new system, we will be able to dim the lights in various areas of the Cathedral, which will be helpful for services like Tenebrae during Holy Week and Holy Thursday, as well as the musical concerts we host throughout the year. The LED lights will also not be as hot as the current bulbs, helping regulate the temperature in the Cathedral in a small way. We are grateful that this update will improve the worship experience here at the Cathedral.

As light is also a central theme in this weekend's feast, we also look to Christ as the light of the world that humanity longs to follow. As is the custom on Epiphany Sunday, the Church invites us to announce this year's movable feasts,



so the faithful are prepared and ready to celebrate these high holy days within our faith communities...

"Know, dear brothers and sisters, that, as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ, so by leave of God's mercy, we announce to you also the joy of his Resurrection, who is our Savior. On the 18th day of February, Ash Wednesday will fall, marking the beginning of the most sacred Lenten Season. On the 5th day of April, you will celebrate with joy Easter Day, the Paschal feast of our Lord Jesus Christ. On the 17th day of May, will be the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ. On the 24th day of May will be the feast of Pentecost. On the 7th day of June, the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. On the 29th day of November, the First Sunday of Advent of our Lord Jesus Christ, to whom is honor and glory forever and ever. Amen."

These free tours will begin immediately after Mass and will start at the front of the main, center aisle. No reservations needed!

Why Join the Young Adult Retreat on Saturday, Jan. 31?

Are you still wondering whether this retreat is for you? Hear directly from young adults who joined last year — and how the experience touched their lives.

“ I received the retreat flyer from a Sunday Mass usher. Since I was new to the city and had never attended a retreat before, I wasn’t planning to go. But when a friend mentioned the same retreat, I decided to give it a try. I was surprised to find that nearly one-third of the 140 participants were also first-timers like me. The retreat gave me space to slow down, listen to meaningful talks, and share in small groups. By the end of the day, I felt more connected to God and learned practical ways to slow down and rediscover joy.”

“ Having just gotten married, we quickly realized that marriage brings both joy and challenges. Sometimes impatience creeps in as we adjust to making decisions together. During marriage prep, we loved our Pre-Cana retreat but didn’t realize retreats were also for ‘regular’ people — we thought they were only for priests or religious! When we saw this retreat in the parish bulletin, we decided to attend. One of the most impactful moments was the witness panel, where a couple shared about pausing, praying, and remembering their vows before reacting to unexpected situations. Since then, we’ve been praying with our wedding vows almost every night.”

Join Our Ministry of Care to Bring Communion to the Sick

We are happy to announce that we will be holding training for our Ministry of Care program that serves at several of our local healthcare facilities. This includes Northwestern Hospital (Galter, Feinberg, and Prentice) and Warren Barr Rehabilitation Center. All these facilities are a short walking distance from the Cathedral. We also have several in-home visit opportunities for those unable to come to church.

What is the Ministry of Care?

Ministry of Care to the sick is a pastoral ministry caring for those who are hospitalized, in nursing homes or confined to private homes. This ministry is provided by trained and certified lay men and women, ordained deacons, vowed religious sisters and brothers and priests within the Archdiocese of Chicago. Ministers are trained and formed to conduct pastoral visits with time to listen and pray about the concerns of the sick or shut-in person and to share Eucharist with them.

How does one become a Minister of Care?

As mandated by the Archdiocese of Chicago, each minister must complete a minimum of ten hours of training. Holy Name Cathedral is blessed to have a cadre of priests and deacons who collaborate with our staff team to design and deliver the training.



It is primarily an in-person training with opportunities to practice patient interactions. We only offer the training twice per year. This next training will start in February 2026.

How often do I serve as a Minister of Care?

The schedule for ministers is highly flexible. We serve seven days a week, 365 days a year. Some ministers serve on a weekly basis while others serve every other week or twice a month. You may visit your assigned patients anytime during patient visiting hours on your assigned day.

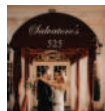

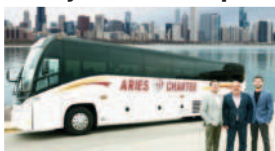

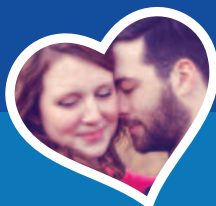
