# Reflections from Our Rector

## Dear People of God,

Our Christmas Season ends today with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Many of us have taken down the trees and wrapped up the ornaments for next December. The last month quickly blurred one day into the next. Yet, we should not throw away the real meaning of Christmas with the wrapping paper from opened gifts. I share the following — a story worth sharing with others...

### I Wish You Enough

Recently, I overheard a father and a daughter in their last moments together. The airline had announced her departure, and they were standing near the security gate. They hugged, and he said, "I love you. I wish you enough."

She said, "Daddy, our life together has been more than enough. Your love is all I ever needed. I wish you enough, too, Daddy." They kissed, and she left.

He walked over toward the window where I was seated. Standing there, I could see he wanted and needed to cry. I tried not to intrude on his privacy, but he welcomed me in by asking, "Did you ever say good-bye to someone knowing it would be forever?"

"Yes, I have," I replied. Saying that brought back memories of expressing my love and appreciation for all that my Dad had done. Knowing that his days were limited, I took time to tell him face-to-face how much he

meant to me. So, I knew what this man was experiencing.

"Forgive me for asking, but why is this a forever good-bye?" I asked. "I am old, and she lives much too far away. I have challenges ahead, and the reality is, her next trip back will be for my funeral," he said.

"When you were saying good-bye, I heard you say, 'I wish you enough.' May I ask what that means?"

He began to smile. "That's a wish handed down from earlier generations. My parents used to say it to everyone." He paused, looking up as if to remember the details, and he smiled even more. "When we said 'I wish you enough,' we wanted the other person to have a life filled with enough good things to sustain them." He then turned toward me and recited the following from memory.

"I wish you enough sun to keep your attitude bright. I wish you enough rain to appreciate the sun more. I wish you enough happiness to keep your spirit alive. I wish you enough pain so that the smallest joys in life appear much bigger. I wish you enough gain to satisfy your wanting. I wish you enough loss to appreciate all that you possess. I wish you enough hellos to get you through the final 'goodbye.'" He then began to cry and walked away.

And a wish from your Rector: May you have faith and courage to trust the Lord. You do not walk alone. Jesus promises to be your strength, hope, and food — always!


## Cathedral Concert Series with Lynn Trapp

# We Start 2026 Looking to Strengthen our Cathedral's Future

Each year the Church concludes our Christmas season with the joyful celebration of the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. And this feast reminds us that the waters we ourselves are washed in, are made holy by Jesus descending into those same waters and sanctifying them.

He who knew no sin, was baptized to make a path back to God for us who were entrapped in sin. By being reminded of Jesus' own baptism, we are invited to look inward and reflect on our own baptism and what it means in our day-to-day life.

The Baptism of Jesus is recorded in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke, right before he begins his public ministry, and before he is led by the Spirit into the desert to be tempted. In each account, after the baptism, the evangelists write that the heavens were opened and God said, "This is my beloved Son with whom I am well pleased." According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, "Baptism makes us members of the Body of Christ" and is "birth into the new life in Christ" (CCC, 1267, 1277). Baptism is central in the life of any believer because of how foundational it is to their life, and how that call is meant to play out in the lives of others. To be baptized means to join the community of disciples who seek to be the hands and feet of Jesus in our world today and to always move forward, with each other.

Like Jesus' baptism, our own baptisms are, in a sense, a public act of worship, and not a private event. The baptized are incorporated into a community of believers, into the mystical body of Christ, the Church. And as members of the Church, we all share responsibility for Her mission and to proclaim the Gospel to all people, in word and deed. To be baptized invites us to carry forth the mission of the Church in our own unique way.

As we move into 2026 Holy Name Cathedral will be launching the Cathedral Cornerstone Campaign: Building



Our Future in Christ. Our goal is to raise \$12 million for Holy Name Cathedral over five years to enable essential structural improvements, modernize our facilities and grow our endowment to sustain our beloved music and other ministries for years to come. Our Campaign is being launched in the context of the Archdiocese of Chicago's "Generation to Generation" campaign, which seeks to raise \$300 million. Together, we will strengthen the Church in Chicago, supporting spiritual renewal within our parishes, priests with ongoing formation programs, and parishes in vulnerable communities.

As I mentioned last week, the installation of our new lighting system will begin in less than two weeks. This project is a major part of our Cathedral Cornerstone Campaign. We are incredibly grateful to the Archdiocese of Chicago for funding this project contemporaneously with the launch of our Campaign. As we live out our baptismal call to love and to serve, this capital campaign will strive to ensure the baptized are able to authentically live out their faith here at Holy Name Cathedral, and throughout the Archdiocese of Chicago, for generations to come.

By celebrating the Baptism of the Lord this weekend, we give thanks to God for incorporating us into his eternal family, and we renew our call to share the Gospel in our daily lives, and as we embark on the Cathedral Cornerstone Campaign, are led by the same Spirit, to do all things in praise, honor and glory of His Holy Name.

## Come Celebrate the Feast of Santa Niño, the Patron and Protector of the Philippines

**Mass at Saturday, Jan. 17 at 11am,  
Reception to Follow in Parish Center**

In 1519, Ferdinand Magellan sailed for Spain to seek new trade routes and to circumnavigate the globe. Missionaries accompanied him to spread Christianity. In 1521, upon arriving in the Philippines, Magellan gave a statue of the Santo Niño (Holy Child) to Queen Juana of Cebu after her and her subjects' conversion to Christianity. This act is recognized as a significant cultural and religious exchange, marking the introduction of Catholicism to the Philippines.

To many Filipinos, the Santo Niño is considered miraculous due to numerous accounts of miracles attributed to the image of the Child Jesus. In 1565, the town of Cebu was burned down in an attack, including the church of Santo Niño, but the statue was found unscathed among the ashes. During World War II, a bomb fell through the roof of the San Agustin Church (now the Basilica del Santo Niño in Cebu) but did not detonate; it is said the statue was found dangling by its cape after being thrown from the high altar. These and other events increased people's faith in the Santo Niño's miraculous powers, and over the years, many have claimed personal miracles and answered prayers after petitioning the Santo Niño, further strengthening their belief.

On Jan. 19, 2015, Pope Francis endorsed the image and



called the Santo Niño the Protector of the Philippines during his pastoral and state visit. Annually, up to 3 million devotees flock to Cebu City to observe the Feast Day on the third Sunday of January and to participate in the nine-day Sinulog, a festival and celebratory prayer dance that blends indigenous and Christian elements.

The Cathedral Filipino Network invites you to come celebrate the Feast of Santo Niño Mass on Saturday, Jan. 17, at 11:00am, followed by a reception in the Parish Center.

## Join Our Ministry of Care to Bring Communion to the Sick

We are happy to announce that we will be holding training for our Ministry of Care program that serves at several of our local healthcare facilities. This includes Northwestern Hospital (Galter, Feinberg, and Prentice) and Warren Barr Rehabilitation Center. All these facilities are a short walking distance from the Cathedral. We also have several in-home visit opportunities for those unable to come to church.

### What is the Ministry of Care?

Ministry of Care to the sick is a pastoral ministry caring for those who are hospitalized, in nursing homes or confined to private homes. This ministry is provided by trained and certified lay men and women, ordained deacons, vowed religious sisters and brothers and priests within the Archdiocese of Chicago. Ministers are trained and formed to conduct pastoral visits with time to listen and pray about the concerns of the sick or shut-in person and to share Eucharist with them.

### How does one become a Minister of Care?

As mandated by the Archdiocese of Chicago, each minister must complete a minimum of ten hours of training. Holy Name Cathedral is blessed to have a cadre of priests and deacons who collaborate with our staff team to design and deliver the training.



It is primarily an in-person training with opportunities to practice patient interactions. We only offer the training twice per year. This next training will start in February 2026.

### How often do I serve as a Minister of Care?

The schedule for ministers is highly flexible. We serve seven days a week, 365 days a year. Some ministers serve on a weekly basis while others serve every other week or twice a month. You may visit your assigned patients anytime during patient visiting hours on your assigned day.

# A Piece of Candy and a Jar Full of Rocks and Pebbles

**A**fter Sunday morning Mass, a woman with short black hair approached me, her expression heavy with emotion. She said softly, "Father, I want to give you a piece of candy."

I was puzzled. Why a piece of candy? She continued, "I want you to taste the sweetness of life that the Lord has blessed us with. I lost my mother last week. I cared for her for a long time." As she spoke, tears filled her eyes. "I am very sorry for your loss," I said.

After taking a deep breath, she shared more of her story. "I am deeply thankful to God. He gave me a good job that also allowed me the time to care for my mom. Now that she has passed, I've decided to retire early. I want to bring the sweetness of God's love to those who have no one to



care for them or even talk to, by visiting nursing homes."

What! I know, right? I was speechless, moved by the beauty of her faith and the generosity of her heart.

Friends, as we start the year 2026, perhaps we should ask ourselves: What is the one thing that truly matters in life?

A professor once stood before his class holding an empty jar. One by one, he placed large rocks inside until it seemed full. "Is the jar full?" he asked. The students answered yes. Then he poured in pebbles, which settled into the gaps. Again, he asked, and again they said yes. Next, he poured in sand, filling every remaining space.

Then the professor explained, "The jar represents your life. If you start with the small, urgent things, there will be no room for what matters most." Had he started with the sand, the pebbles, and the rocks would never have fit.

Life is like that jar. True joy comes when we patiently place the first thing first, trusting that everything else will fall into its proper place. I love being a priest. JMJ.






