Reflections from Our Rector



Dear People of God,

Fr. Med Laz shared the following wonderful reflection ... Please read and pass it on ...

In the book, *The Fourth Quarter of Your Life*, Matthew Kelly says that he once spent quite a bit of time with a group of hospice nurses. He wondered over and over again, "How do they do it?"

One day at lunch, Kelly was sitting with five or six hospice nurses, and he asked them, "When people are dying, what do they talk about?" The nurses told him that when people are dying, they say how they would have wished they had lived their lives differently.

Here is a sampling of what the nurses shared with Kelly: 24 things dying people wished they had done differently:

- ✖ I wish I'd had the courage to just be myself.
- ✖ I wish I had spent more time with the people I love.
- ✖ I wish I had made spirituality a higher priority.
- ✖ I wish I hadn't spent so much time working.
- ✖ I wish I had discovered my purpose earlier.
- ✖ I wish I had learned to express my feelings more.
- ✖ I wish I hadn't spent so much time worrying about things that never happened.
- ✖ I wish I had taken more risks.
- ✖ I wish I had cared less about what other people thought.
- ✖ I wish I had realized earlier that happiness is a choice.
- ✖ I wish I had loved more.
- ✖ I wish I had taken better care of myself.
- ✖ I wish I had been a better spouse.
- ✖ I wish I had paid less attention to other people's expectations.
- ✖ I wish I had quit my job and found something I really enjoyed doing.
- ✖ I wish I'd had more children.
- ✖ I wish I had touched more lives.
- ✖ I wish I had thought about life's big questions earlier.
- ✖ I wish I had traveled more.
- ✖ I wish I had lived more for the moment.
- ✖ I wish I had pursued more of my dreams.

For these people, it is too late, but for us, there is still time — make each day count.

And more food for thought...

U.S. Mint Philadelphia — Nov. 12, 2025. After 232 years of penny manufacturing, the last penny was struck on this date. It is only the second U.S. coin to be discontinued; the other discontinued coin was the half cent in 1857.

We remember that a "shiny new penny" was an incentive to complete a task when we were very young. Even now, we still feel the urge to bend down to pick up a random penny.

- ✖ The sweetest penny memory is that of the various candies that fit the description of "penny candy" (e.g., stick candy, candy buttons, lollipops, taffy, jawbreakers, licorice).
- ✖ Try to get these lyrics out of your head: "Every time it rains, it rains pennies from heaven. Don't you know each cloud contains Pennies from heaven?" Bing sang it in 1936, Sinatra in 1956, and Rod Stewart in 2024.
- ✖ To our dear family and friends, we say, "A penny for your thoughts" because we treasure you.
- ✖ A penny is a symbol of good luck and prosperity. Do you remember receiving a wallet or purse as a gift and finding a shiny penny inside (put there by the giver who wished this Lucky Penny would bring you good fortune)?
- ✖ How many times have you heard the Ben Franklin comment on thrift: "A penny saved is a penny earned," which emphasizes that saving money is just as important as earning it?
- ✖ So, Penny Pinchers, what are you gonna do now?
- ✖ Penny loafers enjoyed popularity over the decades (particularly in the 1950s and 1960s). At one point, a penny in each shoe meant the wearer had the funds to make a local 2-cent call from a phone booth.

Final penny thought — When Mother Teresa was leaving her monastery to start the Sisters of Charity, she had two pennies. She was asked by a head priest what she could possibly do with two pennies. She said, "Nothing. But with two pennies and God, I can do anything."



Lent is Near! Come to Our Weekly Five-Part Parish Mission

Next Wednesday (Feb. 18) marks the start of Lent with Ash Wednesday, a day of fasting and abstinence. Please consult our website or the facing page of this bulletin (page 4) for the Ash Wednesday schedule. Lent centers on prayer, fasting, and almsgiving; this year, I invite you to focus especially on prayer through participation in our Lenten Mission.

A parish mission is a time for the whole community to slow down and reflect together on a theme. In previous years, our missions have lasted 2 or 3 consecutive nights. Recently, we welcomed Fr. Tom McCarthy, OSA; Bishop Jerry Kicanas, retired Bishop of Tucson; and Sister Barbara Reid, O.P., former president of Catholic Theological Union. This year, the Cathedral is taking a different approach. We will have a Lenten mission each Wednesday evening throughout the season.

The theme of our parish mission this year is “Behold the Lamb.” This comes from John the Baptist’s words in the Gospel of John. He points and says, “Behold the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world” (John 1:29). It is also linked to our liturgy. At the conclusion of the Lamb of God, the priest holds up the fraction host and chalice and says, “Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world, blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.”

This Lent, as a community celebrating 150 years as the Cathedral dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus, we are invited to behold the One we worship and serve. Each week, we will focus on a different dimension of Jesus as the Lamb and feature a different member of our clergy, who will provide a talk on the designated theme:

- ✖ **Behold His Mercy** (Feb. 25) — Fr. Greg Sakowicz
- ✖ **Behold His Sacrifice** (March 4) — Fr. Louis Cameli
- ✖ **Behold His Love** (March 11) — Deacon Dan Welter



✖ **Behold His Victory** (March 18) — Fr. Ton Nguyen

✖ **Behold His Presence** (March 25) — Fr. Andy Matijevic

The Lenten mission each Wednesday will begin with our regular Mass at 5:15pm. We will then transition into the talk by a priest or deacon from 6:00pm to about 6:45pm. After the talk, a devotional prayer opportunity, such as the rosary or Eucharistic Adoration, will be led by one of our many active ministries.

As we prepare for Lent and Ash Wednesday next week, I encourage you to plan now for this meaningful journey. Check the schedule for Ash Wednesday services, and mark your calendar for our Wednesday evening Lenten Mission gatherings. Whether you attend one session or join us for all five, each evening offers a profound opportunity to deepen your faith and draw closer to Christ. Remember that the ashes you receive are not merely a ritual for a single day — they mark the beginning of a 40-day call to conversion, inviting us to fully embrace prayer, fasting, and almsgiving throughout the entire season.

I warmly invite you to join us for this transformative Lenten journey. Together, as the Cathedral community celebrating 150 years, let us Behold the Lamb who redeems us. Through these Wednesday gatherings, we will pray together, support one another, and fix our eyes on Christ as we prepare our hearts for the joy of Easter.


The YA Retreat with the theme Back to the First Love has truly been a blessing.




