# Reflections from Our Rector



## Dear People of God,

This Wednesday begins our Lenten Season. On Ash Wednesday, we are marked with ashes, reminding us we are sinners in need of God's love, mercy and forgiveness. Lent is a time of change and growing closer to the Lord Jesus. What are those areas in your life

that keep you from being the person you want to be?

I share a powerful story ... Please read and pass it on ...

### The Hospital Window

Two seriously ill men shared the same hospital room. One of them was allowed to sit for an hour in the afternoon to drain the fluid from his lungs. His bed was next to the only window in the room. The other had to lie on his back without moving.

They talked incessantly, day after day, of the most varied topics and, above all, of their experiences. Each afternoon, when the man next to the window sat down, he described to his roommate everything he saw outside.

Over time, the man lying on his back, who could not peek out of the window, looked forward to the time each day during which he enjoyed his partner's stories.

The window overlooked a large park with a beautiful lake. Ducks and swans glided through the water, while the children played on the shore. The lovers walked hand in hand between gardens with flowers of all colors and majestic trees. At the bottom of this landscape, in the distance, a beautiful view of the city, with its monuments, was cut out against the sky.

When the patient at the window described all this in detail, his roommate closed his eyes and imagined

himself smiling broadly. One afternoon, he described a parade that passed through the hospital door, although he could not hear the band, it was almost as if he had seen it.

Another afternoon, he relayed a game played by children in front, with their goals and everything. On another occasion, he told him precisely how people were dressed and what they were doing when they passed by on their comings and goings.

Virtually every time, he told him something different. This was how it continued in the evenings, days, and weeks.

One morning, the nurse, upon entering the room for the daily cleaning, encountered the dead body of the patient at the window, who had apparently died quietly in his sleep.

The next day, the other man asked to be moved near the window. The nurse made the change and, after ensuring he was comfortable, left him alone. The man, with much effort and pain, leaned on one elbow to be able to look at the outside world for the first time since his arrival at the hospital. He could finally see everything for himself!

Once he got up, he looked out the window, and all he saw was the gray wall of a building. Confused and sad at the same time, he called the nurse and asked if he knew why his dead companion had tricked him by describing so many wonderful and different things from what was seen through the window.

The nurse replied, "Your friend was blind. He couldn't even see the opposite wall. He told me one day that he was doing it to lift your spirits."

Portraying human beings as animals – less than human – is not new.

It was a common way in past centuries for politicians and others to demean immigrant groups as each arrived, the Chinese, Irish, Italians, Slavs, Jews, Latinos and so on. Cartoons, “news” articles, even theatrical productions carried the message that these “others” were worthy of ridicule.

It made it easier to turn a blind eye to their privation, pay them pitiful wages and mock their “foreign” religion even as the country needed their labor. It immunized the national conscience when we turned away shiploads of refugees, lynched thousands and doomed generations to poverty.

We tell ourselves that those days belong in the past – that even sharing that history is harmful to the fantasy of equality we strive to create.

A few days ago, we saw that in the White House such blatant racism is not merely a practice of the past. If the President intentionally approved the message containing viciously racist images, he should admit it. If he did not know of it originally, he should explain why he let his staff describe the public outcry over their transmission as fake outrage.

Either way he should apologize. Our shock is real. So is our outrage. Nothing less than an unequivocal apology – to the nation and to the persons demeaned – is acceptable.

And it must come immediately.

# How to Redirect Your Heart During This Lenten Season

**T**his Wednesday, Feb. 18, is Ash Wednesday. The Church will begin our journey through the desert in preparation for Easter Sunday. The ritual of marking ourselves with ashes as a sign of repentance from sin goes back to the Old Testament. Ashes are a sign of humility and repentance, of recognizing our sinfulness and desiring to be made new in God's sight. Throughout the Old Testament, many people marked themselves with ashes as they recognized their sinfulness and their need to change their ways (cf. 2 Samuel 13:19; Esther 4:1,3; Job 42:6; Jeremiah 6:26). The use of ashes in our Catholic tradition links us to our Old Testament roots.

Attending Mass or a prayer service on Ash Wednesday to get ashes on our forehead to "show off" to our co-workers, family members, or people on the street, that we are Christians, is not the spirituality of this day. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of our Lenten journey of ongoing conversion and repentance. It should be said that Ash Wednesday is not a Holy Day of Obligation. If you are unable to attend Mass or a service, you are not in mortal sin. It is a way for us as individuals to realize we are sinners, we are mortal, we are dust. But with God, through our baptism and profession of faith in Jesus Christ, we are redeemed and set free from sin and death. The use of ashes is a tangible reminder that we cannot do life alone. There is always a need for renewal and repentance. By journeying in the desert with Jesus for 40 days, we will be able to focus on renewing our spiritual lives.

Lent is known by the three pillars of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Through prayer, we renew our relationship with God. We recognize more deeply how we need to become more dependent on God, on his love and his mercy for us. By fasting, we try to detach ourselves from worldly allurements and desires. We give things up during Lent so we can turn our attention back to God, who



fulfills all of our desires. By almsgiving, we seek to help those among us who cannot help themselves, restore the common humanity we all share, and seek to be agents of solidarity and accompaniment. Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving should redirect our hearts and minds towards God. They assist us in this sacred time to change our ways. Above all, they remind us that we are dust and shall return to dust, calling us to repent and believe in the Gospel.

The Cathedral will be offering Rice Bowls as a practical way to give alms during the Lenten season. The proceeds of our almsgiving will benefit Catholic Relief Services. This is the official relief and development agency of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. The money raised through Rice Bowls helps communities in over 100 countries alleviate the strain of poverty. We will collect the rice bowls during Holy Week.

As we enter into this sacred season, may we be renewed in our hearts and minds, that through the cross that is traced on our foreheads in ashes, we are saved, and made free through the sacrifice of Christ, and promised eternal life through our baptism.

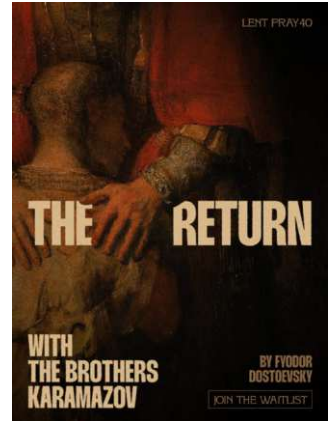
### 'Pray40: The Return' Starts Ash Wednesday

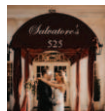
