# Reflections from Our Rector



## Dear People of God,

God does not need Lent — we do! Our Lenten journey to the cross continues. We are marked as Christians (the word christian, in its earliest understanding, meant follower of the Way of the Cross) to remember who we are and

who we hope to become. We are

challenged as God's holy people to grow, change, and walk more closely with the Lord Jesus.

The keeping of Lent remains the Christian Community's best hope of staying in touch with its roots while continually expanding its vision to more fully embrace the loving message of Jesus. In truth, Lent begins with Easter. The "forty days" we label Lent exist to help us focus our minds and hearts more intently on the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus — a mystery we live day by day through our struggles and joys. We keep Lent so that as a Faith Community our brokenness may be healed into wholeness, and through that wholeness an experience of holiness may be ours as we enter into the celebration of Holy Week.

Lent is forty days "lent" to us to focus the energy of our hearts on deepening our relationship with God. The place of our encounter with God resides within our hearts.

Lent is forty days long because it takes time to grow and change. To lose weight takes time, to develop a profound friendship takes time, and, like all journeys, it begins with a first step. Lent is both a time for individual reflection and a time to walk together as God's Holy People. Ponder, pray, and more deeply connect with the mystery of God's presence in our lives.

Lent is a wonderful opportunity to slow down and spend time — even 10 minutes a day — in reading, prayer, and silence.

"Silence of the heart is necessary so you can  
hear God everywhere --

in the closing of a door, in the person who  
needs you, in the birds that sing, in the flowers,  
in the animals.

What is essential is not what we say but what  
God tells us and what

He tells others through us.

In silence, He listens to us; in silence,  
He speaks to our souls.

In silence, we are granted the privilege  
of listening to His voice.

To make possible true inner silence, practice."

The bleakness of winter and its cold and clouds always give way to spring and new life. Our Lenten journey to the cross does not end with the cross but gives way to the bright promise of eternal life — The Easter Promise.

A well-known speaker started off his seminar by holding up a \$20 bill. In the room of 200, he asked, "Who would like this \$20 bill?" Hands started going up. He said, "I am going to give this \$20 to one of you, but first, let me do this."

He proceeded to crumple up the \$20 dollar bill. He then asked, "Who still wants it?" Still, the hands were up in the air. "Well," he replied, "What if I do this?" And he dropped it on the ground and started to grind it into the floor with his shoe. He picked it up, now crumpled and dirty. "Now, who still wants it?" Still, the hands went up.

"My friends, we have all learned a very valuable lesson. No matter what I did with the money, you still wanted it because it didn't lose value. It was still worth \$20. Many times in our lives, we are dropped, crumpled, and ground into the dirt by the decisions we make and the circumstances that come our way. We may feel as though we are worthless. But no matter what has happened or what will happen, you will never lose your value.

"Dirty or clean, crumpled or finely creased, you are still priceless to those who do love you. The worth of our lives comes not in what we do or who we know, but in who we are.

"You are special, don't ever forget it. Most of all, you are special to the God who gave you the life you are living."

And always remember, no matter how many steps we take away from God, it only takes one step to get back to God.


## Join our HNC Lenten Challenge on Hallow

## Catholic Illuminations

### Next Step for the OCIA: Time for the Rite of Election

**A** cathedral in the diocese is known for many liturgical celebrations that are important to the life of the diocese. Examples include priesthood and diaconate ordinations. At these, men are ordained to serve God’s people. Another is the Chrism Mass, where the bishop blesses the oils we use for our Sacraments: Chrism, Oil of the Sick, and Oil of the Catechumens. These oils are then distributed to the parishes. Last year, the cathedral also hosted the ordination of new auxiliary bishops. But one event that is often overlooked or neglected is the Rite of Election. This event takes place at the beginning of Lent each year and is important to the life of the local Church.



This weekend and next weekend, Holy Name Cathedral is hosting the Archdiocesan Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion. At this liturgical celebration, those desiring to be baptized into the Church at this upcoming Easter Vigil, as well as those seeking to be fully initiated or complete their Sacraments of Initiation, come before the Bishop to reaffirm their intention to be admitted to the Church through the Sacraments of Initiation. Up to this point, the catechumens – specifically those desiring Christian Initiation – have undergone a long period of formation of the heart and mind.

Now the Church discerns their state of preparedness. “In this step, the Church makes her ‘Election,’ or the choice and admission of catechumens who by their dispositions are fit to take part in the next celebration of the Sacraments of Initiation” (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults, #118-119).

The whole Archdiocese is represented at this liturgical event. People from Cook and Lake counties come together to be received into the Church for the Easter Sacraments. As each catechumen’s and candidate’s name is called in the rite, their name echoes throughout the Cathedral. Their names join with so many others who have been found worthy to participate in the Paschal

Mystery of Christ – the passion, death, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus – through the Sacraments.

After the Rite of Election and until Holy Saturday, the catechumens are called “the elect.” They have been ‘elected’ to participate in the Sacraments of Initiation at the Great Vigil of Easter: Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. As the bishop says, “Trusting in their judgment, the Church calls you in the name of Christ to the Pascal Sacraments” (OCIA, #132). Those who will be fully received or fully initiated will continue to deepen their desire to encounter Christ more fully through the Sacraments of the Catholic Church.

We, as a Cathedral Parish, have a duty to pray for our brothers and sisters who will be baptized into the Church on Holy Saturday at the Easter Vigil. They will soon call the cathedral their mother church, no matter which parish they belong to in the Archdiocese. Specifically, in our Holy Name Cathedral Parish, we have 22 catechumens seeking all three Sacraments of Initiation. We also have 19 candidates seeking full reception or initiation into the Church. Let us then be mindful during this Lenten season to pray for those preparing to enter into Christ’s passion, death, resurrection, and ascension. Let us celebrate with them the joy of Easter, when they conquer sin and death with our Lord – the same victory we share by our own baptism.


