# Reflections from Our Rector



**Dear People of God,**

We are all sinners. We're all imperfect. Our imperfection is the crack in the armor, the "wound" that lets God into our hearts and lives. As Master Eckhart wrote almost seven hundred years ago: "To get at the core of God at His greatest, one must first get into the core of himself/herself at their least."

To truly be followers of Jesus -- to be His disciples -- means we reach out and be Christ to all our sisters and brothers. As we continue our Lenten journey, the following story poignantly captures the importance of reaching out from where we stand in life.

A farmer had some puppies he needed to sell. He painted a sign advertising the pups and set about nailing it to a post on the edge of his yard. As he was driving the last nail into the post, he felt a tug on his overalls. He looked down into the eyes of a little boy.

"Mister," he said, "I want to buy one of your puppies." "Well," said the farmer, as he rubbed the sweat off the back of his neck. "These puppies come from fine parents and cost a good deal of money."

The boy dropped his head for a moment. Then, reaching deep into his pockets, he pulled out a handful of change and held it up to the farmer.

"I've got thirty-nine cents. Is that enough to take a look?" "Sure," said the farmer. And with that, he let out a whistle. "Here, Dolly!" he called. Out of the doghouse and down the ramp ran Dolly, followed by little balls of fur.

The little boy pressed his face against the chain link fence. His eyes danced with delight.

As the dogs made their way to the fence, the little boy noticed something else stirring inside the doghouse. Slowly, another little ball appeared, this one noticeably smaller. Down the ramp it slid. Then, in a somewhat awkward manner, the little pup began hobbling towards the others, doing its best to catch up.

"I want that one," the little boy said, pointing to the runt. The farmer knelt down at the boy's side and said, "Son,

you don't want that puppy. He will never be able to run and play with you as these other dogs would."

With that, the little boy stepped back from the fence, reached down, and began rolling up one of his trouser legs. In doing so, he revealed a steel brace running down both sides of his leg, attached to a specially made shoe. Looking back up at the farmer, he said, "You see, sir, I don't run too well myself, and he will need someone who understands."

This Lenten journey, open your hands in love and forgiveness -- the same way our Lord Jesus opens His hands in love and forgiveness to touch us.

And spend some time each day reflecting upon these wisdom thoughts:

Remember the five simple rules to be happy:

1. Free your heart from hatred and learn to forgive.
2. Free your mind from worries.
3. Live simply.
4. Give more.
5. Live for others in Christ and try to walk in their shoes.

# It's Time for Passiontide, the Final Movement of Lent

**W**ith the Fifth Sunday of Lent, we enter into Passiontide, the final movement of our Lenten journey. The readings in our daily Masses turn the focus on the immediate approach of the Lord's passion and the darkness that surrounds God's dying in the flesh.



These two weeks prepare us for the sorrow we will experience and feel at the passion and death of Jesus. It has been a common practice in the Catholic Church since about the year 900 to veil crosses, statues, and images with purple cloth as a psychological reminder to help the faithful concentrate more on the salvific events that will soon take place.

Along with the daily Gospels and the option of veiling crosses, images, and statues, the Preface before the Eucharistic Prayer is also changed. Preface I of the Passion of the Lord is said Monday through Saturday of the 5th Week of Lent. Preface II of the Passion of the Lord is said Monday through Wednesday of Holy Week, with Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, and Holy Saturday (Easter Vigil) having their own proper preface for the day as well. Preface I of the Passion focuses on the power of the cross, while Preface II focuses on the victory of Christ's passion. As an aside, there are over 30 different Prefaces in the Roman Missal for particular seasons and days.

The practice of veiling statues, images, and crosses was generally discontinued after the Second Vatican Council. However, each national Episcopal Conference has the right to allow veiling of statues, images, and crosses in churches. Here in the United States, each pastor has the right to make use of the practice of veiling crosses, images, and statues beginning the 5th Sunday of Lent, with crosses remaining covered until the end of the celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday, and statues and images remaining covered until the beginning of the Easter Vigil.


Passiontide is meant to invite us to deepen our awareness of the events that will soon unfold in our liturgies and in our spiritual lives through the Gospel readings and Prefaces. Jesus of Nazareth, God in the flesh, will soon enter into Jerusalem amid shouts of exultation, saying "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord," only to have those same people shout, "Crucify him!" a few days later. Passiontide is a gift from the Church to prepare us for the Holy Triduum, the Paschal Mystery of Jesus: his passion, death, resurrection, and ascension. Passiontide is a reminder that we are sinners, but that we also have a savior who shed his blood to ransom us from sin and death. Are we ready to walk with our Lord?

Our full Holy Week schedule is available in the bulletin (look left on page 4) and on our website. All are welcome to join us on Palm Sunday, next Sunday, March 29, at 3:00pm for Stations of the Cross and an hour of Eucharistic Adoration to prepare our hearts and minds for Holy Week and the saving acts that will take place. As we heard in the second reading on Ash Wednesday, St. Paul's words ring true to this day: Now is a very acceptable time, now is the day of salvation!

This Lent, our parish invites you into a five-week journey of prayer, reflection, and service as we fix our eyes on Jesus, the Lamb of God.




