Reflections from Our Rector



Dear People of God,

Our journey to the cross with the Lord continues. We have begun Holy Week. All of us are invited

to enter more deeply into the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ --especially this week. Will this week be like any other in our life? Will we make time (especially this week) to slow down and pray alone and pray with others in Church during our Holy Week celebrations?

As we begin our Holy Week journey together, I offer this reflection given to me several years ago. Read...and pass it on...

On the day I die, a lot will happen. A lot will change.

The world will be busy.

On the day I die, all the important appointments I made will be left unattended.

The many plans I had yet to complete will remain forever undone.

The calendar that ruled so many of my days will now be irrelevant to me.

All the material things I so chased and guarded and treasured will be left in the hands of others to care for or discard.

The words of my critics, which so burdened me, will cease to sting or capture me anymore. They will be unable to touch me.

The arguments I believed I'd won here will not serve me or bring me

any satisfaction or solace.

All my noisy incoming notifications, texts, and calls will go unanswered.

Their great urgency will be quieted.

My many nagging regrets will all be resigned to the past, where they should have been all along.

Every superficial worry about my body that I ever labored over -- about my waistline or hairline or frown lines -- will fade away.

My carefully crafted image, the one I worked so hard to shape for others here, will be left to them to complete anyway

The sterling reputation I once struggled so greatly to maintain will be of little concern for me anymore.

All the small and large anxieties that stole sleep from me each night will be rendered powerless. The deep and towering mysteries about life and death that so consumed my mind will finally be clarified in a way that they could never be before, while I lived.

These things will certainly all be true on the day I die.

Yet for as much as will happen on that day, one more thing will happen.

On the day I die, the few people who really know and truly love me will grieve deeply.

They will feel a void.

They will feel cheated.

They will not feel ready.

They will feel as though a part of them has died, too.

And on that day, more than anything

in the world, they will want more time with me.

I know this from those I love and grieve over.

And so, knowing this, while I am still alive, I'll try to remember that my time with them is finite and fleeting and so very precious -- and I'll do my best not to waste a second of it.

I'll try not to squander a priceless moment worrying about all the other things that will happen on the day I die, because many of those things are either not my concern or beyond my control.

Friends, those other things have an insidious way of keeping you from living even as you live, vying for your attention, competing for your affections.

They rob you of the joy of this unrepeatable, uncontainable, ever-evaporating now with those who love you and want only to share it with you.

Don't miss the chance to dance with them while you can.

It's easy to waste so much daylight in the days before you die.

Don't let your life be stolen every day by all that you believe matters, because on the day you die, much of it simply won't.

Yes, you and I will die one day.

But before that day comes, let us live.

Great food for thought as we begin Holy Week. Make every effort to celebrate the Triduum with us!

Catholic Illuminations

Welcome to Holy Week, the Most Sacred Time in the Church

We enter into a sacred time this week. Holy Week is very symbolic for our life of faith. We enter Jerusalem with the crowds waving palms as Jesus enters the Holy City. On Tuesday, the priests and parish representatives of the Archdiocese gather for the Chrism Mass, where the priests renew their priestly promises, and Cardinal Cupich blesses the three oils – Sacred Chrism, Oil of the Sick, and Oil of the Catechumens - that will be distributed throughout the Archdiocese for Sacramental use until Holy Week 2027. Thursday marks the beginning of the Sacred Triduum, the three holiest days of the year, commemorating the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus of Nazareth.

The Triduum is three days, each with a distinct character on this continuous journey. We begin in the Upper Room on Holy Thursday evening with the celebration of the Lord's Supper. Only one Mass may be celebrated in each church on this day. The Mass does not end with the final blessing, but moves to the altar of repose, a representation of Christ in the garden, and also in prison awaiting trial. We watch and pray with our Lord as he awaits his condemnation by Pilate. Our Cathedral will be open until Midnight on Holy Thursday to allow many people to come and spend time in prayer.

Good Friday is the only day of the year when Holy Mass is not celebrated. The Service of the Lord's Passion is simply that, a service. The Eucharist that is offered during the service is consecrated at Mass on Holy Thursday. The Good Friday service does not begin with the sign of the cross, because it is a continuation of the liturgy on Holy Thursday, nor does it end with a final blessing, but in silence, because God has died in the flesh.

On Holy Saturday, just like Holy Thursday, there is only one mass celebrated in each church: the Great Vigil of Easter. This Mass does not begin with an entrance procession inside; instead, it begins outside the church with the



blessing of the fire to light the newly blessed Easter candle. Only at the end of the Easter Vigil does the priest celebrant give a final blessing, concluding the three holy days, with the joy of “Go, and announce the Gospel of the Lord.”

One service, however, that is often overlooked, is Tenebrae. At the Cathedral, our Tenebrae service is held on Wednesday, April 1, at 7:00pm. Tenebrae is a religious service that uses psalms and light as a tangible preparation for the Triduum. With each psalm or reading, a candle is extinguished, and the light dimmed, until the final candle in the darkened church is taken away, only to return after the great “strepitus” or earthquake. The Christ candle shows us that even death cannot extinguish the light.

Additionally, today, on Palm Sunday, we will pray the Stations of the Cross at 3:00pm and offer a Holy Hour of Eucharistic Adoration from 3:30pm to 4:30pm, to spiritually prepare ourselves for these sacred days. As we enter into Holy Week, the Worship Council invites you to join us during these sacred days to deepen your encounter with the Lord and with others, as we walk with him through his passion, death, and resurrection.

Coming to Easter Mass at HNC? Here's What to Know

In preparation for celebrating the Lord's Resurrection, Holy Name Cathedral will follow these measures to ensure safe, welcoming worship for our parishioners and visitors who join us for Masses on Easter Day.

Line up on State Street

All will be asked to line up outside on State Street. The line will begin at the staircase and flow backwards north on State towards the FXW school building and Chicago Ave. The center doors on State Street will open at 6:30am for the first Mass at 7:00am (handicap and stroller access available on the corner of State and Superior). There will be no saving pews, so we ask that all members of your family/group be present to enter the Cathedral together.

Overflow Masses

Overflow Easter Sunday Masses will be held at 8:45am and 10:45am in the Auditorium. These overflow Masses will offer complete, music-filled liturgies, similar to those held in the Cathedral. When the Cathedral has reached capacity, anyone who has not entered will be guided to the Auditorium for these overflow Masses. Please note that the 8:45am and 10:45am Auditorium Masses are the only overflow options available for Easter liturgies.

Easter Vigil Mass

For the Easter Vigil, the Cathedral will open at 7pm. Everyone is invited to go outside, if they wish, for the blessing of the fire at 7:45pm. Mass will begin outside at 8pm. If you choose to go outside, you may not have the same pew upon return.

For the 7:00am Easter Day Mass, the Cathedral doors will open at 6:30am. For all other Easter Masses, everyone must remain outside until participants from the previous Mass have exited. We encourage families to stand in line together, as saving pews is not permitted due to the expected high attendance.

Thank you for understanding and for joining us for the Easter celebration at Holy Name Cathedral. These measures will ensure accurate seating for our liturgies and less congestion between Masses. The Cathedral staff thanks everyone for joining us for these sacred liturgies and for your cooperation.

Unexpected Holy Encounters

On the way back from Northwestern Hospital after an anointing, I saw a senior parishioner — we will call him Joe. I greeted him, “Hi Joe, how are you today?” He smiled and said, “Father Ton, it’s great that you stopped.” Then he added something that has stayed with me: “You remind me of Jesus. One day I will meet Him. I hope He will stop and ask me how I am doing — and I hope I can say I am doing well and I am ready.” I was moved not only by his words, but by his faith. In that moment, I realized I was the one being blessed. I found myself hoping that when my own encounter with Christ comes, I might have the same peace and readiness as Joe.




I name that conversation as a holy encounter — an unexpected moment where Christ seemed to pause time and speak through another. As we enter Holy Week, the Scriptures are filled with such encounters, often hidden in small details we easily overlook.

Consider the unnamed people who owned the donkey. They simply let it go when told, “The Master has need of it.” Their quiet “yes” made possible the triumphal entry. Or the disciples who spread cloaks on the road — ordinary gestures that became acts of worship.

In Gethsemane, we see another encounter: Jesus in agony, yet turning to the Father in trust. Even in suffering, communion remains. Nearby, the disciples sleep — a reminder of how often we miss sacred moments because we are not watchful. At the arrest, a servant’s ear is cut off — and Jesus heals him. Even amid violence, Christ restores. On Calvary, a centurion, a pagan outsider, encounters the truth and proclaims, “Truly, this was the Son of God.” Grace breaks through where we least expect it.

St. Augustine once said, “Fear the passing of God.” Not because God abandons us, but because He often comes quietly, in passing moments. Like Joe, may we remain attentive, ready to recognize Christ in every encounter. I love being a priest. MJJ.


