Dear People of God,

Our beautiful Holy Week celebration of Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter (Vigil) was a powerful expression of faith through word, music, environment, and silence.

our Lenten Season, Holy Week, and Easter Liturgies so meaningful, beautiful, and prayerful expressions of faith. God has truly blessed me through all of you. May we be a blessing to each other because life is good and we are called by our Easter faith to make it even better. Thank you! Thank you! Thank you!

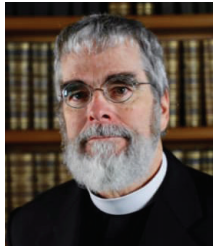

Experience God's Divine Mercy Daily – Not Just This Sunday

On April 30, 2000, St. Pope John Paul II canonized Sister Faustina Kowalska, a Polish religious mystic who died in 1938. In the early 1930's, Sister Faustina reported apparitions of Jesus, which were later approved by the Vatican as authentic. Eventually, St. Faustina spoke with an artist who painted the image we know today. The image of Jesus walking towards us, pulling back a part of his white gown, and blue and red rays coming from his Sacred Heart is known today as the image of Divine Mercy. Below is the saying, "Jesus, I trust in You."



Since the canonization in 2000, the Second Sunday of Easter is known as Divine Mercy Sunday. This important celebration directly follows the story of St. Faustina. Additionally, it is the final day in the Octave of Easter. Our liturgical year contains two octaves: the Christmas Octave and the Easter Octave. An octave allows us to celebrate for 8 days what is first celebrated on a single day.

For eight days, the joy of Christmas and the joy of Easter are observed – God becoming man, and God rising from the dead – two pivotal moments of our faith. Each octave culminates on its 8th day, emphasizing the essence of the season. For Christmas, that day is January 1st, formerly celebrated as the naming of Jesus but now as the feast of Mary, Mother of God, underscoring the belief in the Incarnation. For Easter, the octave closes with Divine Mercy Sunday, which marks the triumph of love over the grave.

This climax in the celebration of Divine Mercy is unique because it allows us to see that participating in the paschal mystery, the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus, is an act of mercy and love. Because through this participation, we are forgiven, redeemed, set free, and encountered by God's unfailing love and mercy, and also sent forth to share that with others.

Devotion to the Divine Mercy of God includes the Divine Mercy Chaplet, inspired by Jesus' apparitions to St. Faustina. The chaplet uses a regular rosary and is similar in its practice of repetition, repeating the same prayer on all the Hail Mary beads and on the Our Father beads. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy is an easy way to remind ourselves of God's endless mercy as we say, "Eternal Father, I offer you the body, blood, soul and divinity of your dearly beloved Son, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world," as well as "For the sake of his sorrowful passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world."

Every Sunday is a mini-Easter, a reminder of God's never-failing mercy toward us. As Jesus is risen and offers us a share in his divine life through baptism, his mercy is available to us each and every day. Through our baptism and new life in Christ, we are called to share his love and mercy with others every day. Let us always be reminded that with the Resurrection, God's mercy has conquered the grave. In every dark moment, may we remember that Jesus walks toward us with open arms, inviting us to receive his Divine Mercy and eternal life.

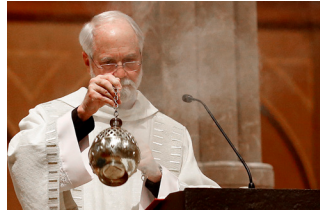
Holy Week at Holy Name

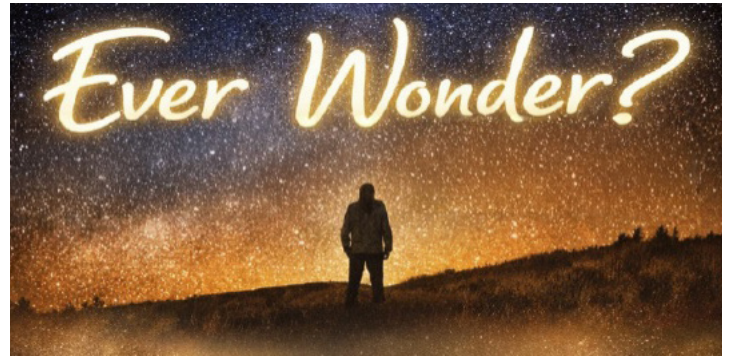
