Excerpts from a Cat's Diary

Day 983 of my captivity:

My captors continue to taunt me with bizarre little dangling objects. They dine lavishly on fresh meat, while the other inmates and I are fed hash or some sort of dry nuggets. Although I make my contempt for the rations perfectly clear, I nevertheless must eat something in order to keep up my strength.

The only thing that keeps me going is my dream of escape. In an attempt to disgust them, I once again vomited on the carpet.

Today I decapitated a mouse and dropped its headless body at their feet. I hoped this would strike fear into their hearts, since it clearly demonstrates what I am capable of. However, they merely made condescending comments about what a “good little hunter” I am. Jerks!

There was some sort of assembly of their accomplices tonight. I was placed in solitary confinement for the duration of the event. However, I could hear the noises and smell the food. I overheard that my confinement was due to the power of “allergies.” I must learn what this means and how to use it to my advantage.

Day 984 of my captivity:

Today, I was almost successful in an attempt to take out one of my tormentors by weaving around his feet as he was walking. I must try this again tomorrow –but at the top of the stairs.

I am convinced that the other prisoners here are flunkies and snitches. The dog receives special privileges. He is regularly released – and seems more than willing to return. He is obviously crazy.

The bird has got to be an informant. I observe him communicating regularly with the guards. I am certain that he reports my every move. My captors have arranged protective custody for him in an elevated cell, so he is safe...FOR NOW!!

Newlyweds are excited about an *unknown* future, but *know* they will enter it together.

Doctors and nurses, once certified, know their field of expertise/ education, but the faces and lives they meet personalize their practice and take away the anonymity. For priests, not much different. Our *unknown* future is entered with the Lord; the lives we encounter change us and form us. What a blessing these 50 years have been; an answer to the prayers of a rookie!

Most unusual for a Chicago diocesan priest to reside for 31 years at the same parish. My 3+ decades here have nothing to do with charisma, exceptional people skills or theological scholarship. As longtime parishioners may recall, spanning 2002 and 2003, I underwent eight eye surgeries (Remember those 18 months when I wore an eyepatch? Then known as the *Pirate Padre?*). My extended stay has been the *hospitality* offered by our Rectors and the *kindness* of our parishioners. For both, I am most grateful.

As I look back at my Wednesday, May 12, 1976 Ordination and my Friday, May 14 First Mass, I am aware that so many of the people so important to me *then* (Parents, Family, Seminary Classmates, and Friends) are *now* on the eternal side of life, and that my life is populated by people whom the Lord



arranged for me to cross their paths over these many years....that is, *you*.

When I pray aloud Psalm 116 at Mass (Verse 12 & 13 above), **you** are '*all that the Lord has given to me*', and all that I can offer in return is to keep you in prayer, every day, everywhere. And that is what I am doing today; I am out of town, at the Grotto at Lourdes, praying for you.

Fr. Greg has asked me several times these past two years to schedule a parish anniversary Mass and reception. I appreciate his and your offers, but I'll wait until my 60th.

Catholic Illuminations

Unpack the Mysteries with our New Catholics this Sunday

Often in our secular world, we celebrate a holiday, then quickly move on to the next event. However, the Church's liturgical calendar invites us to a deeper rhythm. Easter, for example, is not just a single day on the calendar — it's a season of ongoing celebration and renewal. The Easter Octave, eight days of continuous joy, culminates in Divine Mercy Sunday, reminding us that the Resurrection is meant to shape our lives long after the holiday itself.



While we continue to celebrate the joy of Easter, it's important to remember that this season is also about the growth of our Church. Each year at the Easter Vigil, adults who have journeyed through months of preparation are fully initiated into the Catholic faith. The period after this celebration is called Mystagogy — a time for all of us, not just the newly initiated, to reflect on and deepen our understanding of the mysteries we celebrate.

Mystagogy means 'unpacking the mysteries' — an ongoing process for every Catholic. Our liturgies are rich with signs, symbols, and gestures, and it's easy to let their deeper meanings slip by. During this time, new Catholics gather to reflect on their experiences, but all of us — whether newly received or Cradle Catholics — are invited to reflect on how God is working in our lives and calling us to greater faith. As one priest wisely said, there are no perfect Catholics, only practicing ones.

With that said, one of the beautiful traditions of our faith is gathering new Catholics of the local church for Mass with their bishop. The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA) ritual says, "To begin pastoral contact with the new members of his Church, the Bishop, particularly if he was not able to preside at the Sacraments of Initiation, should see to it that at least once a year, insofar as it can be done, he meets the recently baptized neophytes and presides for a celebration of the Eucharist at which they may receive Communion under both kinds." (OCIA, #251).

It is important to welcome one another into the local community, and when the bishop is present, the fullness of the Church is manifest, as an early Church Father, St. Ignatius of Antioch, preached.

This Sunday, April 19, after an extended hiatus, the Cathedral will welcome newly initiated and received Catholics from across the Archdiocese for a special Mass with Cardinal Cupich at 2:30pm. The last time these individuals gathered at the Cathedral was for the Rite of Election at the beginning of Lent. Now, all are invited — recently initiated, lifelong Catholics, and everyone in between — to join in this celebration of the Eucharist with our local shepherd, Cardinal Cupich. Let's fill the Cathedral in joyful witness to the living Church.

If you are able, please join us for this special Mass to welcome our new brothers and sisters in faith. In Chicago alone, 1,059 people were initiated and fully received this Easter — a powerful witness that the Church is alive and growing. As we continue journeying through the Easter season, may we all remember that the Resurrection is not just an event to commemorate, but a reality to live and celebrate together, every day.

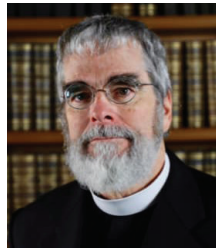

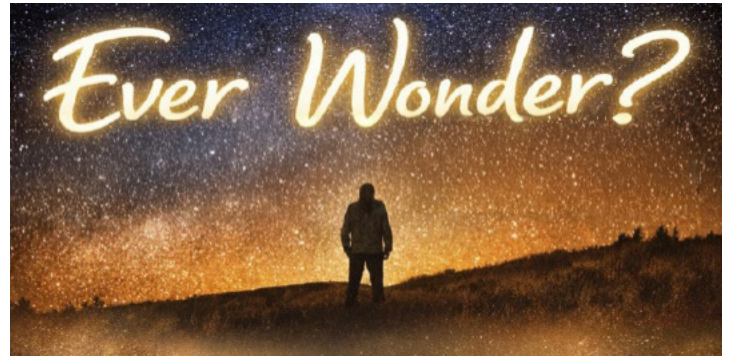

Who Interrupts Your Walk?

It was one of those perfect days when I was enjoying a peaceful walk along the lakefront when my phone rang. It was my sister who is a Visitation nun. We began sharing the joy of Easter: how many people have returned to Mass, how the number of converts has been growing this year. Then I shifted the conversation. I began to share some of my struggles — those quiet frustrations of preaching the Gospel while trying, imperfectly, to live what I preach.

Before I could go on, she interrupted “No one is born a Catholic. A child is brought to the Church by parents for baptism. Others discover the faith, search for understanding, and only when they are ready do they take that step. No one is born a religious sister or a married couple — it takes time, discernment, and growth.” Then she added something I won’t forget: “No Christian can confidently say their faith is perfect. Faith is always maturing. My dear brother, after meditating on the Holy Scripture and preparing your homily without a set agenda, but under the influence of the Holy Spirit, don’t beat yourself up if you can’t live out the message perfectly. Take it as an opportunity for humility to grow and for your faith to become more mature.”

I do have a wise sister, don’t I? As we reflect on today’s Gospel, the two disciples on the road to Emmaus were also walking — away from Jerusalem, away from hope, carrying confusion and doubt. Their expectations had been shattered. And then an interruption. Jesus joined their journey and accepted them as they were. He accompanied and helped them unpack the mystery of being a Christian. Then the transformation happened at the breaking of the bread. So the invitation for us is to allow holy interruptions on our walk, so that the Lord can walk us. It takes humility to see where we are, with both our imperfections and strengths. It also takes humility to accept one another where we are, and in accompanying one another, we share a common goal: the journey toward sainthood. I love being a priest. JMJ.

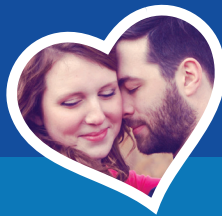


