Reflections from Our Rector



Dear People of God,

April is almost over. The flowers are slowly blooming, trees are budding, and spring bird migration is gaining steam. Our Easter season continues, and Easter speaks of new life and change. The most constant in life is change!

Our God is always loving, forgiving, and present, though much of what surrounds us keeps changing. New beginnings, change, and dreams are exciting, and the Lord Jesus is always at our side.

Up, a 2009 delightful movie from the animation wizards at Pixar, begins with one of the most touching and poetic four minutes ever seen in the movies – all told without a word of dialogue.

A quiet, shy kid named Carl meets Ellie, a real spitfire. They both dream of being explorers, of going on great adventures to faraway places. Ellie and Carl grow up, fall in love, marry, and transform a ramshackle house into their dream home. They save their loose change in a glass jug for their dream trip – but real life gets in the way: work, home, car repairs, and medical bills. But they are happy. And in an instant, they are celebrating their 50th wedding anniversary. Soon after, Ellie succumbs to cancer, leaving the grieving Carl lost and alone.

After Ellie is gone, Carl finds “My Adventure Book,” the scrapbook Ellie kept since they were children. The first pages are filled with the silly, funny treasures and memories of childhood. Then there is a page Ellie has labeled “Stuff I’m Going to Do.” On these pages, Ellie planned to chronicle her dream trip with Carl. Carl is stung with remorse that he never kept his promise to Ellie to take her on such a trip. But as Carl turns the page, he sees that Ellie has collected pictures of their life together – their wedding, working side by side on their house, the simple joys of going out for ice cream together. Under one of the pictures taken of the two of them together, Ellie has written: “Carl, thanks for the great adventure -- Go and have a new one! Love, Ellie.”

Carl realizes that he and Ellie have indeed shared a great adventure: they dreamed together, faced and survived

crushing disappointments together, and grew happily old together.

Love and friendship are life’s great adventure.

Our Easter season is also a celebration of love and friendship with the Lord Jesus. Another great adventure of life is to look into the face of a loved one and see the face of God. This also occurs when we reach out to help others. The whole thrust of the Jesus story is living as a servant – helping others in the name of the Lord.

Easter Season is a joyous celebration of life so abundant we call it eternal. Easter is lived through love, friendship, and life-giving relationships – life’s great adventure. Easter joy!

It is important that we gather as a Faith Community weekly around the Table of the Lord. Yet, when someone is absent, the community suffers. We are nourished by the Word of God, the Bread of Life, and the Cup of Salvation.

In the movie *Up*, Carl and Ellie have found the deeper meaning of life. They discovered that true joy is not driven by “perishable” material things, but by the “non-perishable” values of God. They have discovered what hopefully all of us have discovered – that the “fast food” that is out there doesn’t satisfy. Rather, our hearts are thirsting for deeper meaning, and ultimately for Jesus Christ, the “food that endures forever.”

The Lord Jesus promises us strength, hope, Eucharist, and forgiveness on the journey, and the Lord promises us eternal life. If you get a better offer -- take it!

On Good Shepherd Sunday, Pray for Increase in Vocations

Each year, on the Fourth Sunday of Easter, the Church celebrates Good Shepherd Sunday and World Day of Prayer for Vocations. The theme comes from the Gospel, taken from John 10, where Jesus describes himself as the Good Shepherd.

And because of this, we also take the time to pray for vocations. But Good Shepherd Sunday is more than just focusing on priestly vocations. Priests are important to our Catholic faith because without priests, we would not have the Sacraments, and without the Sacraments, we would not have an encounter with God in word and gesture. But Good Shepherd Sunday makes us stop to reflect on the deeper vocation, to be holy.

The word vocation comes from the Latin word “vocare,” which means to call. And the call to serve God’s people as a priest is an important call to hear. My own vocational discernment began 23 years ago while preparing for my First Holy Communion in Palatine. I heard the call of Jesus at my First Communion Mass to be a priest, and it has been a wonderful journey since. But the call to be holy began 30 years ago in the waters of baptism.

When people say we need to pray for vocations, it is often assumed that this means praying only for priests. And yes, we need priests. The shortage of priests and the rising demands placed upon them should make us pause and remember that priests are people too, who have bad days, cannot do everything requested of them, and get tired from the demands made of them. But to authentically pray for vocations is to pray for priests, deacons, religious, married couples, and single people, all aiming towards holiness, which will bring us to the halls of heaven for eternity.

Jesus says in the Gospel, “Whoever enters through me will be saved” (John 10:9). Jesus is the ultimate witness of answering the call God gives us. As we continue to walk in the joy of this Easter season and bask in the resurrected glory of his only begotten Son, we also



remember that we renewed our baptismal promises on that joyful Easter morning. When we renounced sin and professed faith in God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Good Shepherd Sunday reminds us that we all have to listen to the voice of Jesus. To enter through him as the gate, to eternal life. To emulate his life in our world today. And yes, that may be difficult, to love and forgive and serve and encounter saint and sinner alike. Our vocations are different, the path through the gate varies from person to person, but the call is the same, the Shepherd is the same, and the pasture we are called to is eternal.

As we move deeper into this season of renewal, allow yourself to listen to the voice of the Good Shepherd who calls us by name, who offers us eternal life, and who uniquely calls us as priests, deacons, religious, married and single individuals to build up that kingdom here and now, so we can enjoy the pastures of heaven, for eternity.

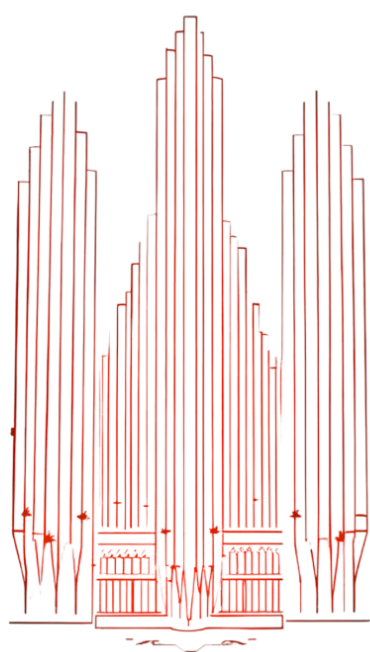

How Does One Recognize God's Call to the Priesthood?

As I made my way around the room during the 150th Anniversary Celebration last November, a parishioner approached me and said, "I still remember you talking about singing and composing poems for cows." I thought to myself, When did I ever do that?

Thankfully, she gave more context. She was referring to a bulletin article I had written when I first arrived at the Cathedral. Growing up on a farm in a rural village, the parish priest seemed like a superhero to me. He "made" Jesus present at Mass, knew so much about Him, sang beautifully, gave candies to children, and taught us not only about faith but also about how to live. When neighbors argued over land, he would step in, bring peace, and reconcile everyone. I wanted to be like him. So during summer breaks, while taking care of the cows, I would compose simple songs and poems and sing to them. One of those songs went like this:

*Do you see the green fields over there?
The Lord is your Good Shepherd, calling you with care.
He will lead you to pastures fresh and wide,
Where peace and gentle waters ever abide...*

If I had shared this "theology" with my professors at

Mundelein Seminary, I might not have passed! And of course, God did not speak to me through talking animals like in cartoons. But the seed of a priestly vocation had already been planted in my heart through my parish priest.

After college, I stayed in Ho Chi Minh City to work. Then one very "odd" day changed everything. During a lunch break, I ran an errand for my sister and stopped at a convent. The sisters assumed I was a seminarian. After I explained myself, they simply said, "You will become one." That same evening, a restaurant chef greeted me, "Hello, seminarian! What would you like to eat?" Later that night, as I often did, I stopped by a church to pray. Standing before the Sacred Heart, I felt a quiet but powerful invitation within my heart: "Are you ready to be my priest? What are you waiting for?" That was the moment that moved me to begin seriously discerning my vocation.

This Sunday, as we celebrate Good Shepherd Sunday and the World Day of Prayer for Vocations, I invite you to pray, especially as we have seen a great increase in Catholics this Easter. The harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few. Will you answer God's call, and if you notice someone who may have a vocation, will you encourage them? Never underestimate the power of a simple invitation, for sometimes that is all the Lord needs to raise up shepherds after His own heart. I love being a priest. JMJ.

Special Session on Sunday, May 17 at 4:00 pm in the Club Room

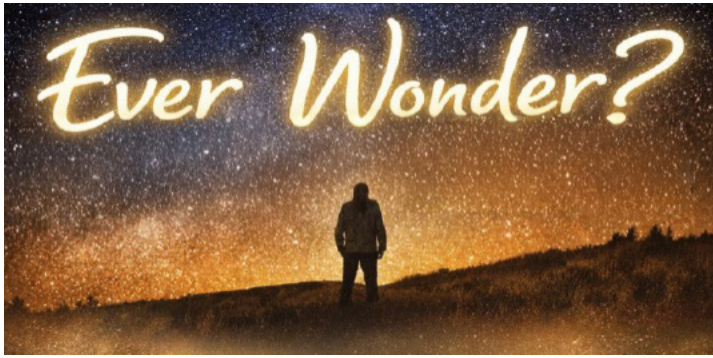

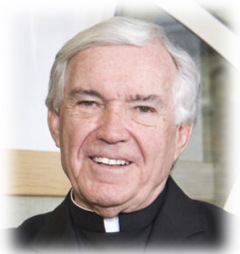

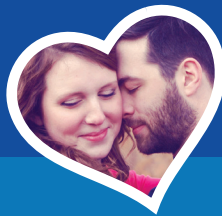
