Reflections from Our Rector



Dear People of God,

Our Easter Season continues, rooted in new life, beginnings, and trust — a theme beautifully illustrated by the story below. Enjoy ...

God Lives Under the Bed

I envy Kevin. My brother, Kevin, thinks God lives under his bed. At least that's what I heard him say one night. He was praying aloud in his dark bedroom, and I stopped to listen. "Are you there, God?" he said. "Where are you? Oh, I see. Under the bed..."

I giggled softly and tiptoed off to my own room. Kevin's unique perspectives are often a source of amusement. But that night, something else lingered after the humor. I realized for the first time the different world Kevin lives in.

He was born 30 years ago and is developmentally challenged due to labor difficulties. Aside from his 6'2" frame, he shows few signs of adulthood.

He reasons and communicates as a seven-year-old and will likely always believe that God lives under his bed, that Santa Claus fills the space under our tree each Christmas, and that angels carry airplanes.

I remember wondering if Kevin realizes he is different. Is he ever dissatisfied with his monotonous life?

Each day begins before dawn: work at a workshop for the disabled, walking our cocker spaniel, macaroni and cheese for dinner, then bed.

Laundry is the only routine change — he hovers over the washing machine excitedly, like a mother with her newborn. He seems content, eagerly catching his 7:05 bus each morning for a simple day's work.

He wrings his hands with excitement as the water boils before dinner, and twice a week, he stays up late gathering laundry for the next day's chores.

And Saturdays — oh, the bliss of Saturdays! That's the day my Dad takes Kevin to the airport to get a soft drink, watch the planes land, and loudly speculate about each passenger's destination. "That one's goin' to Chi-car-go!" Kevin shouts as he claps his hands. His anticipation is so great that he can hardly sleep on Friday nights.

So goes his world: daily rituals and weekend field trips.

He doesn't know what it means to be discontent.

His life is simple —

He'll never know the entanglements of wealth or power. Brand names or fancy meals mean nothing to him. His needs are met, and he never worries about the future.

His hands are diligent. Kevin is never happier than when he is working. When he unloads the dishwasher or vacuums the carpet, his heart is completely in it.

He does not shrink from a job once begun, and he does not leave it until it is finished. But when his tasks are done, Kevin knows how to relax.

He is not obsessed with his work or the work of others. His heart is pure.

He still believes everyone tells the truth, promises must be kept, and when you are wrong, you apologize instead of arguing.

Free from pride and unconcerned with appearances, Kevin is not afraid to cry when he is hurt, angry, or sorry. He is always transparent, always sincere. And he trusts God.

Not confined by intellectual reasoning, Kevin approaches Christ as a child. He seems to know God as a close friend in a way that's difficult for an "educated" person to grasp.

In moments of doubt with my Christianity, I envy Kevin's simple faith. He may possess divine understanding beyond my questions. I realize he might not be the one with the real disability; perhaps I am. Obligations, fear, pride, and circumstances can become disabilities when I don't trust God's care.

Who knows if Kevin understands what I can't? He's spent his life in innocence, praying and soaking up God's goodness and love.

One day, when the mysteries of heaven are opened, and we are all amazed at how close God really is to our hearts, I'll realize that God heard the simple prayers of a boy who believed that God lived under his bed.

Sometimes our lives get too complicated. Trust in God, who pursues us. Life also calls for surrender and letting go... and maybe, take a peek under your bed.

The Blessed Mother's 'Yes' Continues to Provide Inspiration

The month of May is traditionally dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary. As Catholics, it is important to understand and reiterate the fact that we do not worship Mary. We worship God alone. We honor Mary and hold her in high esteem for her role in salvation history. It was Mary's Yes to the angel Gabriel's request that she be the Mother of God that changed the world. At that moment, God entered our frail humanity by taking on our flesh.



Because of Mary's Yes, God was able to redeem humanity by taking on our human nature. We honor Mary, who shows us how to say Yes to God, how to trust in the unknown, and how to draw closer to Jesus. As we celebrate Mother's Day in May, it is only right to then dedicate the entire month of May to our Blessed Mother.

It is Mary who is our mother, given to us by her son Jesus as he hung on the cross. It is Mary who is our model for being disciples, always trusting, never fearing, walking with our Lord, knowing he is in control. It is Mary who guides us on this journey of life, for she has experienced both suffering and joy. Suffering in seeing her husband die, and her son be crucified. Joy is encountering her son risen from the dead, and his message spreading throughout the known world. Mary understands us and comes to us in our lives to help us grow in our relationship with her son. She never points to herself, but always to Jesus.

All artwork depicting our Blessed Mother reflects the belief that she always points to Jesus. This stems from the Gospel found in John 2, when Jesus turns water into wine. She goes to her son to say they have no wine, and then goes to the servers and says, "Do whatever he tells you" (John 2:5). Mary always points us to her son. She shows us in her life that the life of a disciple is not about us, but about Jesus.

Throughout this month, there are various ways to honor Mary. Perhaps pray the rosary, or even a decade of the rosary. Go to a Marian shrine in Chicago, such as the Basilica of Our Lady of Sorrows, Marytown, or the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Des Plaines. Maybe look up the Litany of Loretto and find a Marian title that speaks to you. Or attend a May crowning ceremony or even crown an image or statue of Mary in your home.

This Wednesday, May 6, at the 5:15pm Mass, we will pay tribute to our Blessed Mother with our annual May Crowning. All are welcome to bring a bouquet of flowers to offer to her in thanksgiving during the ritual. Join us as we honor our Blessed Mother as we bring flowers of the rarest to crown her with blossoms, Queen of the Angels and Queen of the May.

Who Are the New Leaders for St. Thérèse Gardening Ministry?

As St. Paul once said, “I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth.” We are reminded that while each of us plays a role, it is ultimately God who guides and sustains all things. As many of you know, I will be moving on from our parish this summer. Some have asked, “Who will care for the garden?” The answer is simple: God already has a plan. I am grateful to Stanley Smith for stepping into leadership, with Martin Scaglione and Luke Harada serving as co-leaders.

For those who are new to the St. Thérèse Garden Ministry: often described as a spiritual oasis, the ministry provides a peaceful place for prayer, tranquil spaces for parishioners, and a warm, welcoming respite for friends and neighbors. The Garden Ministry promotes fellowship, supports the community, and encourages growth in holiness in the spirit of St. Thérèse: “doing small things with great love.”

Members gather to plant and care for the Cathedral courtyard and surrounding planters, as well as assist



with simple campus clean-up. You do not need gardening experience to participate — if you enjoy being outdoors and engaging in light physical activity, this ministry may be a great fit for you. Typically, the gardening leader emails members to invite them to help from early April through the end of October. Occasionally, we also gather during the planting season for special projects, such as planting annual flowerbeds or making seasonal updates.

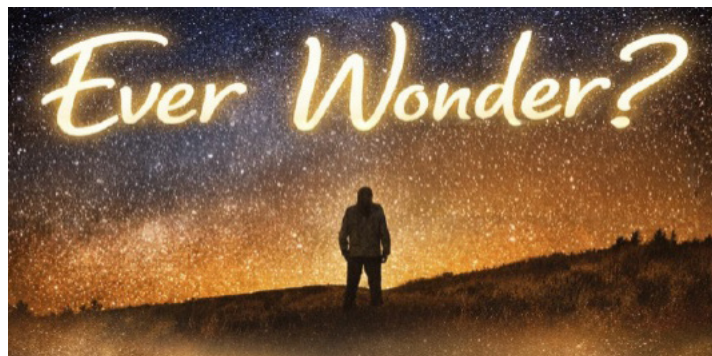

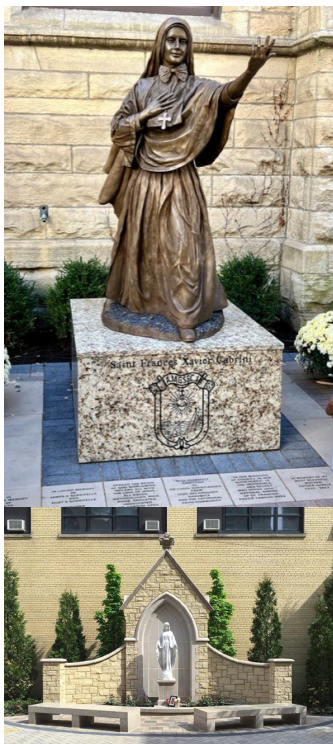
Honor A Loved One with a Mother Cabrini or a Courtyard Paver

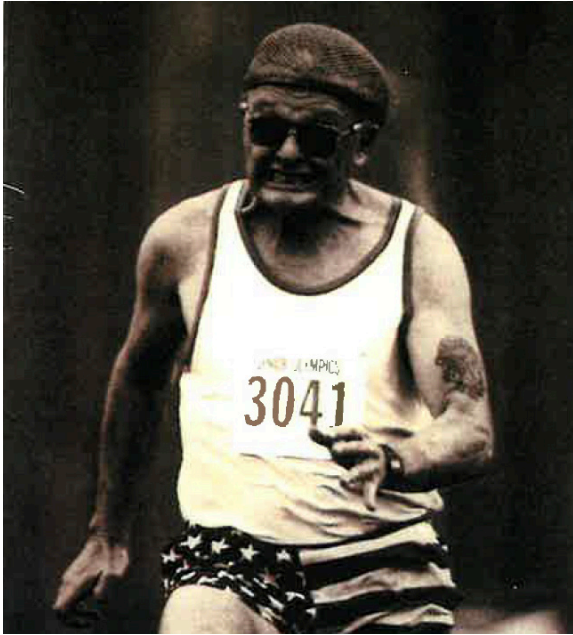


