Research continues to show the positive impact of spiritual practices and exercise on mental health. Prayer, reflection, and communal support can foster a sense of purpose and belonging.

Regular exercise and mental health are also closely connected. Physical activity can reduce stress symptoms by boosting mood-related brain chemicals, such as endorphins, and supporting processes like neuroplasticity. At the same time, good mental health

Who is the World's First Love?

Did I really enjoy final exams growing up? That might sound strange. Was I a bookworm? Not exactly. I grew up in a small village, studying at night by the light of an oil lamp. Truly, it wasn't that long ago for me. But each year, when final exams came, something special happened: my mother would buy our favorite snacks to cheer us on. Suddenly, exams didn't feel so dreadful. They became a time filled with encouragement, warmth, and love. That is why I remember them fondly.

As the years passed, I saw an even deeper expression of love in my family. When my older sister was in high school, she felt called to enter the convent. This decision brought significant financial responsibility — tuition, room, board, and other expenses. Despite our struggles, my mother gently persuaded my father to sell our property so my sister could pursue her vocation. It was a hard choice, but one made out of love and faith.

That commitment shaped us all. When my sister entered a contemplative community in France with the Visitation Sisters, we saw how love could cross any distance. Twice a year, she was allowed a 30-minute phone call with the family. Those conversations always began simply: "Hello, my dear daughter." "Hello, Mom." For much of



the time, they cried together. Few words were spoken, yet everything was understood. Their love needed no explanation. In those moments, I experienced what I now call the world's first love — the selfless, sacrificial love of a mother.

This experience deepened when I read *The World's First Love* by Fulton J. Sheen, a book I recommend. He writes: "A tiny architect works inside the human heart, drawing sketches of the ideal love... Life becomes satisfying the moment the dream is seen walking, and the person appears as the incarnation of all that one loved." He also reminds us, "As our love does not start with Mary, so neither does it stop with Mary. Mary is a window through which our humanity first catches a glimpse of Divinity on earth."

As we celebrate Mother's Day this weekend, we give thanks for all mothers — for their sacrifices, their faith, and their love that reflects God's own love. Through them, we catch a glimpse of something greater.

For those who may find it difficult to relate, let us remember that we can always turn to our heavenly mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary, who leads us to her Son. As St. Peter

encourages us, "Sanctify Christ as Lord in your hearts." May we love the Lord with all our minds and hearts and help one another grow in holiness.

Happy Mother's Day to all moms. Thank you for your beautiful vocation and for showing us the world's first love. JMJ. I love being a priest.

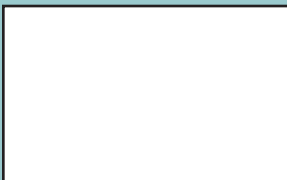


