# Reflections from Our Rector



## Dear People of God,

The Spirit of the Lord is upon us! The Feast of Pentecost celebrates images of the Holy Spirit: sometimes a tongue of fire, as in the Pentecost story, more often a hovering dove. But there is another way to imagine this gift of the risen Jesus: the word 'spirit' itself.

In Greek, the word for "spirit" is identical to the word for wind or breath. Wind, breath, spirit — all the same! Even deeper, it is God's own breath of life. And do we let the Spirit of God take our breath away?

The Feast of Pentecost – a feast celebrating the Spirit upon and with each one of us – means we do not walk through life alone. The Lord Jesus is with us, and the Spirit of the Lord is upon us!

What does the Spirit of life – wind and breath – look like? What difference should this Spirit make in our lives – and in the lives of those we touch? The following two powerful stories are filled with a profound spirit – wind – breath. Like the baseball slogan once proclaimed, "Baseball fever - Catch it!" Catch the Spirit of the Lord and become breath and wind to all those we meet.

### True Love and Happiness

It was a busy morning, approximately 8:30am, when an elderly gentleman in his 80s arrived to have stitches removed from his thumb. He stated that he was in a hurry as he had an appointment at 9:00am.

I took his vital signs and had him take a seat, knowing it would be over an hour before someone would be able to see him. I saw him looking at his watch and decided, since I was not busy with another patient, I would evaluate his wound.

On examination, it was well-healed, so I spoke with one of the doctors and obtained the necessary supplies to remove his sutures and redress his wound.

While taking care of his wound, we began to talk. I asked him if he had a doctor's appointment this morning, as he was in such a hurry. The gentleman told me no, that he needed to go to the nursing home to eat breakfast with his wife.

I inquired as to her health. He told me that she had been there for a while and that she had been diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease. As we talked and I finished dressing

his wound, I asked if she would be worried if he was a bit late. He replied that she no longer knew who he was, that she had not recognized him in five years.

I was surprised and asked him, "And you still go every morning, even though she doesn't know who you are?" He smiled as he patted my hand and said, "She doesn't know me, but I still know who she is."

I had to hold back tears as he left. I had goose bumps on my arm and thought. "That is the kind of love I want in my life." True love is neither physical nor romantic. True love is an acceptance of all that is, has been, will be, and will not be.

"The happiest of people don't necessarily have the best of everything: they just make the best of everything that comes their way."

And speaking of blessings, I'd like to share this with you:

But the man did not hear.

"God, speak to me!"

# Happy Pentecost, the Foundation of all We Do as Christians

**W**ith the Feast of Pentecost, our 50-day celebration of Easter concludes with the promise Jesus made before his Ascension: that he will send us an Advocate – the Holy Spirit. For the past 50 days, we have joyfully celebrated the power of the Resurrection. Now, as we move into Ordinary Time, the longest consecutive liturgical season of the liturgical cycle, we know Jesus is still risen from the dead. We know that he is still at work in the world through the Spirit, which proceeds from the Father and the Son. We know that he is still with us, in a new reality.



The Spirit at work in our lives is found throughout the New Testament. St. Paul writes repeatedly that the Spirit is crucial to our lives as disciples. In his Letter to the Romans, Paul says that “if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also through his Spirit that dwells in you” (Rom 8:11). In his Letter to the Corinthians, he speaks of how there are different gifts and talents, but they all come from the same Spirit (1 Cor 12). Another example is in his Letter to the Thessalonians, where he says that we should not quench the Spirit (1 Thess 5:19), showing us that the Spirit moves us to worship, to ministry, to service.

Pentecost is not just another day in our liturgical season. It is the foundation of everything we do as Christians. It was at Pentecost that the Apostles were impelled to leave the upper room and proclaim the Good News. It was Pentecost that fulfilled Jesus’ promise to send an Advocate after he ascended to the Father. It was at Pentecost that the Church was born.

In 2018, Pope Francis added a memorial to the General Roman Calendar. The Monday after Pentecost is now the Memorial of Mary, Mother of the Church. Mary was with the Apostles as they kept vigil in the upper room after Jesus ascended into heaven. Mary was at the foot of the

Cross. Mary was there when Jesus was placed in the manger in Bethlehem. Mary is a constant presence in the early Church. By celebrating Mary, Mother of the Church, the day after Pentecost, we recognize the role she played in salvation history. That through her obedience to God’s Will, the Law, the Word was made flesh and dwelt among us (John 1:14). We celebrate Mary because without her presence along the journey of the early Church, we would not be here today. We honor Mary because, through her life, she teaches us how to follow Jesus faithfully.

As we enter into the season of Ordinary Time, which will remain uninterrupted until Advent, which begins on Sunday, November 29 this year, let us use these many weeks of the liturgical year to deepen our relationship with Jesus Christ, who suffered, died, rose again from the dead, ascended into heaven, and with the Father, sent us the gift of the Holy Spirit. Let us also look to Mary, the Mother of the Church, to guide us closer to her son, and to say with confidence as she did to whatever God asks of us, “May it be done to me according to your Word” (Luke 1:38). Come, Holy Spirit, and renew the face of the earth as we seek to proclaim the Good News to the world.

## The Stump of Jesse

### *I Prefer Heaven (Part 2 of 5): Start with a Simple Idea*

In one of his Lenten reflections, Fr. Roberto Pasolini recalls a beautiful story from the life of St. Francis of Assisi. At a hermitage above Borgo San Sepolcro, Franciscan friars lived quietly in prayer. Nearby, however, a group of brigands hid in the woods, often robbing travelers passing through the area. Sometimes these robbers would come to the friars asking for bread, but eventually the friars stopped helping them because of their violence and aggressiveness.



One day, St. Francis arrived and proposed something unexpected. He told the friars, “Take good bread and good wine to them in the woods. Call out to them gently: ‘Brother brigands, come to us. We are friars, and we bring you bread and wine.’ Then spread a cloth on the ground and serve them with humility and joy until they have eaten.” Only afterward, Francis said, should they speak to the brigands about God and ask one simple thing: that they no longer harm anyone. Francis understood something profound about the human heart. When we demand everything at once, people often close themselves off. But when someone experiences hospitality, respect, and mercy, the heart slowly begins to open. The friars listened. In time, some of the robbers entered the Franciscan Order. Others changed their way of life. At the very least, several promised to abandon violence.

Reflecting on this story, Fr. Pasolini writes: “You cannot

ask someone to change their ways before you have allowed them to experience hospitality, respect and trust... We must create the space for the desire and the call for a change of life to arise. Only then can what is said be truly heard.” What a lesson for us, right?

We often think mission begins with speaking, teaching, or correcting others. But Pentecost reminds us that mission starts much earlier — with humility, patience, and presence. Jesus sends His disciples not first to conquer, but simply to be received. We are not bringing God where He is absent; we are learning to notice where He is already at work. In daily life, mission usually looks ordinary: kindness, patience, listening, and faithfulness in small things. When Christ truly lives within us, people begin to notice — not because we speak loudly, but because we live differently. The Spirit still sends us today. We simply need to be available.

I think of St. Philip Neri. As a young man, he dreamed of becoming a missionary in India. While waiting for permission, he spent his days serving the poor and gathering children from the streets of Rome. Slowly, almost without realizing it, he began forming what would become the Oratory — a place where people could pray, laugh, learn, and grow closer to God together. Eventually, when the opportunity finally came for him to go to India, Saint Philip realized something beautiful. God had already given him his mission. “My India is right here,” he said.

Sometimes holiness begins not with grand plans, but with the simple idea of loving the people God has already placed before us. I love being a priest. JMJ

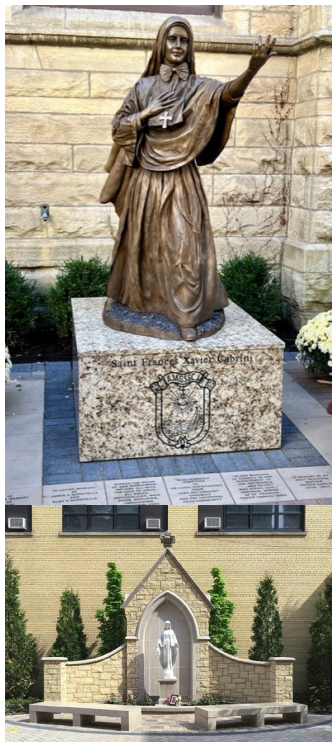
## Honor A Loved One with a Mother Cabrini or Courtyard Commemorative Paver

## New Audio Assistance at Holy Name Cathedral

We are pleased to introduce our new Audio Listening System, ListenWIFI, that you can use with your smartphone. Here’s how to use the wireless Assisted Listening System with your Smart Phone.

### Step 1:



On your smartphone (iPhone or Android), open your camera app and scan this QR code at left to connect to the church Wi-Fi network.

### Step 2

Scan the QR Code at right to download the free Listen Wi-Fi App — if you already have the app, there is no need to download it again — skip to step 3.

Open the app on your phone and hit the play button when it appears! (once the app is downloaded, you need only turn it on and hit the play button on your screen)

At Holy Name Cathedral, our Resurrection Cross is unique. Sculpted out of one piece of wood and suspended over the altar, artist Ivo Demetz created our Resurrection Cross in 1969. It is unique because Christ is not depicted in agony, but rather triumphant in glory.
