Reflections from Our Rector



Dear People of God,
I share three vignettes this week for your food for thought. Enjoy and pass them on...

Shipwreck

The only survivor of a shipwreck was washed up on a small, uninhabited island. He prayed feverishly for God to rescue him, and every day he scanned the horizon for help, but none seemed forthcoming.

Exhausted, he eventually managed to build a little hut out of driftwood to protect himself from the elements and store his few possessions. But one day, after scavenging for food, he arrived home to find his little hut in flames, the smoke rolling up to the sky. The worst had happened — everything was lost. He was stunned with grief and anger. “God, how could you do this to me!” he cried.

Early the next day, however, he was awakened by the sound of a ship that was approaching the island. It had come to rescue him. “How did you know I was here? Asked the weary man of his rescuers. “We saw your smoke signal,” they replied.

It is easy to get discouraged when things are going bad, but we shouldn't lose heart because God is at work in our lives, even amid pain and suffering. So, remember, next time you feel your hut is burning to the ground, it just may be a smoke signal that summons the grace of God. No matter our age, God is our joy, hope, and peace. God steers our ship, and we need to trust.

The Secret of Soul

“I often describe my 11-year-old as an immovable slug of a boy, so when I asked him to help me unload dirt from our small pickup into his mother's new garden boxes, his reaction was typical. “Ummmm...I'm busy right now,” he said.

He was playing Roblox on the family laptop, wearing sweatpants and an old T-shirt, lounging on the sofa, and his feet on the coffee table.

“No, you are not,” I said.

There was a fight, moaning, excuses...the usual.

Moments later, we were next to a wheelbarrow, shoveling dirt. He looked at me with flat eyes, his hood up, shoulders slumped, and said, “Why do we have to do this?”

I thought for a moment, because I'll admit, it was a valid question. Neither of us were all that into flowers or vegetables, or any of the things that would be grown in those garden boxes. But my wife, Mel, loves gardening.

I thought, and he waited, and finally I said, “When you love someone, you serve them.”

I went on, telling him I want him to grow up to be the kind of man who serves his family, friends, and community.

“This,” I said, while gesturing to the dirt, and the garden boxes I built the weekend before, and the wheelbarrow and shovel, and the first of many truckloads of dirt we would unload over the next few weeks, “is what love looks like.”

He didn't like my answer. I could see it in the way he reluctantly picked his shovel back up. We finished unloading the dirt. The next day, while I was at work and the kids and Mel had the day off because it was between terms, Mel picked up another load of dirt, and before she had a chance to unload it, Tristan volunteered to work on it. When she asked him why, he shrugged and said, “Because I love you.”

I'd never been prouder of my son.

Where The Checkered Flag Meets The Cross

There are 8.15 billion souls, and the Lord knows each one by name. He knows every fear, every dream, even every hair on their head.

Yet if we're honest, division is woven into our nature. From the very beginning, humanity has fractured along the lines of race, religion, and pride. A "me first" mentality has carved the world into competing camps, leaving chaos and strife in its wake.

And still, in his creativity, God has wired us for community. Then he gave us sports.

Sports become bridges. They draw strangers into a unified roar, collapse differences in a single moment of celebration, and remind us that we were made for something together. For followers of Jesus, this is more than entertainment. It is an opportunity. It is a mission.

In the world of INDYCAR Racing, our mission field, there is real chaos, real division, real heartache. Yet beneath all of it burns a shared passion for racing that no rivalry can

extinguish. Week in and week out, we enter the track as missionaries, carrying the hope of Jesus into a culture that desperately needs it.

We pray with drivers before they strap in and accelerate toward 240 miles per hour. We stand with crews who change four tires in seven seconds, their hands constantly moving even as their hearts carry the sting of defeat. There is power in presence. God has opened the door. Racing is the meeting point, and his grace is what moves through it.

Now consider your seat in the stands. Whether it is an MLB stadium or a T-ball game on a Tuesday evening, what if you saw it not as a place of entertainment, but as your mission field? What if you became a bearer of the Kingdom right where you are?

The checkered flag waves. The crowd erupts. And somewhere in that roar, Jesus is already present.

Will you join him?

Why We Need a Capital Campaign at Holy Name Cathedral

With the public phase of the Cathedral Cornerstone Campaign in full swing, it is worth opening the case to parishioners and visitors alike to understand why this campaign is so important and which projects the generosity of those who give will support. To reiterate, our goal is \$12 million, and our campaign case will focus on three major areas: the structural integrity of the Cathedral, envisioning our future, and the Archdiocese of Chicago Generation to Generation Campaign.



Of the \$12 million, \$7.5 million will focus on the campaign's biggest need: the structural needs of the Cathedral building. The number one priority is the tuckpointing of the Cathedral. Over the past 150 years, Chicago's weather and the Joliet limestone from which our Cathedral is beautifully built have been eroding and cracking. Tuckpointing will reinforce the limestone, sealing the cracks in the stone, allowing the structure to stand for 150 more years.

The current light system, which uses outdated 500-watt bulbs, is currently being replaced with a completely new LED system. A gift to the Cathedral from the Archdiocese before the start of the campaign, the new lighting system will no doubt require ongoing maintenance to continue enhancing our worship space with clear, vibrant lighting.

With the Cathedral structurally sound through tuckpointing, and the lights switching from heated bulbs to cooler LED lights, the internal temperature will be better regulated by modernizing the controls to an outdated HVAC system.

Dating back to the early 1960s, the current system's iron coils and pneumatic controls do not provide stability in Chicago's ever-changing weather. With these updates, along with the new lights and sealed exterior, our beautiful Flentrop organ pipes will also be protected from the changing atmosphere, preventing unnecessary expansion and contraction caused by humidity.

My personal favorite aspect of these structural projects is a renewal of our sacristy. The sacristy is the place where the vessels, vestments, and ritual books are kept for the liturgies, where the lay ministers gather before Mass, and where the clergy prepare to lead people into an encounter with God through worship. The work will also address the kneelers utilized by priests, deacons, and liturgical ministers in the sanctuary. As the Cathedral, we welcome many guest clergy, and the sacristy needs a facelift. I have a sledgehammer ready for demo day, when given the green light, to bring renewal to this special place for the Worship Department and me!

Finally, the last aspect of these projects is to improve our courtyard gates and iron window guards on the Rectory office windows on the first floor. Also, this will address certain safety issues and bring the Rectory up to current safety codes.

These projects, undertaken to reinforce the Cathedral, remind us that if we do not have a Cathedral to worship in, we do not have the heartbeat for the Church in Chicago. The Cathedral is the center point, the mother, the beacon of light to the local church on how to witness and worship. It is also a wishful hope that when Chicago's son, Pope Leo, returns to the city, the Cathedral is ready to welcome him back with joy and stability.

As we work towards raising funds for our \$12 million goal, your generosity will no doubt help Holy Name Cathedral stand as a beacon of light and hope for 150 more years.

I Prefer Heaven (Part 5 of 5): The Perfect Harmony

If you have been following this series and still have not watched *Saint Philip Neri: I Prefer Heaven* or listened to its famous song, here is the heart of it. St. Philip wanted to build an Oratory where poor children could learn about God, pray, laugh, and simply belong. At one point, he was challenged to have the children perform for the Pope. Imagine the situation: children who did not know Latin, had little education, and certainly no formal music training. Humanly speaking, it sounded like a disaster waiting to happen. Providentially, a young visiting boy overheard the rehearsal and, knowing music, helped arrange the children according to their voices. And to Philip's credit, he listened. That alone is holiness sometimes, right? Listening.



Finally, the day came for the children to sing before the Pope. Everything was going well until the moment for the solo. The young boy froze after seeing his father in the crowd and suddenly could not sing a single note.

Silence..... Then, unexpectedly, Pierotto burst out singing: "Paradiso, paradiso, preferisco il paradiso..." One by one, the children joined in with all their hearts joyfully. Somehow, it was beautiful. Later, Saint Philip himself was asked to give a theological talk before learned theologians and the Pope. That sounds pretty terrifying, doesn't it? Yet Philip began with one simple word: "**Charity**."

That was his theology. That was his spirituality. That was

the rule of his community. As I finish my assignment at Holy Name Cathedral, this scene keeps returning to my heart. At the Cathedral, we come from many different places and walks of life: parishioners, visitors, priests, sisters, families, young adults, tourists, and curious souls wandering into the church for the first time. Some come with strong faith and overflowing joy. Others come carrying heavy hearts, quiet wounds, grief, confusion, or simply the hope that God might still speak to them. Some know all the prayers by heart. Others are just beginning to learn the melody of faith. And yet, somehow, God gathers all these imperfect voices together into one beautiful song of praise. That, to me, is the Church.

The song from the movie says: "There are those who think they are great and want to soar to the sky, who are so swept away and stuck up, believing themselves to be who knows what? Who dream of a great career, of taking their big bows and having their lackeys, Who always crave success and lots of honors. But for me, this won't do, that's not what makes me happy. I prefer Heaven."

After these years at the Cathedral, I understand that song a little more deeply. Thank you for allowing me to walk this journey with you. Thank you for your kindness, your generosity, your prayers, your encouragement, and even your feedback. You have helped shape me into a better priest after the heart of the Good Shepherd. As I move to my next assignment, please keep me in your prayers, as you will always remain in mine. And through it all, may we continue singing together: *Paradiso, paradiso, preferisco il paradiso*. I prefer Heaven. I love being a priest. JMJ.
