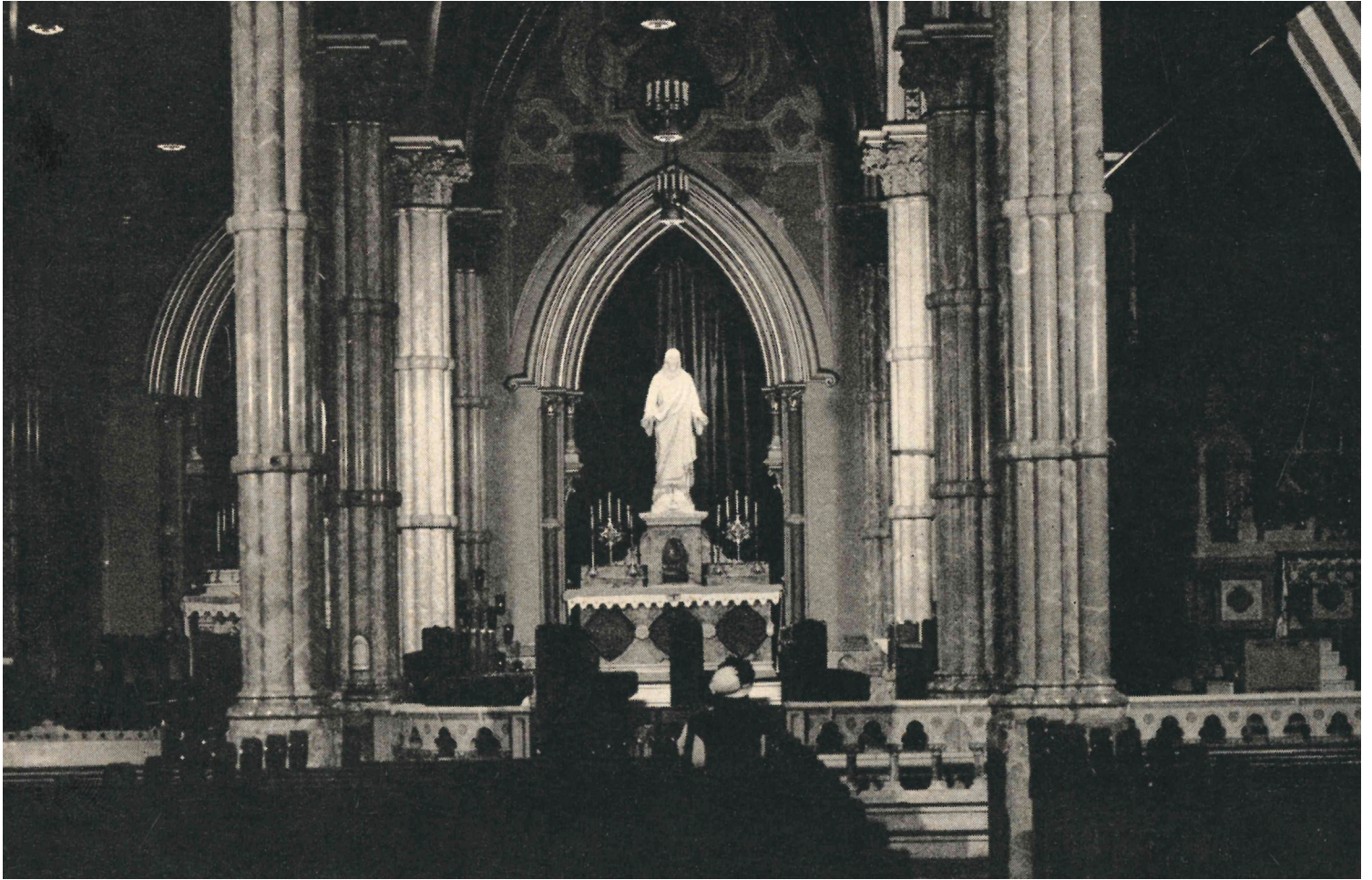

# Reflections from Our Rector



## Dear People of God,

A blessed and Happy Father's Day to all fathers and to all men who love in a fatherly way! I share with you a powerful story from Fr. Med Laz. Read and pass it on...

He slid a handwritten note under the windshield wiper of my delivery van while I was still behind the wheel. I almost drove away without reading it.

It was a Tuesday afternoon in late November, one of those flat gray days where the sky looks like wet cement and the cold gets into your collar no matter how many layers you're wearing. I had six more stops on my route. I was already running behind. But something made me reach through the window and unfold the paper.

It said: "The woman at 412 Briar hasn't eaten in two days. She won't call anyone. Please." No name or phone number. Just that. I sat there for a long moment. I looked at my clipboard. I looked at the note again.

I drove to 412 Briar. The house was a small ranch-style home on a quiet street, the kind of neighborhood where every yard used to have a swing set and now most of them just have a For Sale sign or a rusted basketball hoop nobody uses anymore. The gutters were sagging. The welcome mat was faded to the point where you couldn't read what it once said.

I knocked. Nothing. I knocked again, harder this time. A shuffle. Then a pause so long I nearly left. The door opened three inches, held by a chain lock. A woman peered through the gap. She was maybe 80. Her eyes were sharp, but her cheekbones were hollowed out in a way that took me a second to process.

"I didn't order anything," she said.

"I know," I told her. "Someone left me a note." She stared at me. The chain stayed on.

"I'm not here to sell you anything," I said. "I just want to make sure you're okay."

She was quiet for a long time. Then the chain came off.

Inside, the house was tidy in the way that only people with genuine pride keep things tidy when they have almost nothing left to keep. Every surface was clean. A folded quilt was draped over an armchair with a precision that told me she had refolded it more than once that morning, just to have something to do. There was a small side table with a reading lamp, a library book, and a completely empty prescription bottle.

That bottle had been empty for 11 days I found that out later. She lowered herself into the armchair. She moved slowly, the way people move when their body has become something they have to negotiate with.

"I was a home health aide for 26 years," she said, as if she needed me to know who she had been before I saw who she was now. "I spent my whole career making sure other people weren't alone when they were sick." She looked at her hands. "I didn't think it would look like this for me." I asked if I could check her kitchen. She nodded without looking up.

The refrigerator held a jar of pickle juice, a stick of margarine worn down to a thin sliver, and a single egg. The cabinets had a box of saltine crackers, mostly empty, and a can of chicken broth with no pull tab and no can opener in sight. That was it.

I called my dispatcher. I told him I had a family emergency and needed 40 minutes. He wasn't happy. I told him to dock my pay. I went to the grocery store. I didn't buy anything fancy. I bought what my own grandmother would have needed. A rotisserie chicken. A carton of vegetable soup. A small bag of apples. Whole grain bread. A can opener. Instant oatmeal. A half gallon of orange juice. And at the pharmacy, I asked about her prescription by name. The pharmacist said it was a maintenance medication. A 30-day supply was \$62 without insurance. I paid for it.

When I came back, she was still sitting in the same chair, the quilt folded in her lap like she hadn't moved an inch. She looked at the bags in my arms, and her face did something I won't forget. It didn't crumble. It didn't break open. It just went very, very still. Like someone who had been holding their breath for a long time had finally been told it was safe to exhale.

"I don't know who left that note on your van," she said quietly. "But I'm glad somebody still sees people like me."

I stayed until the soup was warm. I wrote my number on the back of a receipt before I left. I told her to use it. Here is what I keep thinking about. She spent 26 years going into the homes of strangers to make sure they were not suffering alone. She gave that work everything she had. And the system that benefited from all those years gave her back an empty prescription bottle and a can of broth she couldn't even open.

We're not short on resources in this country. We're short on attention. Look up from your phone. Look at the house next door. Look at the woman in the parking lot who seems fine, but may not be fine. Someone left a note on a stranger's windshield because they didn't know what else to do. That note changed everything.

You don't have to save the world. You just have to see it.

**Let us pray that sports be an instrument of peace, encounter, and dialogue among cultures and nations, and that they promote values such as respect, solidarity, and personal growth.**



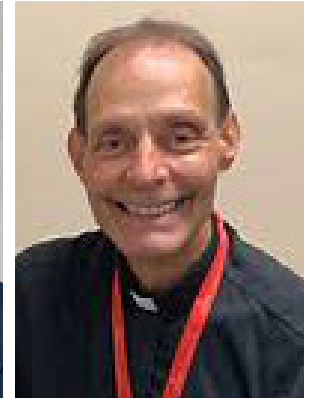

# Help Secure our Cathedral Liturgy Dept. and Ministries

Last week I detailed the Cathedral Cornerstone Campaign's top priority: Reinforcing Our Cathedral. By addressing tuckpointing, lighting, HVAC upgrades, sacristy renovation, and code compliance, the Cathedral will continue as a beacon for the local Church for the next 150 years.



The second focus, Envisioning Our Future, supports our liturgy department and ministries while planning for the next generation through a new endowment. The Cathedral's current \$5.4 million in assets is not enough to fully support this mission. A healthy endowment should be three to four times the operating budget. Generous donations will help us raise an additional \$2.3 million, bringing total invested assets to over \$7.5 million.

A larger endowment will allow the Cathedral to rely on income and preserve principal for the future. The endowment's goal is to sustain and grow valued programs that benefit people near and far.

Every Thursday and Friday, we feed the homeless and underprivileged in our community. Our Blessings in a Backpack ministry provides weekend bags of food for Chicago schoolchildren facing food insecurity. Our evangelization ministries, including OCIA — which brought 44 new Catholics into the Church at the Easter Vigil this

year — and the Young Adult Ministry, foster lifelong faith and community among Chicago's young adult Catholics.

Sustaining and growing these ministries requires stable, lasting support.

Our music ministry exemplifies this need. Music, essential to Catholic worship, thrives with a strong endowment. Under the leadership of David Jonies, Director of Music, and Liz Vasiljevic, Associate Director, our music program includes the Schola Cantorum, Filipino Choir, Women's Schola, Volunteer Choir, Young Adult Choir, organ concerts, and more. These ministries define Holy Name Cathedral but need steady funding. A stronger endowment ensures our ministries continue and expand.

In addition to securing Holy Name's financial future, this campaign helps us plan for the next generation. The Cathedral is landlocked, leaving little to no room to expand. As a busy downtown parish, we often lack space for events. We plan to conduct a feasibility study to explore creating a community center to host more gatherings and accommodate more people than our current cafeteria, which seats about 125.

Envisioning Our Future is key to the Cathedral's next chapter. It will strengthen our ministries, helping more people encounter God's love and create new opportunities for formation, renewal, and belonging.
