# Reflections from Our Rector



## Dear People of God,

I share with you a powerful story. May we always be Christ to others in words and actions. Read and pass it on...

I paid \$6 for a stranger's groceries. The next morning, my manager called me into his office and handed me an envelope.

I'm 40, and I work as a cashier at a small neighborhood grocery. When you stand behind a register long enough, you learn how to read people without trying. You see who is rushing. Who is lonely. Who is smiling while quietly counting every dollar in their head.

It was close to 11:00pm that night. We were minutes from closing when a woman hurried to my lane. A baby slept against her chest, his cheek pressed into her sweater. Her eyes were heavy in a way that sleep alone does not fix.

She unloaded just a few items. Bread. Eggs. Milk. One can of baby formula.

I rang everything up and gave her the total. She opened her wallet and laid out the bills. Then she checked again. One pocket. Then another. Her shoulders dropped.

"I'm short \$6," she said. "Could you cancel the formula?"

I didn't pause to think. I reached into my pocket, pulled out my own money, and slid it onto the counter.

"It's okay," I said. "Please take everything."

Her eyes filled instantly. She thanked me over and over, held her baby, and left. That was it. Or so I thought.

The next morning, I had barely logged in at my register when the loudspeaker crackled.

"Laura, please come to the manager's office. It's urgent."

My stomach dropped. I replayed the night again and again while walking down the hallway. Had I broken a rule? Would I get written up? Fired?

My manager looked up when I entered. "Did you pay for someone's groceries last night?" he asked.

I nodded. "Yes."

He exhaled, opened his desk drawer, and slid an envelope toward me. "This was left for you this morning." I opened it with shaking hands. Inside was a folded note and \$60.

The letter read: "You don't know me, but last night you helped my daughter when she needed it most. She came home crying because someone saw her when she felt invisible. I am the baby's grandmother. Things have been hard since my husband passed, and my daughter is doing her best on her own. Your kindness reminded her that the world still has good people in it. Please accept this, not as repayment, but so you can do the same for someone else."

I couldn't speak. My manager cleared his throat and smiled softly.

"Store policy says we can't stop you from being human," he said. "Just wanted you to know we're glad you work here."

I went back to my register and put the envelope in my locker. I didn't feel proud. I felt steady. Like something had quietly clicked back into place.

Six dollars did not change the world. But it fed a baby. It lifted a tired mother. And it came back carrying proof that kindness does not disappear. It moves.

Thank you to Weird World for the above story.

The following is what happens when we get so busy, and others become invisible. Please keep reading...

"As I turn 89, I'm sitting alone in a retirement home with a plate of ravioli in front of me. I don't know who made them, and I don't know if anyone will remember my birthday.

I have three children; I haven't seen them in a long time. They brought me here, saying it was for my own good, but as the days pass, the phone stays silent. No calls, no visits.

I'm not angry — just sad. Sad, because no matter how much time has passed, I never stopped loving them. Sad because I don't ask for much — just a hug, a kind word, a simple "Happy Birthday, Dad."

I just wish someone would remember me.

At my age, you live on memories and hope. And today, my hope is that this message reaches those who have forgotten the importance of love and family — before it's too late."

May we look for ways this summer to love this world back into life.

# Support Our Campaign Which Helps the Wider Church

The Cathedral Cornerstone Campaign is vital to ensuring that the Cathedral and her ministries continue for the next 150 years. And this campaign is a part of a much larger campaign that the whole Archdiocese has embarked upon. The Generation to Generation: Answer the Call Capital Campaign, through the Archdiocese of Chicago, seeks to raise \$300 million to address crucial needs throughout the Archdiocese. Of our \$12 million goal, \$2.2 million will be given to the Archdiocese as part of our partnership with the Generation to Generation Campaign, which is divided into four major areas.



**Strengthen local parishes:** The Archdiocese continues to restructure parishes to make them vibrant and vital across Cook and Lake Counties. With our \$12 million goal, we will allocate \$2.2 million for the Generation to Generation Campaign. As previously covered in this column, we described how the \$9.8 million will reinforce the Cathedral through tuckpointing, update our HVAC control system, renovate the sacristy, implement safety measures, and strengthen the endowment for ministries. These areas for improvement will allow the Cathedral to be a draw for Catholics in downtown areas and throughout the Archdiocese.

**Spiritually renew our parishes.** As we have all seen, there is a drastic increase in Mass attendance over the last few months. Something is happening! People are returning to God, who is love, mercy, and unchanging. This focus of the campaign will give resources to parishes to help foster a real and authentic encounter with the Risen Lord and deepen one's awareness of the Lord in their life, so they, like Mary

Magdalene on the day of the Resurrection, can also joyfully say, "I have seen the Lord!" (John 20:18).

**Support our priests.** This is a threefold endeavor: to provide resources for seminary education, to support active priests in their ministry with ongoing formation opportunities, and to care for those who have faithfully served the people of God in parishes and are now retired. The Preaching for Encounter Program I was involved in from July 2024 to February 2026 was a program for me sponsored by the Archdiocese of Chicago. There are other programs that have been created and continue to be created to sharpen the skills of our priests as we seek to serve you. In the same way, the priests who have faithfully served and are now retired will need continued health care and ongoing support. This aspect of the campaign is a thank-you to our current priests and a nod of gratitude to our retired priests.

**Assist vulnerable and under-resourced communities.** This area of the Archdiocese campaign focuses on ensuring faith is passed on in under-served neighborhoods. By creating the Parish Vitality Fund and offering school scholarships to children from low-income families, the faith will be rooted at the local level, shaping generations to come.

The Cathedral Cornerstone Campaign and the Generation to Generation Campaign seek to strengthen the church, both physically and spiritually. I have donated to this campaign because I believe in the projects Holy Name Cathedral is envisioning and those that the Archdiocese is committing to. As we move into these summer months and prepare for Commitment Weekend in August, prayerfully consider your gift over a 5-year pledge. Like our worship, this campaign is not a spectator sport. We are now called to strengthen our local church through this campaign, so we can continue to give glory to His Holy Name in this local church and throughout the Archdiocese of Chicago.

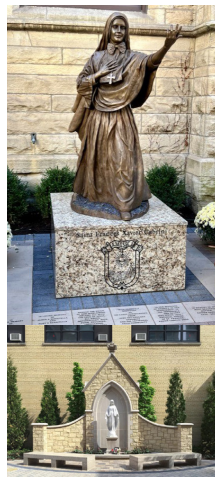
## Honor A Loved One with a Mother Cabrini or a Courtyard Paver
