Reflections from Our Rector



Dear People of God,

I have always liked the definition of the word “integrity.” Integrity means your words and actions fit. Please read this great story and pass it on...

A 19-year-old man earning the minimum wage in September 2013 taught a billionaire what integrity looks like.

Joey Prusak was working the counter at a Dairy Queen in Hopkins, Minnesota, when he noticed something that made his stomach turn.

A blind customer had just finished ordering. As the man turned to walk away, a \$20 bill slipped from his pocket and floated to the floor. He had no idea.

Joey expected what would happen next. The woman standing behind the blind man would tap his shoulder and hand him his money back. That’s not what happened. Instead, she looked directly at the blind man struggling to put his wallet away. She watched him walk past her. Then she bent down, picked up the \$20, and slipped it into her purse.

Joey couldn’t believe what he just witnessed. When the woman stepped up to the counter to order, Joey did something that could have gotten him fired. He looked her in the eye and asked her to return the money to the man she had stolen from.

She refused. She claimed the \$20 was hers. She said she had dropped it herself. Joe asked again, and she refused again.

So the 19-year-old manager made a decision. He told her plainly: “I’m not going to serve someone as disrespectful as you. Please return the money or leave this store.” The woman exploded. She started yelling. She cursed at him. But Joey stayed calm. She stormed out without her ice cream.

But Joey wasn’t finished. He walked over to the blind man, who was sitting peacefully eating his sundae, completely unaware of what had just happened. Joey reached into his wallet, pulled out a \$20 bill, and handed it to the customer.

Joey made about \$10 an hour. That \$20 represented two hours of his work. He didn’t tell anyone about it. He didn’t post about it. He just went back to serving the customers.

But someone else in line had watched the entire thing unfold. That customer went home and wrote an email to Dairy Queen. The email said: “I was in shock by the generosity that your employee had, taking his own money out of his own wallet to give to the customer because some other lady decided to steal something that wasn’t hers. Joey has forever sealed my fate as a lifelong customer.”

The store owner printed the email and pinned it to the

employee bulletin board. A coworker snapped a photo and posted it on Facebook. Within days, Joey’s story had traveled around the world.

Then something unbelievable happened. Joey’s phone rang. On the other end was Warren Buffett, one of the richest men in the world. Buffett’s company, Berkshire Hathaway, owns Dairy Queen. The billionaire didn’t call to offer business advice. He called to say two words: Thank you. “He thanked me for being a role model for all the other employees and people in general,” Joey later said.

But the rewards kept coming. Strangers started showing up at the store. A woman ran up to Joey with an envelope full of cash for his college fund. A man drove all the way from another town just to hand Joey \$100, saying he deserved five times what he had given away.

Radio shows invited him on as a guest. Companies offered him jobs. The Minnesota Wild hockey team called and gave him a private suite for 20 of his closest friends.

All because a teenager refused to stay silent when he saw something wrong. When reporters asked Joey why he did it, his answer was simple: “I was just doing what I thought was right. I did it without even really thinking about it.” He paused, then added something that stuck with people: “Ninety-nine out of 100 people would’ve done the same thing as me.”

Maybe he’s right. Maybe most of us would do the same thing. But Joey Prusak is the one who actually did it. He didn’t have power. He didn’t have wealth. He didn’t have influence. He was just a teenager behind a counter, making \$10 an hour, with nothing but his integrity and a \$20 bill. And that was enough to remind millions of people what doing the right thing looks like.

Today, Joey Prusak is a Senior Contract Services Analyst with Hennepin County Facility Services in Minneapolis, Minnesota, bringing a strong background in customer service, leadership, and government procurement.

Most of all, he brings integrity — something our world desperately needs today. To always tell the truth. To always do the right thing.

All I can add is “Amen!”

While Colorado is where I live, Chicago is where my story began. I grew up in the suburbs, spent most of my career here, and since 2013, Holy Name has been my spiritual home whenever I'm in the city.

And what a home it is. For more than 175 years, this Cathedral has stood as a witness to Chicago's faith, resilience, and history. I love this city, treasure this parish, and want to see Holy Name thrive — not just for us, but for the next 175 years.

Set the World on Fire! Remember St. Ignatius This Week

In May, I wrote about the reality that sometimes your patron saint picks you, as the Church celebrated one of my patrons, St. Rita of Cascia, on May 22. There are other saints in my life whom I also feel connected to, as their presence grew in my life. Throughout our lives, we come into contact with various saints for various reasons. And these patrons help us on our own journey of holiness. This Friday, July 31, we celebrate the Feast of St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of and the patron saint of the Society of Jesus (Jesuits).

Though I am a diocesan priest, I owe a great deal to my formation by the Jesuits, as I attended Loyola University Chicago for my undergraduate degrees in philosophy and religious studies. It was there that I learned about and was immersed in Ignatian spirituality. This form of spirituality is grounded in the desire to find God in all things. And that is not always easy – to see God in both the good and the bad. Another aspect of this spirituality is, when reading Scripture, to put yourself in the scene and find a connection to a person, event, or word. *Lectio divina*, or sacred reading of Scripture, offers a good way to do this. At the core of the Jesuit Order and Ignatian spirituality is the motto that is found in their educational institutions around the world: All for the greater glory of God.

So, who is Ignatius? He was born into a noble family in Loyola, Spain, in the late 15th century. As he sought fame and glory, becoming a knight and fighting in battle, a



cannonball exploded near him and gravely injured him. Tradition tells us that as he was recovering, he read the lives of the saints and realized he wanted to be a saint too. From this desire to be a saint, Ignatius would go on to Jerusalem to serve God but was sent back to France, where in 1540 with six companions, he founded the Society of Jesus.

Ignatius is also known for his literary masterpiece, “The Spiritual Exercises,” which he wrote over 2 years as he discerned the will of God in his life, following his desire to follow Jesus while recovering from his battle wounds. Today, the exercises can be used as a 30-day silent retreat that is continued to be practiced to this day.

The Jesuits are known around the world for their deep and continuous contribution to education as well as their missionary efforts. The first North American Martyrs were martyred by Native American tribes in present-day northern New York state between 1642-1649. Here in Chicago, the Jesuit footprint is seen in Loyola University, St. Ignatius College Prep, and at Cristo Rey High School in Pilsen, all administered by the Jesuits. Damen Ave bears the name of Fr. Arnold Damen, who founded Ignatius Prep, Holy Family Church on Roosevelt (that survived the Chicago Fire due to Fr. Damen’s prayers) and Loyola University.

As we prepare to celebrate this great saint, we are also reminded of a phrase attributed to Ignatius and found on Jesuit university campuses: “Go, set the world on fire.” By finding God in all things and giving glory to God for all things, aware that patron saints choose us to pray for us and help us on our path to holiness, when we live out our faith in the various ways God invites us to do, we will truly set the world on fire.

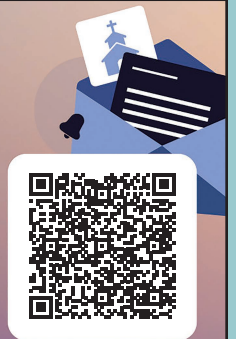
