Reflections from Our Rector



Dear People of God,

I have found the following story to be fascinating. This daily school exercise revolves around empathy and compassion. The word compassion comes from the root meaning “to suffer with.” Please read and pass it on...

Empathy is a Skill

Since 1993, every child in Denmark between the ages of 6 and 16 has had one hour set aside each week that has nothing to do with math, science, or grades.

No tests. No right answers. No competition.

Just children — sitting together with their teacher — learning something most schools still consider optional: how to understand each other. It's called *Klassens tid* — the Class's Hour. Is a student struggling at home? The class listens. A conflict broke out on the playground? The whole room works through it together. No one is singled out. No one is shamed. The goal isn't to solve a problem — it's to teach every child that other people's feelings are worth their time and attention.

This isn't an experiment. It has been running for over thirty years. And the results are hard to ignore.

Denmark consistently records some of the lowest bullying rates in Europe. Its children rank among the happiest in the world. Neuroscientists studying the program have found that repeated empathy practice actually reshapes the developing brain — strengthening the regions responsible for emotional regulation and understanding others.

But here's the thing that stopped me: It wasn't introduced because Denmark had a crisis. It was introduced because someone decided, quietly and deliberately, that kindness was worth teaching on purpose.

Not as a reward. Not as a reaction to tragedy. But as a scheduled, weekly, non-negotiable part of growing up. Educators there have long understood something the rest of the world is still debating: empathy is not a personality trait you're born with or without. It is a skill. And like every skill, it improves with practice.

A child who spends ten years practicing how to listen, how to sit with discomfort, and how to help find solutions — doesn't just become a better student. They become a better neighbor, colleague, parent, and citizen.

Denmark didn't build one of the world's happiest societies by accident. They built it, one hour at a time, in classrooms full of children learning that the person next to them matters.

Maybe the most important lesson we can teach a child isn't found in any textbook. #kindnessmatters#inspiration

At the same time, may this story also touch your heart...

A Lost Phone

I left my phone on the bench at a bus stop. By the time I realized it, I was already at work. I used my coworker's phone to call my number, fully expecting it to go straight to voicemail.

A gruff voice answered. I explained it was my phone. The guy said, “Meet me at the 4th Street Park at noon.” I was terrified. I thought I was getting robbed or extorted.

I showed up with my heart pounding. A homeless man was sitting on a park bench, my phone resting carefully on a paper napkin next to him so the screen wouldn't get scratched on the wood.

“Here you go,” he said, handing it over. I was so incredibly relieved I pulled out a \$20 bill to give him. He pushed my hand away. “I don't want your money,” he said, staring at his boots.

“My daughter won't talk to me anymore; I just wanted to hold a phone that actually rings for once.” It broke my heart. I sat down on the bench with him.

I told him to dial her number on my phone so it would show up as an unknown caller. She answered. They talked for the first time in three years.

We judge people by where they sleep, but we all wake up with the same need — to be loved

A Brighter Cathedral – Without Missing a Mass!

One of the largest improvement projects currently underway at the Cathedral is something many parishioners may not even notice — and that's exactly as planned.

Our \$1.8 million LED lighting replacement project is progressing steadily while allowing the Cathedral to remain fully open for worship. Rather than erecting scaffolding throughout the church, the work has been carefully phased. Crews are completing much of the installation from the upper ceilings, attic spaces, and other areas that allow them to work quietly and safely, often without anyone realizing this major transformation is taking place.

When completed, the new LED lighting system will provide beautiful, more consistent illumination while producing far less heat than our existing fixtures. This will make the Cathedral more comfortable during liturgies, especially during the warmer months, and will help protect our treasured Flentrop organ by reducing the heat generated around the instrument.

Significant progress has already been made:

- ✦ The high-ceiling fixtures in the nave have been completed
- ✦ The ambulatory downlights are complete, with only one surface-mounted fixture remaining
- ✦ Installation of the transept fixtures is currently underway and is expected to be completed next week
- ✦ Work in the upper attic is scheduled to be completed in early August
- ✦ Crews will then move on to the remaining uplights and Stations of the Cross spotlights
- ✦ 84 fixtures are already installed, operational, and connected to the new lighting system
- ✦ Work also continues on the lighting for the Cathedral's beautiful Rose Windows.

We are deeply grateful to Cardinal Blase Cupich for his generous commitment to the Mother Church of the Archdiocese of Chicago through this significant investment. We also thank our parishioners for their patience as the work continues. Thanks to careful planning and the dedication of the installation team, the Cathedral has remained a welcoming place of prayer and worship throughout this major undertaking. Before long, everyone will experience the benefits of a lighting system that enhances the beauty of our sacred space, improves the comfort of those who worship here, and helps preserve this historic Cathedral and its treasured Flentrop organ for generations to come.

Reflecting on the Diaconate, Are You Called to Serve?

Our lives circle significant dates. I have written many articles on saint feast days and important dates and seasons in our liturgical life, such as Pentecost, Lent, and Advent. And on a personal level, we all have dates we celebrate each year, and should celebrate. Pope Francis encouraged us to find our baptism date and celebrate it as a mini-anniversary.

Fr. Greg still has yet to buy me a cake, but maybe this January I can blow out the candles. Other dates are our First Communion, Confirmation, and a wedding.

For religious and clergy, we celebrate our ordination anniversaries or final vows anniversaries each year. I celebrate my priesthood ordination anniversary on May 15, and my diaconate ordination anniversary on Aug. 12. I was ordained a deacon in 2020 and was only allowed 5 tickets for my guests due to COVID restrictions. Every priest is ordained a deacon first and is called to continue the mission of service and proclaiming the Word of God even in their priesthood.

Ordination week in 2020 was exciting and moving. Each year on Aug. 10, the Church remembers St. Lawrence, who was a deacon in the early Church of Rome and was martyred during the emperors' persecution of Christians. Lawrence was one of seven deacons who worked under Pope Sixtus II and was Archdeacon of Rome, overseeing the treasures and riches of the Church and caring for the poor. After Pope Sixtus was martyred, the Roman prefect told Lawrence to hand over the riches and treasures of the Church, to which Lawrence appropriately brought to the Prefect the poor, sick, and outcast, saying, "Here are the treasures of the Church."



Lawrence was then martyred two days later.

As we celebrate St. Lawrence and I celebrate the sixth anniversary of my diaconate ordination, it is an opportune time to reflect on the diaconate ministry. Here at the Cathedral, we are blessed with wonderful deacons who have ministered to the faithful and continue to do so. A deacon fundamentally is a herald of the Gospel and puts the Gospel message into action through service at the liturgy, proclaiming the Word of God, and outreach to the poor.

Though there is one diaconate, a deacon is either called a transitional deacon (one moving towards the priesthood) or a permanent deacon (a single or married man who is ordained a deacon and also has a job to support himself and his family). Both transitional and permanent deacons function the same way; a deacon can baptize children, witness marriages, and bury the dead. A deacon can preach a homily at Mass and assist at the altar. A deacon focuses an aspect of his ministry on outreach and service, either as a sacramental preparation leader, minister of care, or visiting the imprisoned.

The Archdiocese of Chicago has the largest permanent diaconate body in the world. The diaconate was reestablished in the life of the Church following the Second Vatican Council. But like any vocation, to be a deacon, one must hear and respond to the call of Jesus Christ to serve and not be served.

If you have considered becoming a deacon or know a man who has the qualities of a deacon, the Archdiocese Diaconate Office is hosting an inquiry session over the next few months. Deacon Dan Welter and Deacon Dennis Robak, assigned here at Holy Name Cathedral, are wonderful points of contact for you, or someone you know, to learn more about the diaconate ministry. As we once again recall St. Lawrence, let us praise God for the gift of the diaconate, which continues to be a herald of the Gospel in our daily life.

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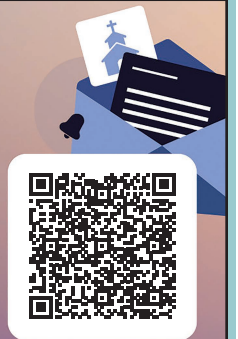

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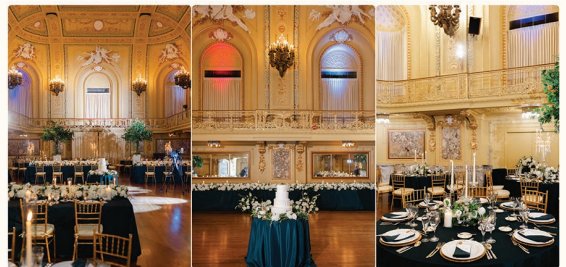
