Reflections from Our Rector



Dear People of God,

There are times in our lives when we feel confused, afraid, lost, and out of control. The marriage is not what it used to be five years ago — the job is unfulfilling, but what are my options? The “nest” is now empty, and I am feeling alone and lost — the

routineness of life leaves me bored and directionless. The list is endless, and age is not necessarily a factor. Despite the pains, struggles, and questions life throws our way, the Lord Jesus says, “I am the Path.” When you feel lost, the Lord says, “I am your Path.” Feeling alone, the Lord says, “I am your Path.” Feeling empty, the Lord says, “I am your Path.” Feeling bitter and resentful, the Lord says, “I am your Path.”

We spend so much of our time on “mastery” that we sometimes lose a sense of the “mystery” of being rooted in God through faith. God works in marvelous ways and weaves his presence in our lives. I share the following story:

One day, a poor boy who was selling goods from door to door to pay his way through school found he had only one dime left, and he was hungry. He decided he would ask for a meal at the next house. However, he lost his nerve when a lovely young woman opened the door.

Instead of a meal, he asked for a drink of water. She thought he looked hungry, so she brought him a large glass of milk. He drank it slowly, and then asked, “How much do I owe you?”

“You don’t owe me anything.” She replied. “Mother has taught us never to accept pay for a kindness.”

He said, “Then I thank you from my heart!”

As Howard Kelly left that house, he felt not only physically stronger, but also stronger in his faith in God and people. He had been ready to give up.

Many years later, that same young woman became critically ill. The local doctors were baffled. They finally sent her to a big city, where they called in specialists to study her rare disease. Dr. Howard Kelly was called in to consult. When he heard the name of the town she came from, a strange light filled his eyes. He immediately rose and went down the hospital hall to her room. Dressed in

his doctor’s gown, he went in to see her. He recognized her at once. He went back to the consultation room, determined to do his best to save her life. From that day on, he gave her case special attention. After a long struggle, the battle was won.

Dr. Kelly requested the business office to pass the final bill to him for approval. He looked at it, wrote something on it, and sent the bill to her room. She feared to open it, for she was sure it would take the rest of her life to pay for it all. Finally, she looked, and something caught her attention on the side of the bill. She read these words... “Paid in full with one glass of milk.” (signed) Dr. Howard Kelly

Paul Tillich, a well-known theologian, writes the following in his book, *Shaking the Foundations*: Grace strikes us when we are in great pain and restlessness. It strikes us when we walk through the dark valley of a meaningless and empty life. It strikes us when we feel that our separation is deeper than usual, because we have violated another life, a life which we loved, or from which we were estranged. It strikes us when our disgust for our own being, our indifference, our weakness, our hostility, and our lack of direction and composure have become intolerable to us. It strikes us when the longed-for perfection of life does not appear, when old compulsions reign within us as they have for decades, when despair destroys all joy and courage.”

Sometimes at that moment a wave of light breaks into our darkness, as though a voice were saying: “You are accepted by that which is greater than you, and the name of which you do not know. Do not ask for the name now; perhaps you will find it later. Do not try to do anything now; perhaps later you will do much. Do not seek anything; do not perform anything; do not intend anything. Simply accept the fact that you are accepted!” If that happens to us, we experience grace. After such an experience, we may not be better, and we may not believe more than before. But everything is transformed. In that moment, grace conquers sin, and reconciliation bridges the gulf of estrangement. And nothing is demanded of this experience, no religious or moral or intellectual presupposition, nothing but acceptance.

May our lives always see the face of Christ in others — and let life surprise us — and be open to accept it.

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Dear Parishioners and Catholic School Families,

As our children head back to the classrooms, I am writing to you about a significant opportunity to find additional funds to both public and nonpublic schools in our state. Congress passed a new federal tax credit program for 2027 that could generate hundreds of millions of additional dollars for both public and nonpublic school students in Illinois. For Illinois to participate in the program, Governor Pritzker must opt in.

As an advocate not only for Catholic education, but also for the education of all Illinois children, I ask that you contact the Governor to ask him say “yes” to this program. It will give Illinois taxpayers the choice to contribute to programs that will help all children in our state *and* receive a federal tax credit for their donation. These funds are truly needed. They could help Catholic school families cover tuition, after-school programming, supplies, technology or other much needed items. Donations could also be directed to support programming and other needs for public school students and their families. It could benefit just about every child and every school in our state.

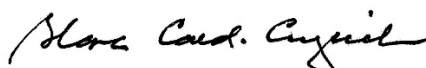
If Governor Pritzker does not opt in, you can still donate to programs such as this, but to receive the tax credit, you will need to donate to a school program in another state. Recent polling suggests that in one year, as much as \$2 billion could be generated to boost education programming in our state. According to that same poll, if Illinois does not opt in, Illinois taxpayers may send as much as \$1 billion for educational services in other states.

The program allows taxpayers a 100% federal tax credit for contributions up to \$1,700. Any family earning up to 300% of the regional median income may qualify for scholarship assistance. This means more than 90% of all K-12 students would be eligible for support in Illinois.

According to our polling data, Illinois taxpayers will contribute to the program regardless of whether Illinois opts in or not. Shouldn't Illinois dollars benefit Illinois school children?

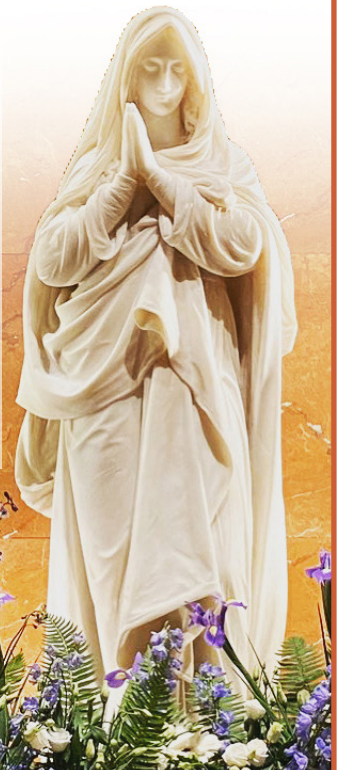

Honor St. Thomas of Villanova: Work for Unity of Mind & Heart

Since the election of Pope Leo, there has been an increase in wonder and research into the Augustinian Order. The Order, formally created by Pope Innocent III in 1244, is a mendicant order of the Church that follows the Rule of St. Augustine of Hippo. A mendicant order is a religious community where the members promise poverty, chastity and obedience and live in urban areas to focus on evangelization, preaching and outreach to the poor. The Augustinian Order focuses on community, of living and sharing things in common, and working to help others discover God in their lives. Their motto is “One mind and one heart intent upon God.” Currently, the Augustinians are present in over 50 countries around the world.

So, why does this matter? On Tuesday, Sept. 22, the Church remembers Augustinian St. Thomas of Villanova, the Archbishop of Valencia from 1545 to 1555, who joined the order in 1516. Despite his desire not to be bishop, in true obedience to his superior, he accepted the appointment. And though he was the archbishop, he continued his mission first and foremost as an



Augustinian. He traveled near and far to visit the faithful in the archdiocese in order to build community. He established schools and a seminary, helped orphans, preached God’s word, celebrated the Sacraments and is regarded as the father of the poor.

There are very few churches named after this Augustinian saint, and one of them is here in the Archdiocese of Chicago, in Palatine, and is the parish I call home — the parish where I was baptized, received my other Sacraments, and celebrated my first Mass as a priest in 2021. It is truly a mystery as to how this parish in the northwest suburbs of Chicago was given the patron of St. Thomas, when the Augustinians have never ministered in the parish. The only other parish in the United States with this patron is the parish on the campus of Villanova University, in Philadelphia, where Pope Leo attended for undergrad.

As we celebrate this saint on Tuesday, let us renew our efforts, as the Augustinian Order proclaims, to work for unity in mind and heart and focus on God as we build community with those around us. As I have written about various patron saints, the parish a saint is named after is an easy connection with the saint and gives us another patron to call upon when in need or need another saintly helper from above.
