Reflections from Our Rector



Dear People of God,

Fall has arrived so very quickly. Soon we will see a burst of color as trees prepare to rest for the long winter season. Change is in the air – and change always brings challenge. How do we deal with the challenges in our lives? Read and reflect on the

challenges found in the following stories.

Columnist Herb Caen, in the San Francisco Chronicle, describes an executive presiding over a lunch meeting in a busy San Francisco restaurant.

The executive had no luck getting the attention of any waiter. He finally became so frustrated at the lack of service that he took out his cell phone from his pocket and, from his table, called the restaurant. He asked for a server to come and take their order. It worked. In the “busy restaurants” of our own lives – sometimes we need to step back and “call home” – so to speak!

We hear from Habakkuk: “How long, O Lord? I cry for help – but you do not listen!”

Sometimes we feel we’re at the top of the mountain of life. Our lives seem clearly focused – everything seems to be falling into place. Our faith is strong – life is great! We have all the answers. However, another, all too painful part of life remains. We realize some body parts are wearing out; a loved one dies; our job is gone; we’re much too busy; we are bored beyond words; or we’re alone. Maybe our faith is fuzzy, and we’re full of questions and doubts.

An Arabic folktale tells of a traveler making his way to the city. One night he meets two other travelers along the road: Fear and Plague.

Plague explains to the traveler that once they arrive, they are expected to kill 10,000 people in the city.

The traveler asks Plague if Plague would do all the killing. “Oh, no. I shall kill only a few hundred. My friend Fear will kill the others.”

Fear – whether real or imagined – can discourage us, overwhelm us, strangle us. But Jesus assures us that if we possess just a “mustard seeds” amount of faith, we can face the fear of failure, the fear of need, the fear of death that undermines our attempts to live lives worthy of the disciple’s call. If we really possess the faith we claim, we can “uproot” those things that strangle love, justice and reconciliation.

We can reap great measures of joy and goodness from the smallest acts of kindness and love. The mustard seed of the Gospel challenges us to seize the opportunities we have to plant and reap a harvest of justice, compassion, and reconciliation.

Les Brown once said: “Too many of us are not living our dreams because we are living our fears.”

I recite the following prayer about ten times a day –

“Lord Jesus, may I trust in you completely.

Then I know you are with me.

Then I shall not fear. And you, Lord Jesus, will do the rest.”

In faith, as doubtful and imperfect as we can sometimes be – no matter where we are in life – a heart full of love – always has something to share...And may the White Sox and Cubs go deep into the playoffs!

In Memoriam: Fr. Bill Moriarity

Holy Name Cathedral mourns the death of Fr. Bill Moriarity, who died on Sept. 19, at the age of 86. Born June 5, 1940, Fr. Bill was ordained to the priesthood on April 26, 1966, at the University of St. Mary of the Lake/Mundelein Seminary.

After serving in numerous parishes in the Archdiocese, Fr. Bill became Pastor of St. John the Evangelist in Streamwood. He is known for the 30 years he resided at Holy Name Cathedral, serving the parish and as a chaplain at Northwestern Memorial Hospital. In addition to his many contributions to the Cathedral, Fr. Bill became the spiritual advisor to the Ministry of Care.

Those who knew Fr. Bill will remember his kindness, compassion and willingness to give his time to others — often appearing at precisely the moment someone needed him. His stories, his gentle presence and his spiritual leadership will live on in the many people whose lives he touched.

We give thanks to God for the gift of Fr. Bill's priestly ministry and pray that he may now know the fullness of God's love and eternal peace. Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him. Amen.

May God bless you abundantly and reward your generosity for generations to come. My prayers are with you and your loved ones.

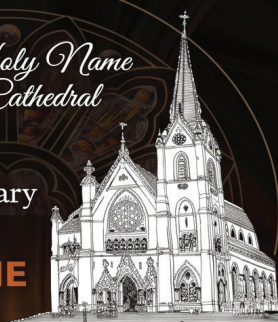

Pray for Migrants and Refugees at Migrant Mass on Sunday

In September 1914, newly elected Pope Benedict XV called for the 1st World Day of Prayer for Migrants and Refugees. However, little is known or documented about why; one can look at world events and see the need for such an occasion in the Holy Father's pastoral heart. World War I started in July of that year, and people were fleeing war-torn countries across Europe. Since the first commemoration of this day, the World Day of Prayer for Migrants and Refugees has been celebrated annually on the last Sunday of September.



This year, Pope Leo has chosen the theme “Even just one of these children.” Over the last few years, the Universal Church has embarked on the process of Synodality, where we as members of the Church listen to each other and move forward with hope, together. In a previous message for this day, Pope Francis wrote, “Emphasizing the synodal dimension allows the Church to rediscover its itinerant nature, as the People of God journeying through history on pilgrimage, “migrating,” we could say, toward the kingdom of heaven.” This connection between listening and journeying together is a beautiful reminder that we, as humans, are on the same journey.

With the theme “Even just one of these children,” we are reminded that throughout history, people have moved for various reasons, and we must also consider the difficulties children face as migrants. Pope Leo reminds us in this year's message, “Every child, every human being, possesses an infinite dignity. Each is created in the image and likeness of God (cf. Gen 1:26); each is a presence of the Lord. Before every migrant child, we are called to make an act of humanity and faith, for we can welcome and encounter the Lord.” Sadly, in our world today, we often focus on ourselves, so the Lord's words fall on the deaf ears of those with the power to act and change the current situation. The children deserve respect and dignity.

We as Christians must never forget that we are migrants

as well. We are on a journey toward our heavenly homeland and must listen to, and help, others on theirs as well. We must also remember that Jesus himself was a migrant. The Holy Family fled persecution under Herod, who sought to kill the newborn Christ child because of the prophecy of the Magi. They found refuge in Egypt and stayed there until Herod died, to fulfill the prophecy, “out of Egypt I have called my son” (Matthew 2:15).

This weekend at the Cathedral, on Sunday, Sept. 27, at the 5:15pm Mass, we will celebrate World Day of Prayer for Migrants and Refugees and close our celebration of National Migration Week. Looking around the world, there are many reasons why there are migrants and refugees that we are invited to pray for this weekend. We pray for their safety, dignity, and lives. We pray for peace in our world, for just working conditions, safer living conditions, and better respect for life. May this World Day of Prayer for Migrants and Refugees inspire in us a desire to answer God's call to walk with others, as he always walks with us on our journey back to heaven.

Say this Prayer for 3 consecutive days.

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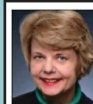

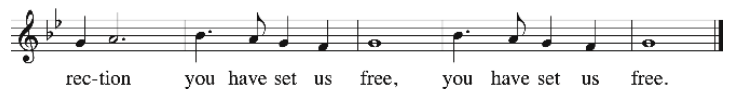
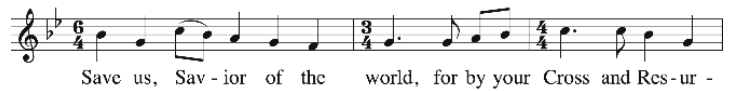
